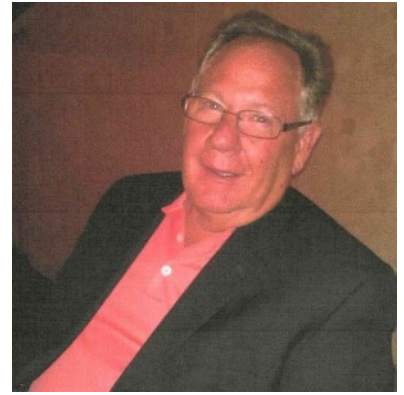

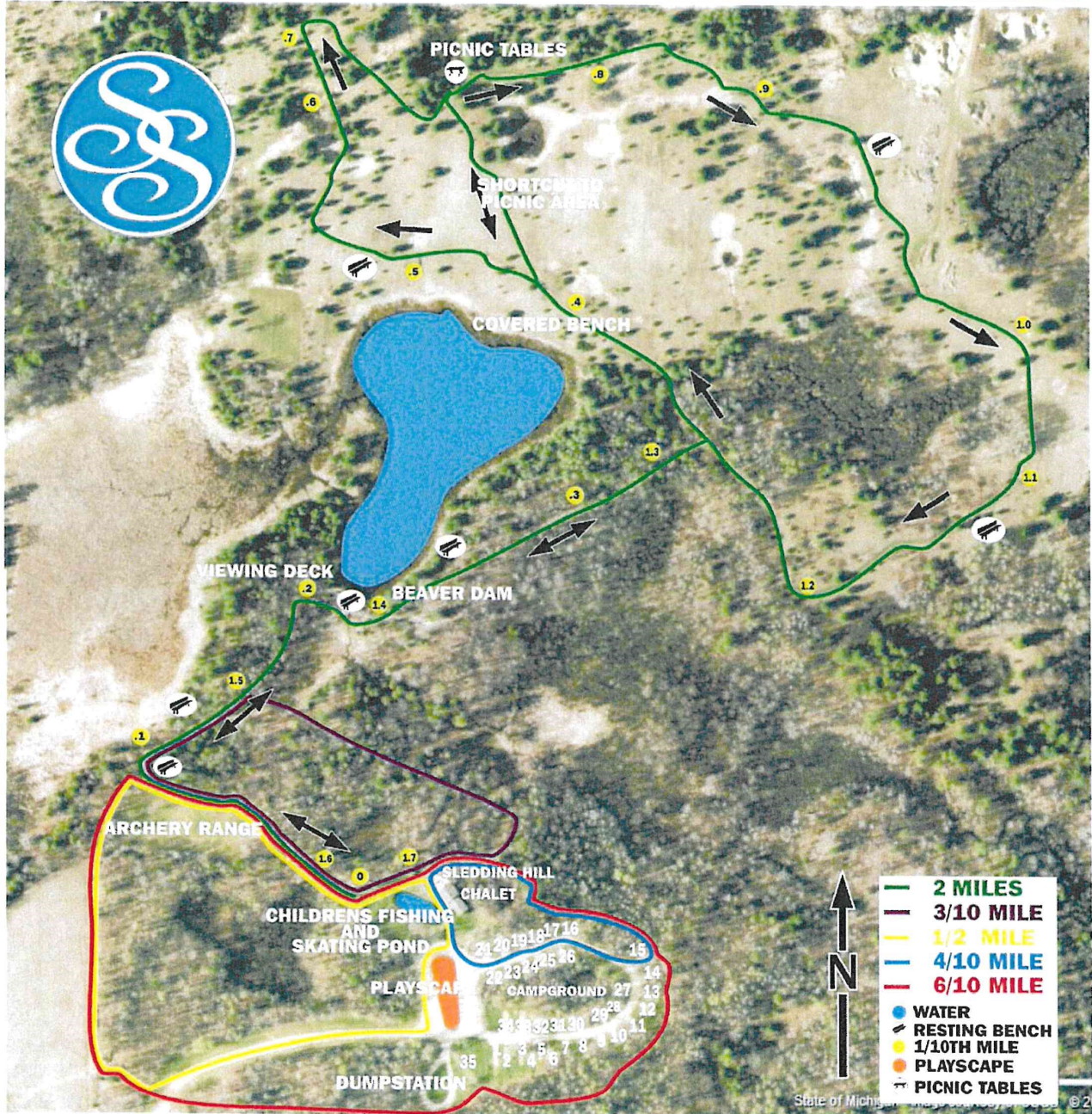

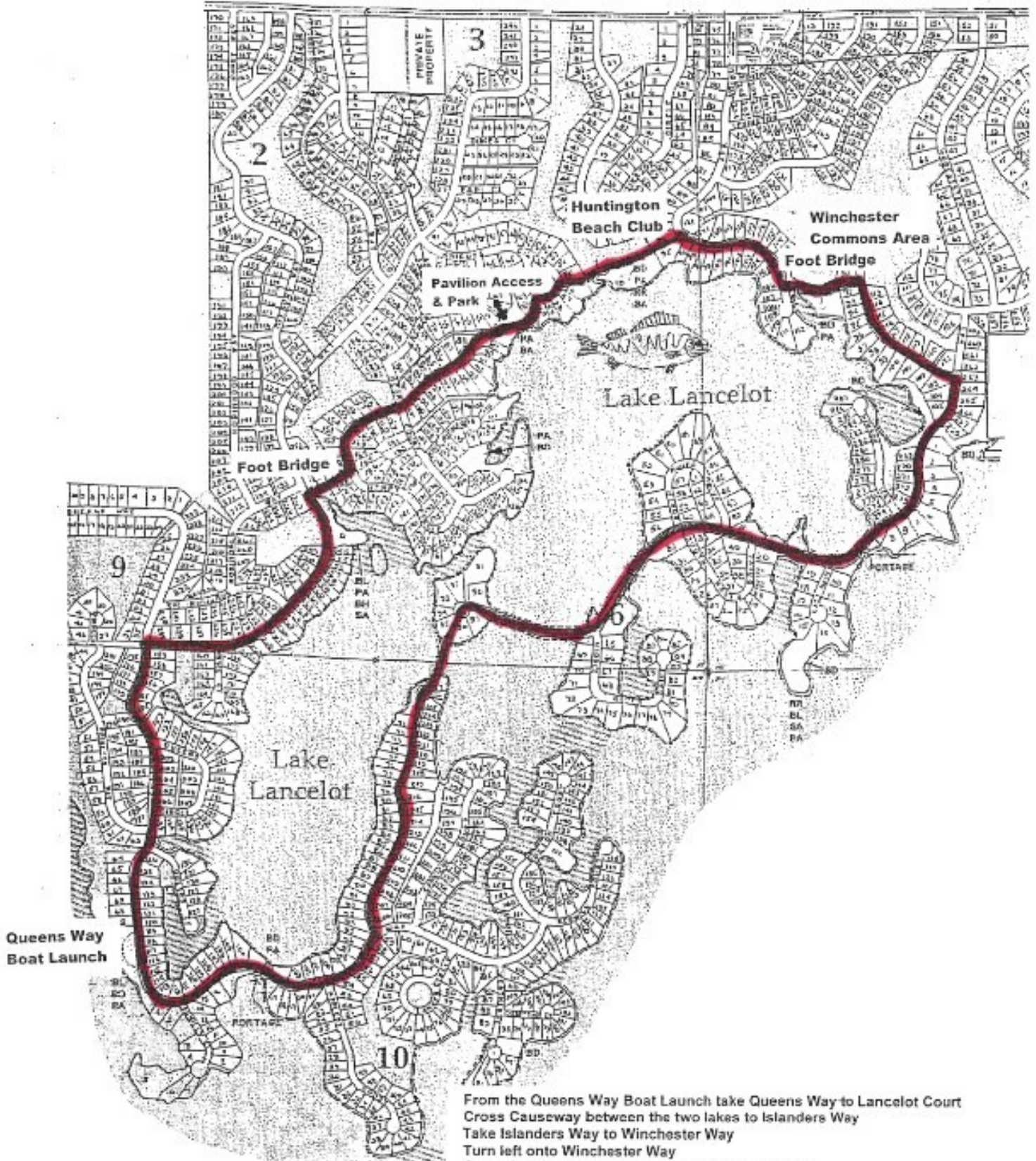

