Frequently asked questions:

1. What activities require a permit from the A&E Committee?

Answer – Pretty much any exterior construction/modification or lot modification requires a permit.

2. Do I need a permit to perform maintenance on my home?

Answer – Yes, re-siding, re-roofing and deck upgrades require color approval.

3. Can I cut trees on my lot?

Answer – Not without a tree removal permit. Even if the tree(s) are dead or small, a permit should be submitted, including the reason for removal.

4. Can I have a storage shed on my camping lot?

Answer – A shed may only be on a camping lot during the camping season. A well house (5'x5'x6') is allowed year round.

5. Do I need to have a camping permit in order to camp on my lot?

Answer – Yes, a camping sticker must be posted on your lot whenever a camper is present. The sticker must be placed near the driveway, easily seen from the road.

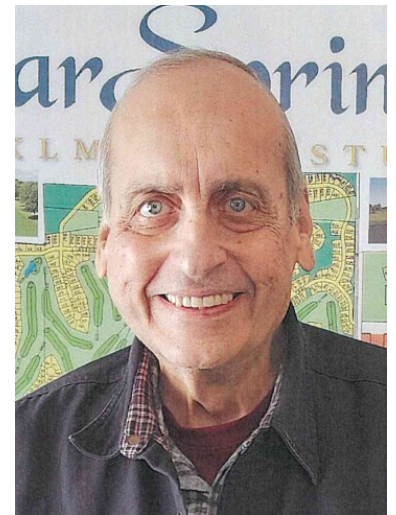

Hello Sugar Springs Members,

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the course during the month of May. This month, leagues have started and we have even hosted a few scramble fundraiser outings, including the Gladwin Chamber of Commerce fundraiser outing. This event has been hosted by Sugar Springs for multiple years in a row now, and I have been told by many participants that it is something they look forward to every year. Everyone seems to be enjoying the course, the Hearth, and the help they get from the Pro Shop staff in setting up the event. Hopefully they continue to choose Sugar Springs to host this event for years to come.

The course is in great condition overall and has been busy with lots of members and outside play on a daily basis. With all the play we have there are some maintenance issues that are hard to keep up on with our small course staff and I would like to ask members for their help alleviating these issues. The most common ones are fixing ball marks on greens, putting sand in divots to make them flush with the turf, and most importantly please watch where you drive your cart. During hot dry periods in the summer, when carts take the same route multiple times it creates a path in the grass. This is why we rope areas off and have "no cart signs" blocking high traffic locations. Please don't drive between trees and greenside bunkers. If an area is roped off to block a path, don't drive to the end of the rope and create a new path. Look for a less traveled route and this will help keep our greens surrounding areas looking pretty. With ball marks on the greens, if everyone makes it their goal to fix two or more every time they go on the green, there will be no ball marks.

You do not need to make a ball mark to fix a ball mark.

Thank you all for your support and I hope to see you all making birdies on our beautiful course this summer.

