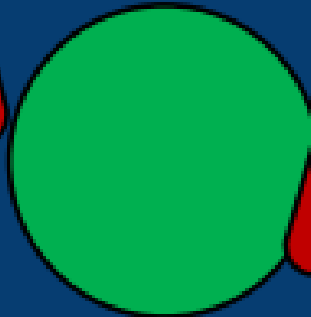

Never ignite devices in a container.

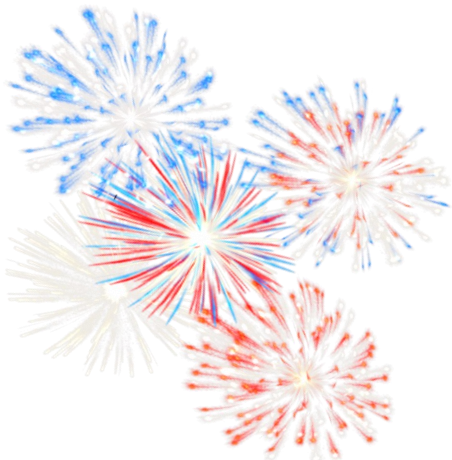
Never hold lighted fireworks in your hands.

Hello Sugar Springs members.

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the course during the month of June. I know the course has been more dry and discolored than usual, however this June has been unusually dry as far as rain totals. Also, two weeks ago we had one of our main irrigation pumps stop working due to electrical problems in our pump house. That has not done us any favors for helping to keep the course green and healthy. This is why we have been running more water during the day to help keep our course alive during this stretch of hot dry weather. Without the pump the irrigation system cannot hold enough line pressure to run the program overnight, so we have to run a smaller amount of heads during the day manually. I appreciate that most of you were understanding of that.

We are currently working on getting the electrical issues solved so we can be more prepared for the next streak of hot dry weather. I would like to give a huge shout out to Craig Taunt and Phil Redman for helping fix the issue as fast as possible. Without them we would be waiting two or more weeks to get the issue resolved by a local company.

Now that the holiday weekend is approaching, I am sure many of you have plans to play golf on our beautiful course. I would like to remind everyone to please continue to fix two ball marks on the greens, fill divots with sand that is provided on the carts, be mindful of where you are driving your golf carts, and to pass the word on to whoever you play with over the weekend.

I hope everyone has a safe and happy 4th of July and gets to enjoy all the amenities that Sugar Springs has to offer.

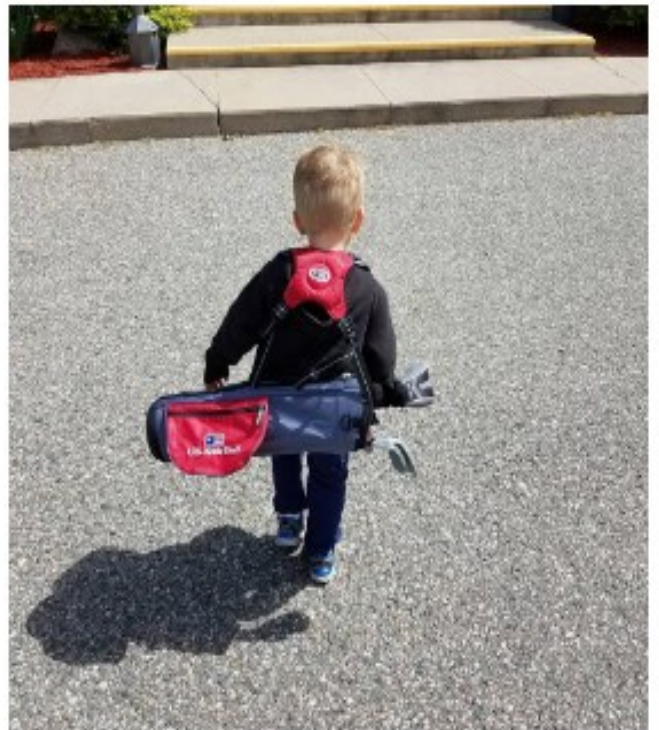

DID YOU KNOW - DRIVING RANGE

Our driving range has been busier than ever! It's great to see people working on their game as well as so many people just starting to learn how to play the game! With the increase driving range use, there comes some challenges.

