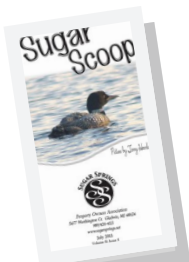

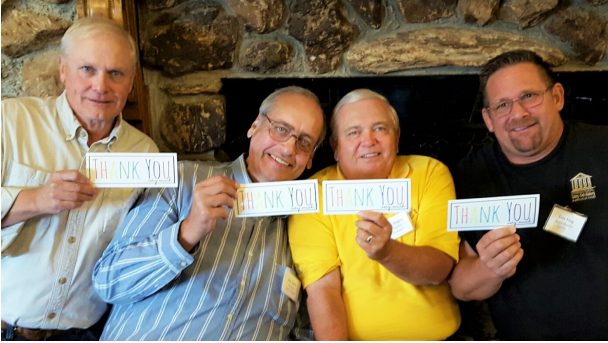

President Issitt shared the following: Regarding the use of commons areas by members in the Fairfield Realm and the Board seeking resolutions continues. Sled hill at Chalet requiring volunteers to work on August 20 to assist with clearing brush in preparation for a safer area. The Chalet will resume the same winter hours as in winter of 2015 and will be made available on a reserve basis. The Hearth restaurant manager and golf pro will coordinate operations to achieve better service to members. Deer Management will again be addressed. Board requests a detailed plan from supporters which should include positions from the DNR, Butman Township, and all costs involved with a presentation to be made at March 19, 2016 meeting. Any deer reduction plan cannot be exclusive to a specific realm. Opposition will also have an opportunity to present. Once a realistic plan is developed and reviewed by the Board, a survey will once again be sent to membership to determine interest in pursuing action

Pilot's Corner

“Sorry, I Wasn't Paying Attention”

We've all done it. We've all been distracted or so absorbed in what we're doing that we become oblivious to other things going on around us. Just the other day, I was so involved in sweeping off my front porch that I didn't notice my mailman saying “hello” and walking up to personally hand me my mail. While that situation may not be a big deal, there are many situations that require us to pay close attention to things around us.

Take driving a car for instance. In addition to knowing how to operate the vehicle, a driver must be alert to the things going on around them so they can appropriately respond. They must watch for pedestrians before backing out of a driveway or parking space. They must be alert to speed limits, traffic signs/signals and other vehicle traffic. Not paying attention to those things while driving is dangerously unsafe.

Flying, like driving a car, requires pilots to divide their attention between things inside and outside their cockpit. Whether taxiing, taking off, in cruise flight or landing, pilots must be aware of what's going on around them at all times. A pilot on the ground preparing to take-off must be aware of traffic on the ground and in the air around the airport. Equally so, pilots preparing to land must

be aware of other landing traffic and traffic on the ground at the airport.

In flight training, pilots are taught to scan for traffic and to maneuver to safely blend with other traffic. There are protocols and procedures that pilots must follow that ensure the **safe** and **courteous** sharing of the airways and airport environment. Clearing the runway for landing aircraft, making standard traffic pattern entries, and making radios calls to alert other traffic are just a few of the protocols.

Next time you're around the Airpark or another airport, watch how the traffic flows and how pilots use the protocols and procedures to help make flying safe and enjoyable for all.
