Our goal is to continue moving forward.

Well, who would have thought that we would have to postpone the Winterfest till February 10th because of too much snow. It wasn't because we couldn't get the road to the hill plowed, our Buildings and Grounds had that done quickly .

It was due to most of the Sugar Springs streets buried with over 8" - 12" of snow.

The restaurant and golf course finished the year with record sales. Thank you all for your support.

We are keeping the momentum moving forward with projects throughout the winter. We have finished and installed the first new playground equipment having said that we are waiting for one more piece of equipment that missed shipment so at the present time we have the playground equipment roped off with caution tape and have not installed steps as a safety precaution. The other two playground sets will be delivered early February. They should also be built and ready to install before the season begins. The new playground equipment is made of a special coated metal and composite decking.

Dock updates are happening. When our buildings and grounds team removed docks in the fall they compiled a list of the docks that needed to be updated. They will be repairing them throughout the winter, while we will not be able to get to all of them we will keep this project moving. This is the best time and easiest for them to do them as they can stand on the ice to repair damage.

At 10:00 a.m., the December 9, 2023 Sugar Springs Property Owners Association (SSPOA) Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President, Tom Hug, at the SSPOA Activity Center.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, President Hug opened the meeting with the Regular Order of Business pursuant to the Agenda.

ADDITIONS/CHANGES TO THE AGENDA: None

FINANCIALS:

TREASURER'S REPORT: Matt Schindler, Comptroller, reviewed the financial statement dated November 2023. Complete statement is available to SSPOA members via the POA Office. Report was accepted as presented.

GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT: "As 2023 comes to an end, I happily report that many projects were completed. Some of the highlights were the generator for The Hearth, the resurfacing of the pool floor, the purchase of a new greens mower (which was on order for about 14 months prior). The Buildings and Grounds crew installed a new roof on the Chalet, we resurfaced the Tennis and Pickle Ball courts and two of the islands have been rip-rapped in order to "shore up" and eliminate some of the erosion problems we have had.

Going forward some of the projects for 2024 are the ordering of a new fairway mower. We are in the process of carding all of the bath house key cards so in the future getting access to the bath houses, you will need a key card. We are anticipating replacing the windows in the office plus siding the building – also the same thing for the Pro Shop. These will be installed by the Buildings and Grounds crew which will save a substantial amount of funds.

We were involved in Gladwins Festival of Lights Parade with a float that took place on December 2. We took 2nd place in the competition. Many compliments were received by members and the general Gladwin population. A 'shout out' goes to our Buildings and Grounds staff for building the structure and the parade committee for putting their magic on it and making it such a success. The Christmas Kindness volunteers picked up the many gift donations from our members and extended their appreciation for their generosity.

In January all the key cards will be turned off for all members. When the member information sheet is received, there will be space for the numbers on the return sheet in order to have keys turned back on. The reason for this audit is that over 7,000 cards have been activated over the years. If a member needs their card turned on earlier than March, please contact the office."

