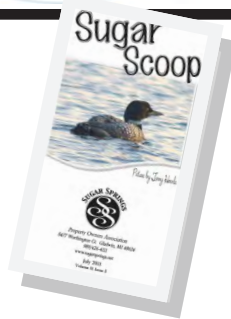

General Manager's Report

June 2016

Sugar Springs was busy over the Memorial Day weekend. People were enjoying golf, the lakes, the Hearth, their homes and campsites, and for the most part people were respectful of others and looked to be having a good time. However, I do want to touch on a couple of things that I saw that need more attention.

Recently there has been a couple of issues with dogs not being on a leash. One caused a member to break her wrist and the second caused injuries to their dog. You can make all the excuses in the world to justify that you should be able to let your dog run free but both the State of Michigan and Sugar Springs rules and regulations say that **ALL** dogs must be on a leash. It is your responsibility as a homeowner to make sure that your dog, your family members or friends who may be visiting, understand the law and abide by it. If you rent your home to outsiders, it is still your responsibility to make sure that your renters understand that their dog cannot run free anywhere in Sugar Springs. The member who had her wrist broken now has to spend her summer not being able to enjoy Sugar Springs activities she normally enjoys. I read recently on a social network site in Sugar Springs a comment from a woman who said that we don't need rules, we are all adults. If that were true then we would stop having problems with loose dog attacks.

In touring the Association property after the Memorial Day weekend I notice that a large number of members who camp on their lots have yet to either get or put on their camping permits for 2016. Camping has been open since April 15th, many campers were placed that first week and yet they have not been registered for the year. In some cases, a second violation letter will be sent to those members.

If you have a camping lot with a trailer on it, your lot must be maintained just as if it had a home on it. If the lot is vacant, the lot is allowed to be in its natural state. Homeowners must also mow and maintain their lots. After our long holiday weekend there are a large number of members, or renters, who have not mowed, or have vines growing out of their deck boards. Violation notices will go out this week to those who need a reminder. We need everyone's help keeping Sugar Springs beautiful for everyone.

Total Number of Votes Cast: 957; Necessary for adoption 2/3: 638; Votes for Motion: 578, Votes against Motion: 379. Total voided proxies 25 representing 33 votes. General Assessment Vote has failed.

Mike Visnaw, Chairing the Ad-Hoc Committee to deal with Deer Management indicated that there are currently nine members who have volunteered to work on issue. They are anticipating information from the DNR offices in Roscommon and Grayling. Residents are again requested to stop feeding deer as this encourages the animals to frequently return to residential areas.

President Issitt announced that the recent assessment vote request did not pass. The Board will address the issue with another vote request mid-summer.

Director Baker shared that the tax foreclosure lot sale is not being taken advantage of. The list of properties available can be obtained through the Gladwin County Clerk's office. Lot consolidations of contiguous lots may be allowed in some instances.

ARCHITECTURAL & ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL COMMITTEE (Dale Dunham)

Meeting minutes of March and April 2016 were read by Lynn Wright. March actions included 2 lot modifications, 1 color change, 1 deck, 13 signs and 2 misc./other for a total of 19. April actions included 11 lot modifications, 4 color changes, 1 dock, 4 signs and 4 misc./other for a total of 24. December 2015 and February 2016 were provided to the Board prior to this meeting. Sixteen (16) actions were included in these minutes.

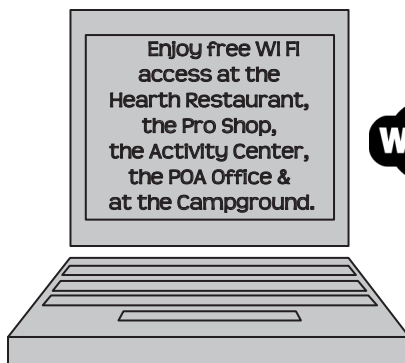

BOATING ON LAKE LANCELOT AND LAKE LANCER OPERATING REGULATIONS & RULES OF THE ROAD

Safety is the primary consideration to having a safe and enjoyable outing. The excitement, fun, and the thrills come in at a distant second. Enjoy our lakes!