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

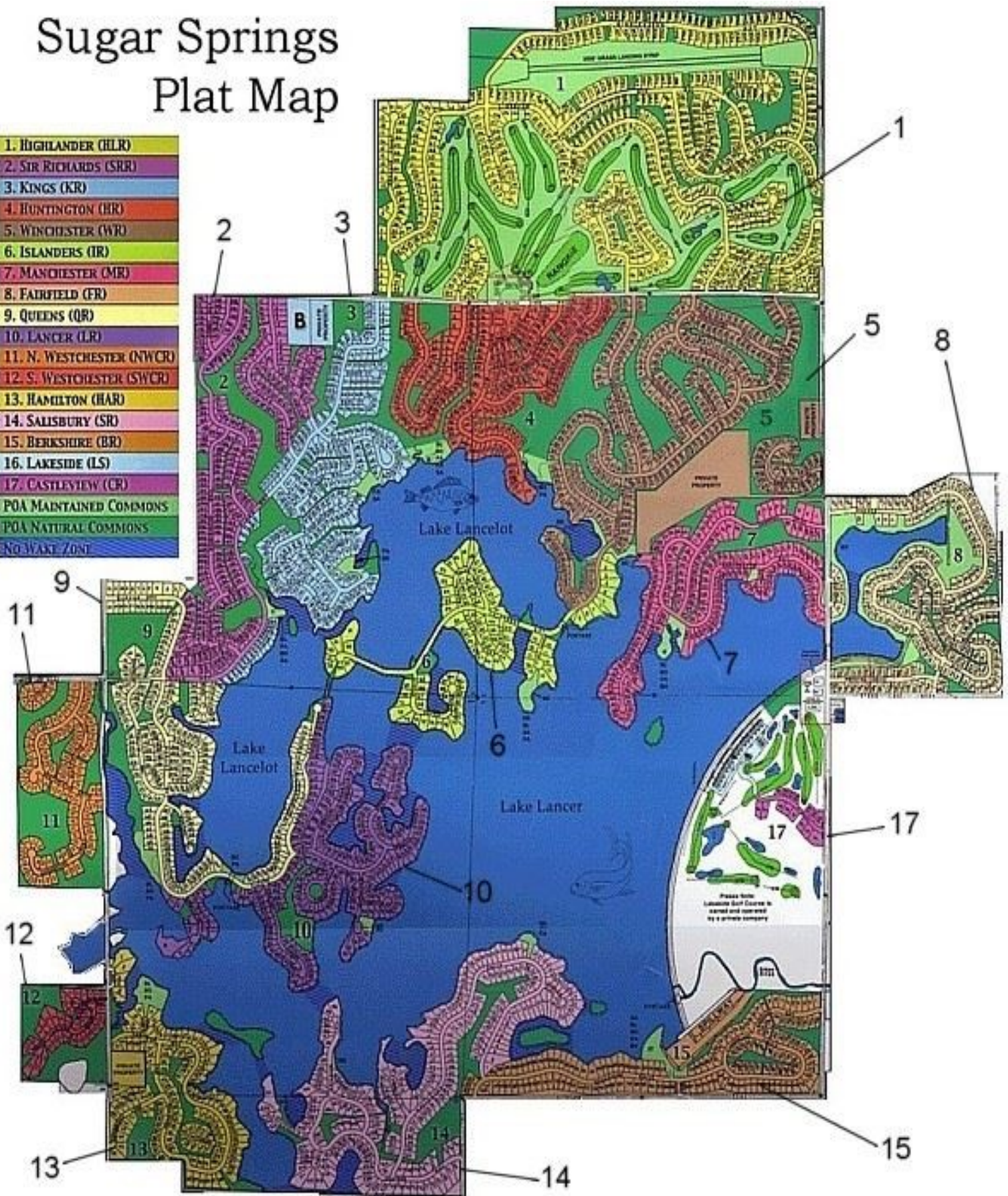
You can start from anywhere from the directions below. Parking is available at the Queens Way Boat Launch, Huntington Beach Club & Winchester Commons Area.