Additional Comment from Carrie Will, Director of Gladwin County Chamber of Commerce who thanked the SSPOA for parade involvement and for renewing the ad in the new Chamber Directory. 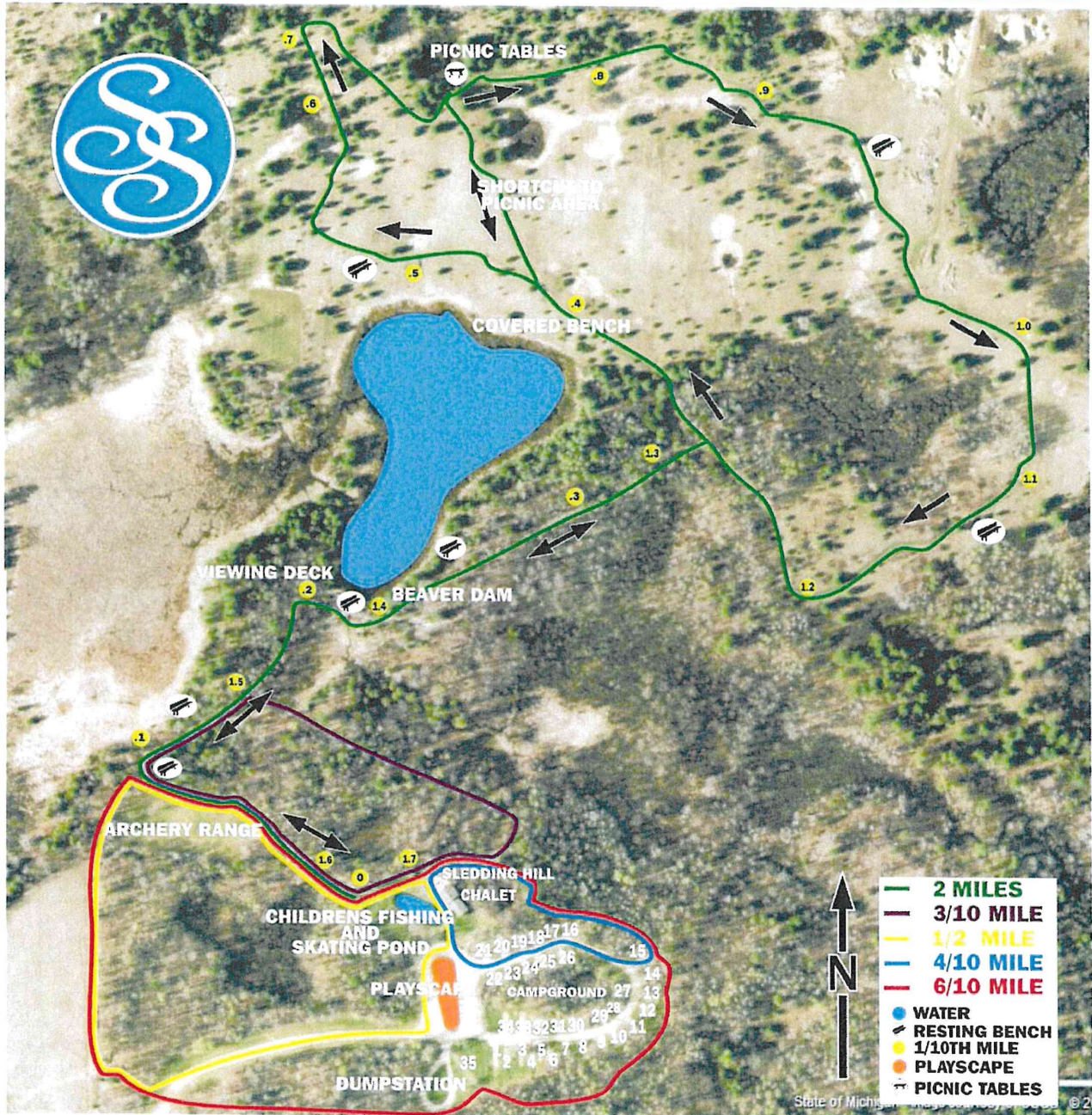