The first challenge are divots. We're very fortunate to have an all-grass teeing area as well as a grounds staff does a great job topdressing and filling in all the divots. It's our responsibility as users to make the correct pattern of divots (see the image below). The linear divot pattern involves placing each shot directly behind the previous divot. In so doing, a linear pattern is created and only a small amount of turf is removed with each swing. This can usually be done for 15 to 20 shots before moving sideways to create a new line of divots. So long as a minimum of 4 inches of live turf is preserved between strips of divots, the turf will recover quickly. Because this divot pattern removes the least amount of turf and promotes quick recovery, it is the preferred method.

Our next challenge is currently running out of golf balls. We're not running out because they are being hit faster than we can pick them up. We're running out because they are disappearing. We constantly are missing range bags and range balls. While we have recently ordered new range balls that will be here soon, we ask that anyone purchasing range balls, not to leave the course with the range balls (or bag). If you are unable to hit the amount of balls that you purchased, we ask that you return the unhit balls to the golf shop. We will happily give you a credit for your next practice session!

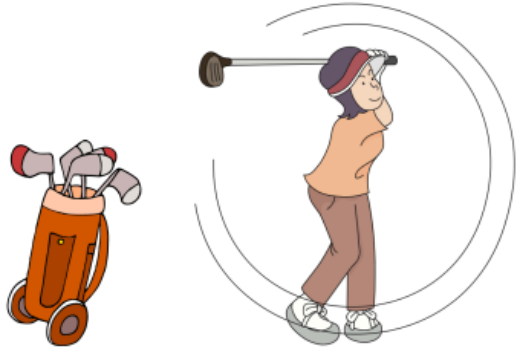

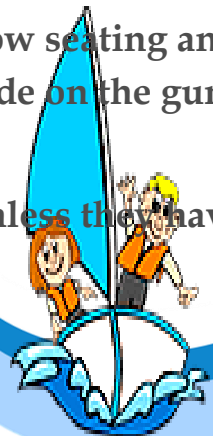

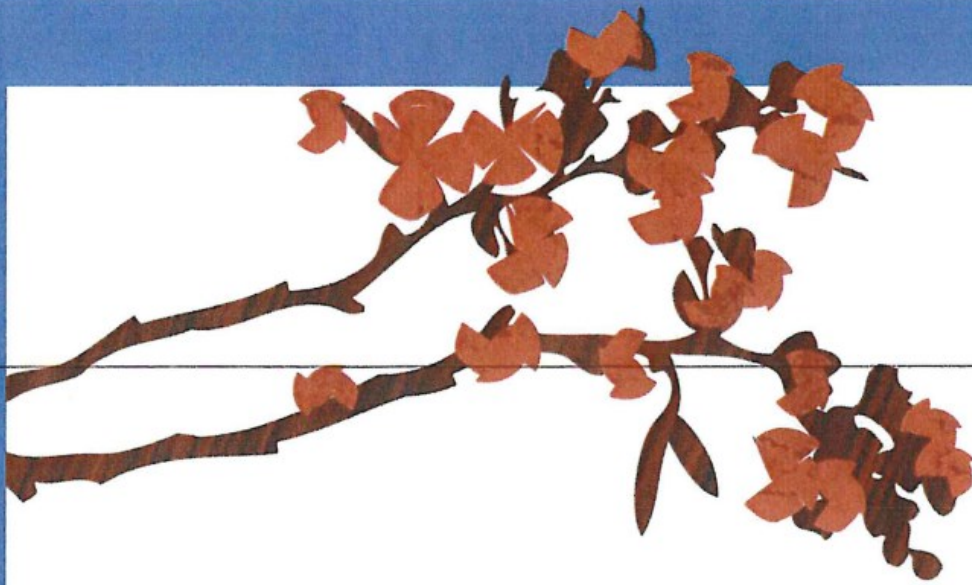
Boating on Lake Lancelot and Lake Lancer

Operating Regulations & Rules of the Road

Safety is the primary consideration to having a safe and enjoyable outing. The excitement, fun and the thrills come in at a distant second. Enjoy our lakes!