1. Township ordinance prescribes slow/no wake speeds between the hours of 7:30 pm to 11:00 am daily.
2. A person shall not operate a Personal Watercraft (PWC) during the period that begins one (1) hour before sunset and ends at 8:00 am.
3. No skiing, tubing or towing without an observer.
4. Do not operate your boat or PWC within 100 feet of stationary objects, docks, swimming areas, shorelines or anchored boats unless operating at slow/no wake speeds.
5. Operate your watercraft in a counter-clockwise fashion for all water activities.
6. Observe all slow / no wake signs.
7. Do not operate your boat if you have been drinking.
8. Racing is prohibited.
9. Non-motorized craft (sailboats, rowboats, canoes, etc.) have the right-of-way over motorboats.
10. Any boat being overtaken has the right-of-way.
11. Personal Watercraft must obey the same rules as other boats.
12. A PWC shall not cross a wake closer than 150 feet from the boat making the wake.
13. No boat shall operate without proper lighting between sunset and sunrise.
14. Riding on the Bow is illegal if the vessel is not equipped with bow seating and is operating at greater than slow/no wake speed. It is illegal to ride on the gun-wale.
15. Persons born after December 31, 1978, may not operate a PWC unless they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

Approved by the Board of Directors on December 4, 1993.

ROADS

It looks like summer is finally here. The Township is once again busy with their summer projects. Every year we budget \$20,000.00 towards maintaining the gravel roads and \$10,000.00 for brining. This year we are able to re-surface Hockaday road between Wirtz and Ritchie. We also are going to do some crack sealing to keep the moisture out from under the pavement to prolong the wear and tear. As money allows, we will continue to fix our roads, perhaps a mile at a time, to maintain their integrity.

BOAT LAUNCH

The boat launch parking lot and the kiosk will also get a new look. D & D Asphalt will be resurfacing the parking lot on June 7th. This should only take one day with stripping to be done the following day. We are currently taking bids for a new kiosk.

RUBBISH

We have contracted with a new rubbish removal company. As of July 1, 2016 Republic Services will be servicing Butman Township. You will be receiving new cans along with literature.

FIREWORKS/NOISE

At this time we would like to remind everyone about the fireworks and noise restrictions. The noise ordinance #35 is on our web site at www.butmantwp.com. or you may obtain one from the Township Office. *In a nutshell, please be mindful of your neighbors-especially those with little children and pets.* The fireworks ordinance restrictions read as follows:

1a. In accordance with the State of Michigan (MCL 28.457) defined as a population of less than 50,000 located in a county with a population of less than 750,000, Butman Township enacts this Ordinance regulating and including prohibiting the ignition, discharge and use of consumer fireworks, including, but not limited to, an Ordinance prescribing the hours of the night as follows:

FIREWORKS/NOISE—Con't

Between the hours of 1 a.m. and 8 a.m. on the day preceding, the day of, or the day after a national holiday as follows:

“National Holidays” are those defined in 5USC6103-

- New Year’s day, January 1
- Martin Luther King, Jr Day, the third Monday in January
- Washington’s Birthday, the third Monday in February
- Memorial Day, the last Monday in May
- Independence Day, July 4
- Labor Day, the first Monday in September
- Columbus Day, the second Monday in October
- Veterans Day, November 11
- Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November
- Christmas Day, December 25

The noise ordinance restrictions are as follows: It shall be unlawful between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 8:00 a.m. for any person to create, maintain or permit any loud, unnecessary, unnatural or unusual noise of such character, intensity, or duration, either steadily or intermittently at any place which annoys, disturbs endangers or impairs the comfort, health convenience, safety, welfare, enjoyment and peace and quiet of other persons in the vicinity.

It shall be unlawful at any time of the day or night to keep any animal, dog or bird which by causing frequent or long-continuing noise, or barking, causes a disturbance.

Let be mindful of our neighbors and have fun.

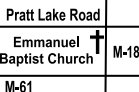
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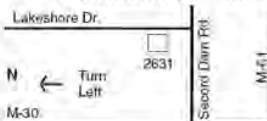
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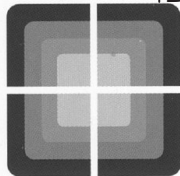
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