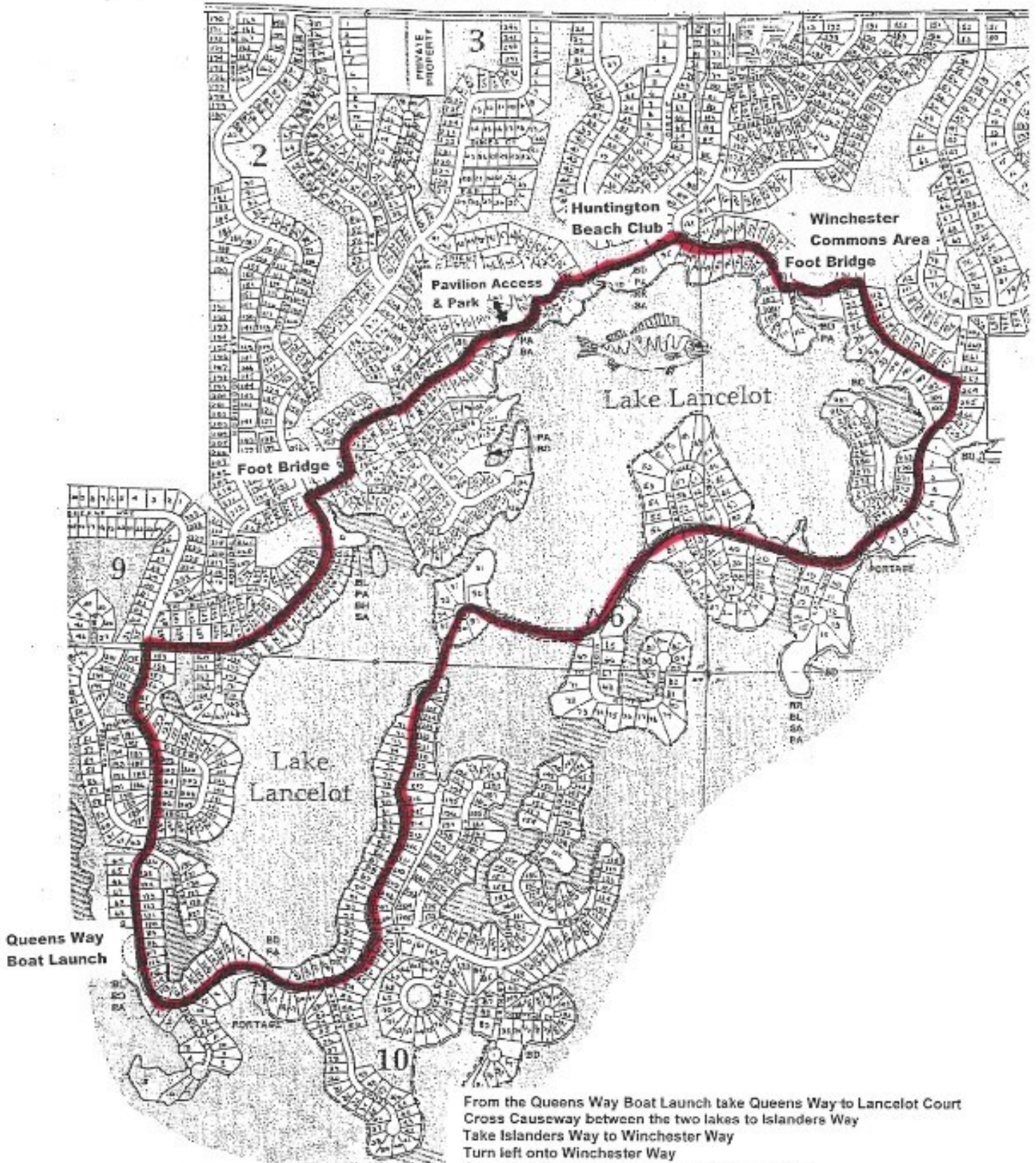

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

