According to the Covenants of the Sugar Springs Property Owners Association, "architectural and environmental control is hereby established for the purpose of protecting, to the extent feasible the values, amenities and qualities of the development."

The A&E Committee meets each Tuesday morning from 9:00 AM to 10:00 AM, downstairs in the Activity Building next door to the POA Office. They review applications, answer member's questions, then visit sites and properties to monitor progress on projects and to verify compliance. They act to enforce the Bylaws and Covenants, as well as the directives of the board of directors.

With spring approaching, it might be a good time to reflect on some common problems and make plans to fix up, clean up. Below are some of the most frequently seen issues, in no special order:

1. Sheds and houses not matching. At least the same color.
2. Trailers not properly stored or parked on lots.
3. Grills, lawn furniture, mowers and debris left over the winter on camping lots.
4. Firewood stored improperly.
5. Docks extending more than 20 feet over water.
6. Camping units parked on lots with houses.
7. Well houses larger than 4 feet by 5 feet by 30 inches high.
8. Lot modification without a permit.
9. Permits not obtained 30 days in advance of the start of projects, or not at all.
10. Variance approval not applied for pump houses on camping lots

All of these issues are addressed in the Bylaws and Covenants, the A&E Construction Pamphlet or the Regulations and Policies of the POA. if members have any questions, please call the A&E Committee at 989 426-0939 or stop by any Tuesday between 9:00 and 10:00 AM.

Lakes Committee News



Lakes Committee Comments

Spring is fast approaching but there are a few things that have happened over the winter that as Sugar Springer's we want you to be aware of.

Most of you have been aware of the difficulties encountered last summer with the Lake Lancer Bypass valve failing which by law is to allow bottom lake water to continue back into the Sugar River to flow below us. The valve or gate (35 ft. down in the pit) was temporarily fixed by the Drain Commissioner to allow summer use of Lake Lancer knowing that he would be working on the problem this fall. This fall the gate was lowered to where the Drain Commissioner feels it should be but more work still needs to be done to be able to control the amount of water allowed to go through the valve (gate). Right now the ice has halted the permanent fix but will be resumed when the spring weather takes out the ice and allows divers to complete the repair. The lake water is slowly rising and we will let you all know thru the POA office when the boats can be put in.

Another problem has occurred at the Spillway. There is a gate at the Spillway regulating water to go thru that gate. The Drain Commissioner has found that ice has damaged that gate to a point it cannot regulate water at the Spillway as intended and needs to be replaced. This has become a priority due to the ice that has built up there and the water levels at the top of the Spillway. Without a functioning gate water will be moving thru that area and has the potential in lowering the water in the Lake even more. According to the Drain Commissioner this needs to be fixed quickly and is in the process doing just that now. He has consulted with Spicer Engineering and has his plan ready to go.

Many of us wonder why these problems suddenly surfaced now but in looking back both areas have been in play approx. 50 years. The metal used in the 60's and 70's appears to have reached its life expectancy to a point ice etc. takes its toll.

MOSQUITO PROGRAM

Rose Pest Solutions will once again be handling our Mosquito Program. Weather permitting the spraying will begin in May. **IF YOU WISH TO OPT OUT OF THIS PROGRAM YOU MUST FILL OUT A FORM. THIS FORM MAY BE PICKED UP AT THE TOWNSHIP OR CALL ROSE PEST CONTROL AT 1-800-437-6938.** Any problem you might have or you need additional spraying please call Rose directly.

BUTMAN TOWNSHIP 2017 MOSQUITO ABATEMENT PROGRAM

Mosquito Abatement Program Consists of Seven Key Elements

1. Early spring surveying in the township to locate potential mosquito breeding habitats.
2. Testing and monitoring of any known sites that have standing water for the presence of mosquito larvae.
3. Larvicide treatment of standing waters, ditches, and woodland pools that test positive for mosquito larvae.
4. Adult mosquito surveillance and monitoring using an extensive array of New Jersey Light Traps (NJLT) and CDC Traps. The number of adult female mosquitoes in the traps will be monitored two days a week. Only female mosquitoes bite. In addition, a sampling of mosquitoes found in the traps will be tested for West Nile Virus on a periodic basis.
5. A truck-mounted short-lived adulticide spray will be applied to knock down the mosquitoes on Thursdays at dusk from May 25th- August 31st, weather permitting. This type of application is defined as a space treatment that uses an Ultra Low Volume (ULV) machine. The chemical used for this treatment is Kontrol 4-4. The active ingredients are Permethrin 4.6% and Piperonyl Butoxide Technical 4.6%. There is no re-entry restriction listed with this product.
6. In the event disease-carrying mosquitoes are found in any area of the township, a total comprehensive adulticide spraying application will occur.
7. If you are pregnant, have health concerns, asthma, allergies, emphysema, or compromised immune systems because of chemotherapy or other medications, or environmental concerns: call Rose Pest Solutions at 1-800-437-6938, E-Mail them at mosquito@rosepest.com, pick up a form at the township hall, or visit the township's website www.butmantwp.com to get:
 - **Shut-Off List** – to have the adulticide spray shut off in front of your property.
 - **Notification List** – to know when there will be adulticide spraying in your area, so you are able to close doors and windows and bring your pets inside.

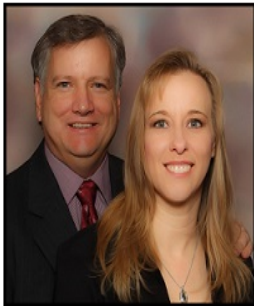
