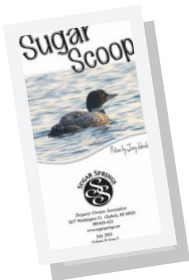

General Manager's Report March 2015

We have had a short period of better weather, which gets all of us excited for spring. The night temperatures are still way too cold to allow us to open up beach clubs and golf course bathrooms. With the bitter temperatures this winter we hope we don't find too many frozen pipes to deal with when we do.

The camper-storage area will be a muddy mess this spring when the frost comes out of the ground and we start getting our spring rains. Please don't go into the area unless you have to. We need the ground to dry and firm up.

The gates at the beach clubs are now all closed to slow down the flow of traffic into them as well. The heavy ruts are always an issue and the B&G staff must fix them every spring and fall. The Chalet area will continue to be closed during the week until April 6th. Building and Grounds has a maintenance project inside the building that requires that we make sure no one is in the building. If the project is completed earlier, we will open the gate. It will be open from Friday – Sunday during that time.

As many of you return to Sugar Springs for the season you may decide that you need to remove a tree, want to add on to your home, add a deck, build or repair your lakefront dock, or mow a commons area that is next to your property. All these items need prior approval of the A&E Committee in accordance with our governing documents. Applications are available at the POA office, and online on our webpage. The committee meets each Monday beginning at 9:30 A.M... They are there to assist you and answer any questions you may have. Membership adherence to the SSPOA rules and regulations, while seeming restrictive to some, are the backbone of maintaining the beautiful property of Sugar Springs for this and future generations.

Mark Bayer and Lynn Woodruff are back for another golf season at the Sugar Springs Golf Club, although Mark does not officially begin his duties this year until April 1st. The muskrats undermined the damn to the small pond on hole #15 which then washed away the culvert between the two ponds; this has caused the large pond to empty. We are looking at couple of fixes to the problem, but it will need to be addressed as quickly as we can. The settling pond on #3 by Sugar River Road has been finished. There is still some cleanup to be done when the golf course staff returns, it looks, and should function much better this year.

Anthony Raineri, Tina Barnard are back at the restaurant, as are many of our servers, and cooks from last year. They have had a successful winter and have been working to make your experience at the Hearth even better this year. The B&G staffs, Ken Klein and Scott Schaefer have been busy all winter maintaining our facilities, which is always quite a job. Thankfully, they did not have to spend as much time this winter plowing snow, allowing for other maintenance to be done. The pool water is still warm and the fitness center has been heavily used this winter as well. Tracy, Evelyn, and Kris will usually be the one greeting you when you enter the Activity Center this season, just as last year.

The POA office is now back on summer hours during the week; being open Monday – Friday from 9:00 to 5:00. Member services Melissa Zelt is ready to assist with any member questions. She is available at the front desk or on the phone at (989) 426-4111. If you need help or have a question, give her a call. Matt Schindler, Accounts Payable & Comptroller, and Debbie Mahaffy, Accounts Receivable and Activity Center Supervisor are also available to assist you.

REASONS FOR WANTING TO SERVE THE MEMBERSHIP AS A DIRECTOR ON THE SSPOA BOARD:

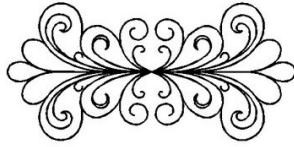

The Recreation Committee again thanks all who organized, brought food for the masses and pitched in to set up and clean-up. It's always fun to see old friends and meet new ones.



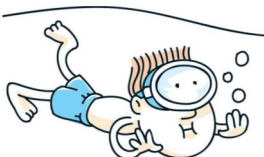
Winter Pool Fest