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

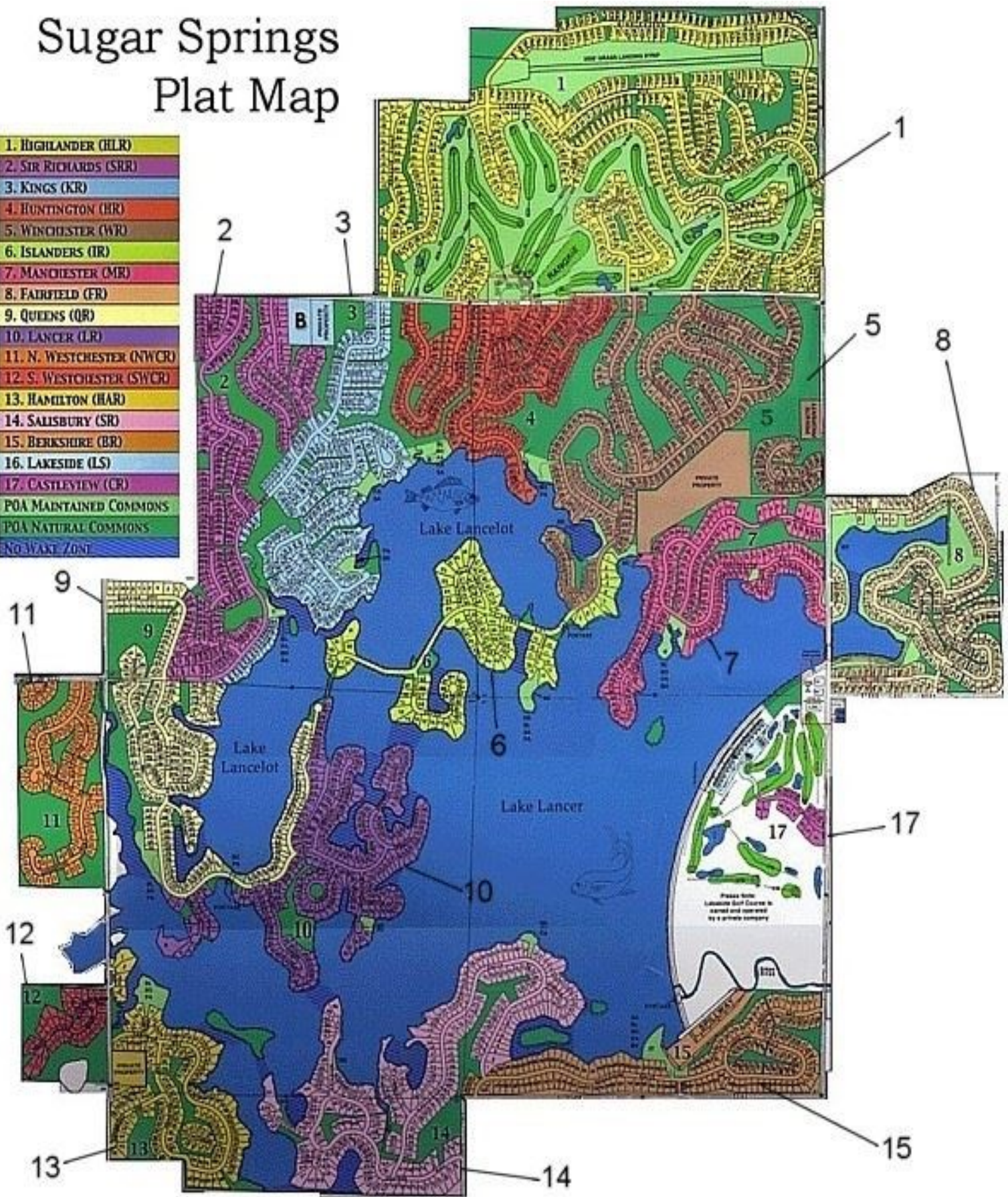



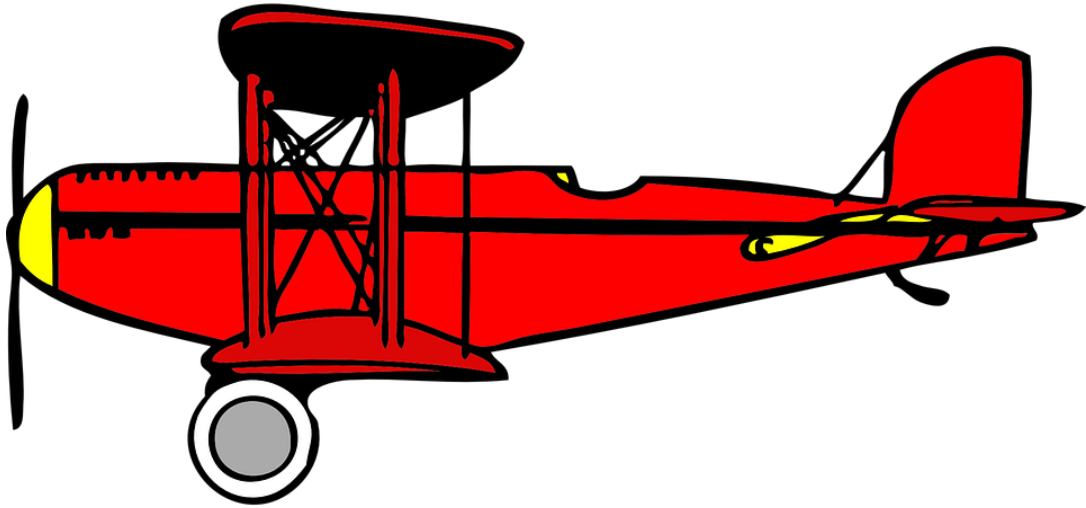
