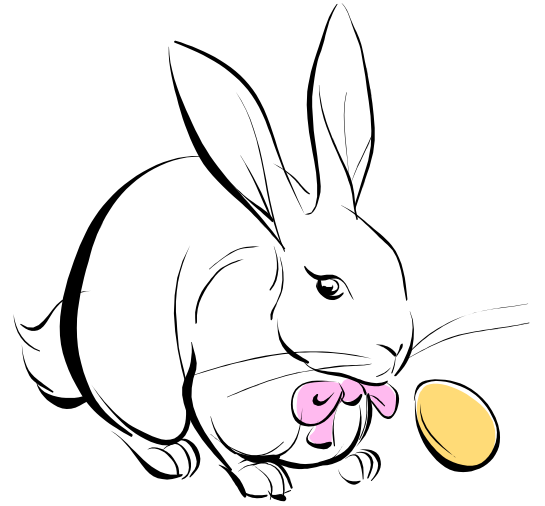

Message from the
Architectural and Environmental Control Committee

As some of you may be aware, the Sugar Springs POA has been involved in a lawsuit, instituted by two of our members, concerning the validity of renting Sugar Springs property on a short term basis (less than 6 months) to outside parties.

On January 12, 2023, the State of Michigan Court of Appeals, affirmed that the language in the Sugar Springs Covenants and Bylaws does not allow short term rentals.

For those members who have been, or may be, contemplating renting their property on a short term basis, be aware that it is not allowed and violation assessments will be issued to those that choose non-compliance.

Reason for wanting to serve as a Director on the S.S.P.O.A Board:

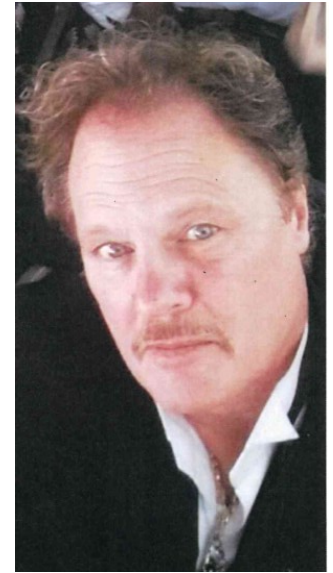

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

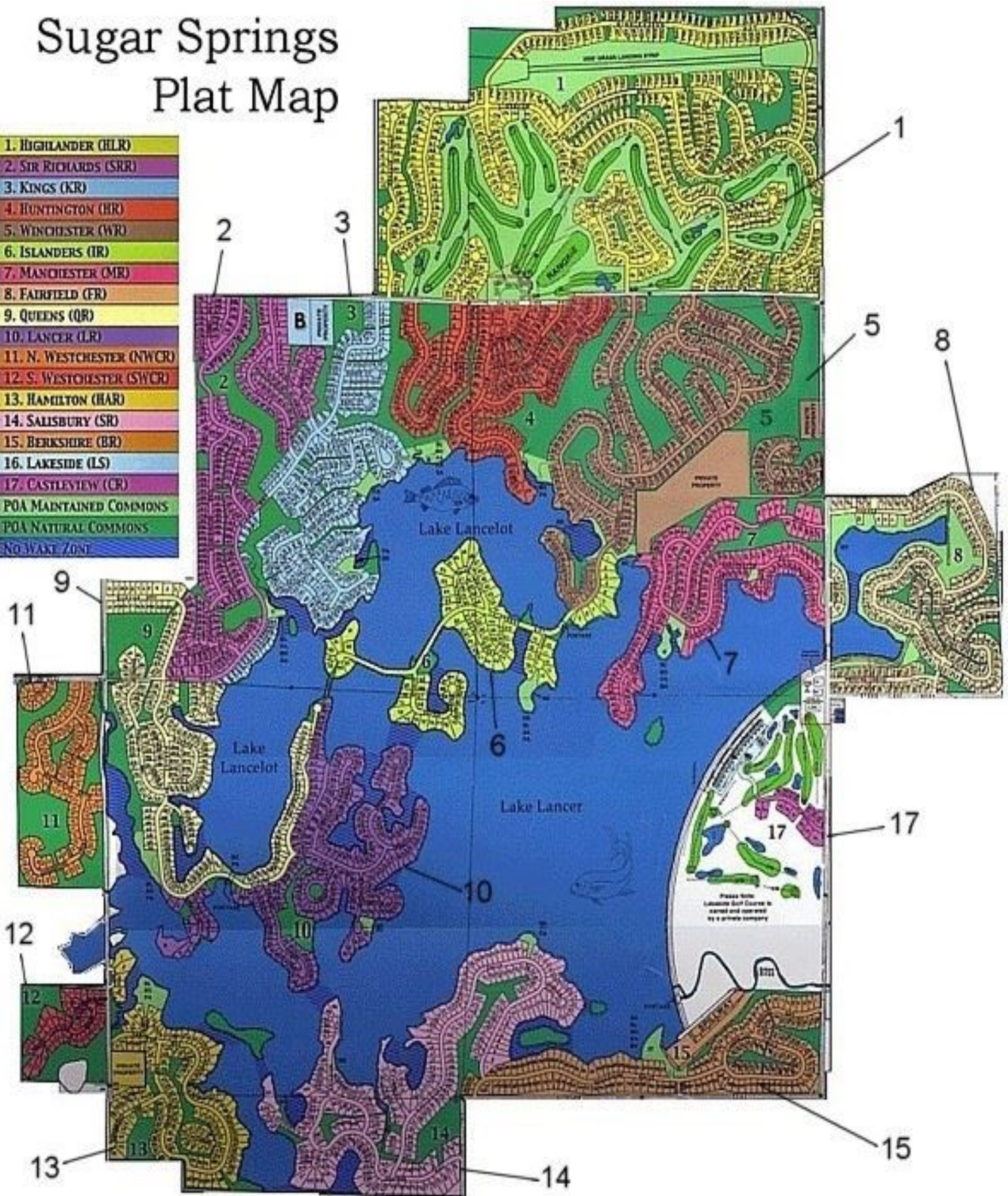

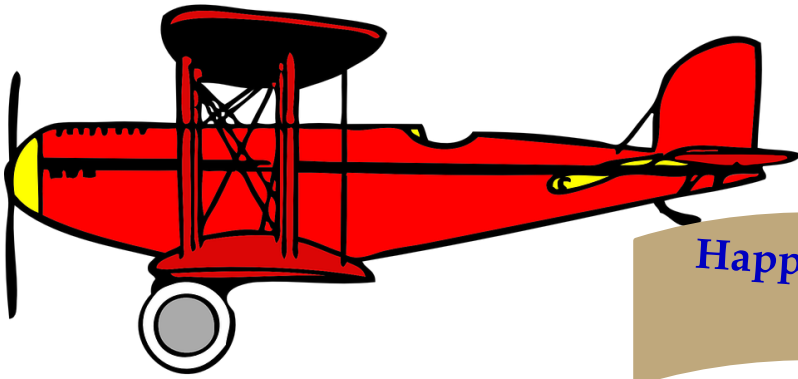

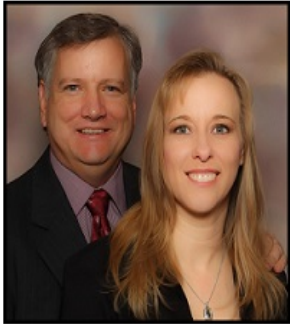