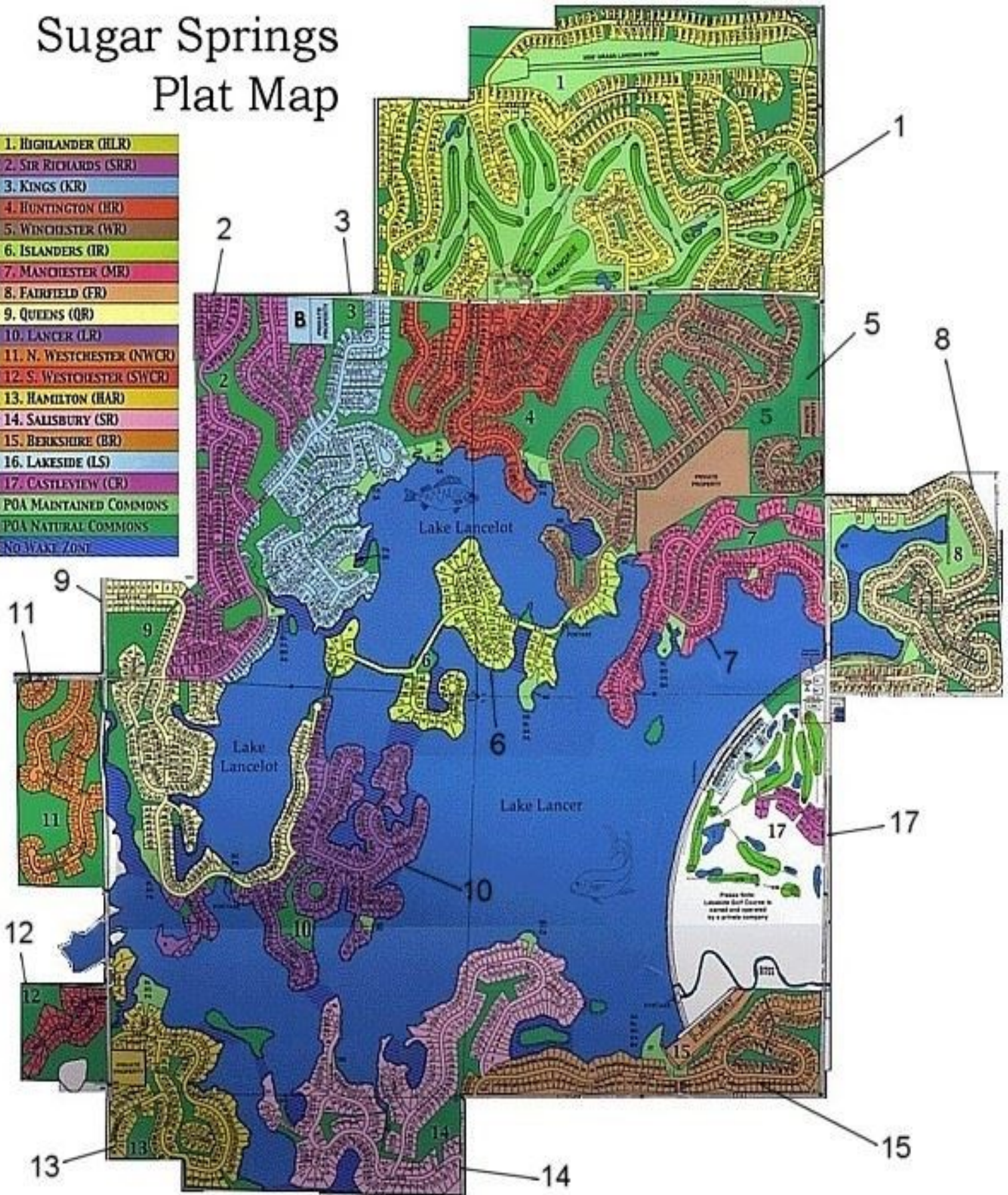

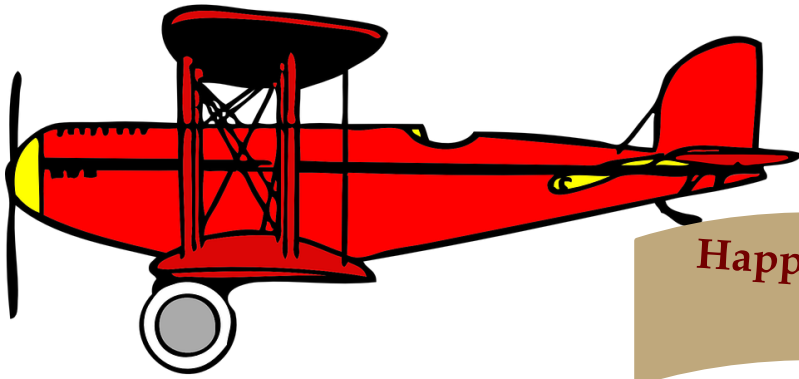
