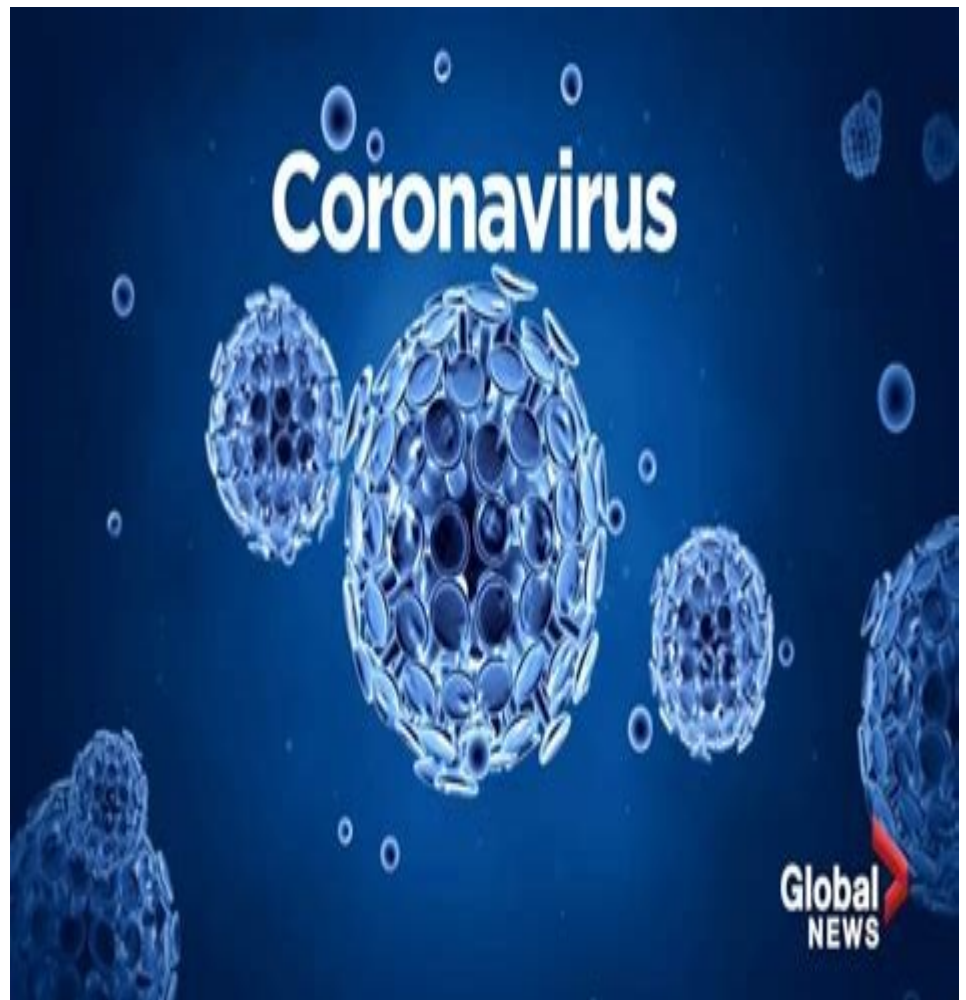

Open letter to Sugar Springs Member This communication is for Sugar Springs Property Owners Association members and cannot be reproduced/ pasted or shared to social media

Few things have made me as proud as how Sugar Springers have responded to the 2020 covid-19 crisis. Our members have shown incredible compassion for each other and for those in need. From grocery shopping for neighbors to calling for updates to making hundreds of face masks for friends, hospitals, and essential workers, Sugar Springers have stepped up and done the right thing, even when it meant we had lost our own activities, use of amenities, social gatherings, normal business routines, and other personal freedoms.

It is my ardent hope that Sugar Springers will extend that same level of compassion to those who are attempting to return us to some semblance of normalcy. In a much restricted time frame due to State Executive Orders, the following must be accomplished:

- Oversee, where possible, activity on our lakes due to an influx of boaters visiting here from those lakes affected by the dam breakages.

I hope you will agree the accomplishment of these tasks during uncertain times is sometimes overwhelming. Please be supportive of your board and its efforts to maintain everything that is so important to Sugar Springs.

Meanwhile, here, again is the source of my pride in Sugar Springs: During this continued effort to meet deadlines and adhere to our restrictions, so many Sugar Springs Members quietly go about finding creative ways to provide activities while still adhering to the Executive Orders: Pickle ball players safely meet on the courts, Stitchers hold small-group classes or on-line contests, Sugarsizers workout via video, golfers enjoy reduced leagues, volunteers care for the flowers on the golf course and the gardens around the Sugar Springs, and many other signs of normalcy.

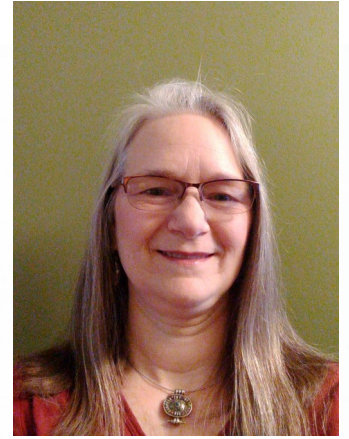