Fertilizer Reminder for Sugar Springs Residents

All lakes need protection from the pollution that robs them of oxygen and aquatic life. We can't do anything about nutrients from natural sources and the sun's warmth, but we can work to prevent excessive nutrients and sediments from human activity from getting into lakes and waterways.

Just as applying fertilizer to gardens and farm fields helps crops grow, nutrients entering lakes and rivers feed the growth of algae, bacteria, and other tiny organisms. Water bodies require some nutrients to be healthy, but too much can be harmful. When lakes receive an overabundance of nutrients, especially phosphorus, they can become polluted by excessive amounts of algae. Die-off and decomposition of algae blooms can reduce dissolved oxygen and suffocate fish and other aquatic life. Some forms of algae (blue-green) may produce toxins that can be harmful if ingested by humans and animals.

Remember that the watershed that supplies water to our lakes is impacted by every resident of Sugar Springs. Almost all surface water in Sugar Springs eventually finds its way into our lakes. We are all responsible for maintaining our watershed to ensure we are constantly protecting this valuable resource.

Please check your lawn fertilizer for the N-P-K value and ensure the P value is 0. Ask your lawn service to do the same. Refer to the diagrams below.

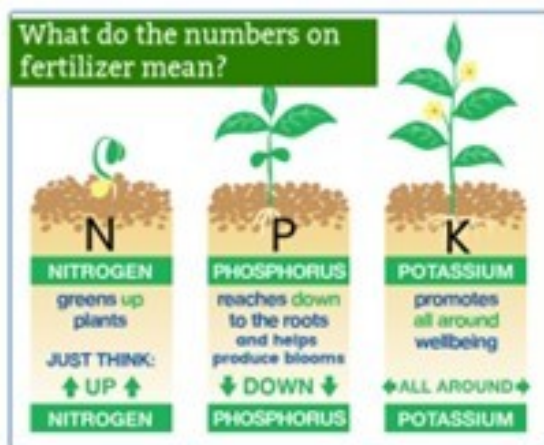
Save money! An established lawn needs primarily nitrogen since it is not producing any fruit or flowers. Nitrogen is the least expensive of the nutrients.

Do our lakes a favor! Don't buy a formula that has phosphorous or high potassium when you don't need them.

In summary, when fertilizing, do so appropriately to prevent pollution and maximize plant health by following these helpful tips:

- Understand and read the labels when selecting a fertilizer.
- Choose slow-release products with potassium and no phosphorus.
- Don't get fertilizer on hard surfaces, if you spill it then clean it up – DO NOT RINSE EXCESS FERTILIZERS INTO DRAINS OR WATER BODIES.
- Maintain a 20-foot-wide unfertilized buffer along lakefronts and wetlands.
- Plant your lakefront with a variety of trees, shrubs, and ground cover, rather than turf grass, to prevent runoff and nutrient movement to the lake.
- Don't fertilize before a heavy rain.
- Avoid using "weed and feed" products.

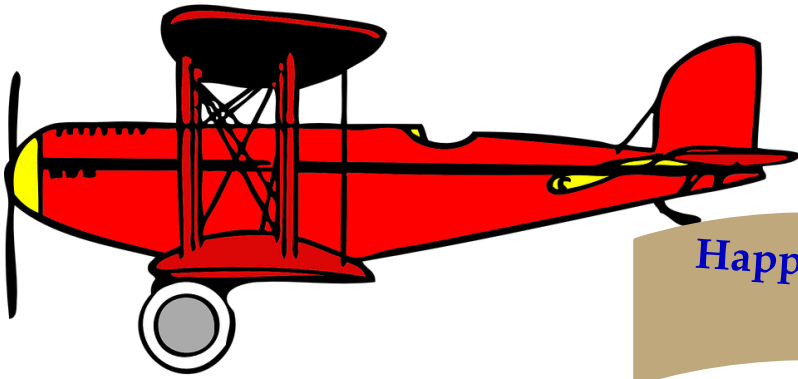

Butman Township News

BUTMAN TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE # 40-21 FIREWORKS

SECTION A: Purpose

The purpose of this ordinance is to protect the public health, safety and general welfare of the inhabitants of the Township, the land and resources lying within the township, by limiting and restricting activities that cause excessive noise within the Township, to prescribe penalties for the violation thereof and to repeal all ordinances or parts of ordinances that are inconsistent therewith:

SECTION B: DEFINITIONS

- a) **Consumer fireworks**, referred to as 1.4G would include: roman candles, bottle rockets and other items that leave the ground.
- b) **Novelty items** such as sparklers, snakes, snaps and poppers remain legal for sale and use. Novelty fireworks are not regulated under the Michigan Fireworks Safety Act.
- c) **Low Impact Fireworks** such as ground sparkling devices, ground based or handheld sparklers also remain legal for sale and use in Michigan.
- d) **Display fireworks**, typically referred to as 1.3G, are large and explosive items typically used for public display and are locally permitted for use by professionals. They are not regulated by the Department of Licensing and Regulatory Affairs (LARA).

SECTION C:

Michigan Fireworks Safety Act, 635 of 2018 shall regulate the ignition, discharge, or uses of consumer fireworks on the following days after 11 a.m.:

- December 31 until 1 a.m. on January 1.
- The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Memorial Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- June 29 to July 4 until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.
- July 5, if that date is a Friday or Saturday, until 11:45 p.m.
- The Saturday and Sunday immediately preceding Labor Day until 11:45 p.m. on each of those days.

State law requires that consumer-grade fireworks only be ignited from personal property. It is illegal to ignite fireworks on public property (including streets and sidewalks), school property, church property, or another person's property without their express permission. State law makes it illegal to discharge fireworks when intoxicated or under the influence of drugs.

When fire-related incidents involve consumer, low impact, or illegal fireworks resulting in property damage, injury or death of another person, individuals are subject to a misdemeanor or felony punishable by imprisonment of not more than five years and fines of up to \$10,000 or both.

SECTION D:

Butman Township shall **prohibit** the ignition, discharge and use of consumer fireworks, novelty fireworks, low impact fireworks and display fireworks on all calendar days and times **except** on the days described in Section C.

Violations and Penalties

All violations of Section C shall impose a civil fine of \$1,000.00 for each violation of the ordinance and no other fine or sanction. The ordinance must provide for the remittance of \$500.00 of the fine collected under the ordinance to the local law enforcement agency responsible for enforcing the ordinance.

All violations of Section D shall impose a municipal civil infraction as defined by Michigan law and subject to a civil fine of not more than \$500.00, plus enforcement costs, which may include all direct or indirect expenses to which the Township has expended in connection with the violation, as permitted by law. In no case, however, shall costs of less than \$9.00 or more than \$500.00 be ordered. Each day that a violation shall continue constitutes a separate offense.

SECTION E

The provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable and if any sentence, work section, paragraph, or provision is declared void or unenforceable, for any reason, by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remaining portions of said ordinance shall remain in force and such decision shall not affect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION F: REPEAL

This Ordinance specifically repeals Firework and Noise Ordinance 35-1.

SECTION G: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance will take effect thirty (30) days following publication hereof in the Gladwin County Record on December 22 2021.