1. Township ordinance prescribes slow/no wake speeds between the hours of 7:30 pm to 11:00 am daily.
2. A person shall not operate a Personal Watercraft (PWC) during the period that begins one (1) hour before sunset and ends at 8:00 am.
3. No skiing, tubing, or towing without an observer.
4. Do not operate your boat or PWC within 100 feet of stationary objects, docks, swimming areas, shorelines or anchored boats unless operating of slow/no wake speeds.
5. Operate your watercraft in a counterclockwise fashion for all water activities.
6. Observe all slow/no wake signs.
7. Do not operate your boat if you have been drinking.
8. Racing is prohibited.
9. Non-motorized craft (sailboats, rowboats, canoes, etc.) have the right-of-way over motorboats.
10. Any boat being overtaken has the right-of-way.
11. Personal Watercraft must obey the same rules as other boats.
12. A PWC shall not cross a wake closer than 150 feet from the boat making the wake.
13. No boat shall operate without proper lighting between sunset and sunrise.
14. Riding on the bow is illegal if the vessel is not equipped with bow seating and is operating of greater than slow/no wake speed, it is illegal to ride on the gunwale.
15. Persons born after December 31, 1978, may not operate a PWC, unless they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

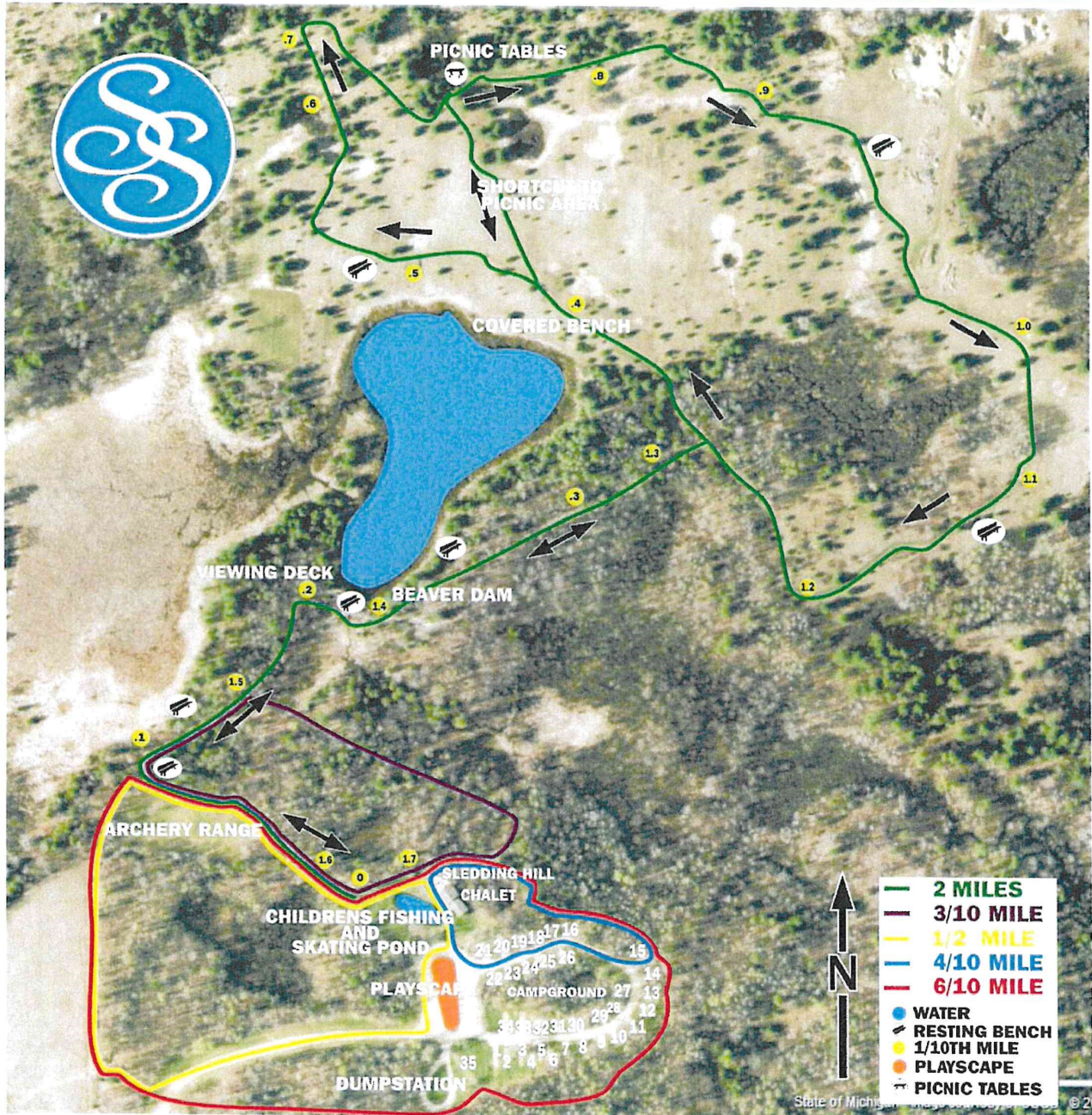

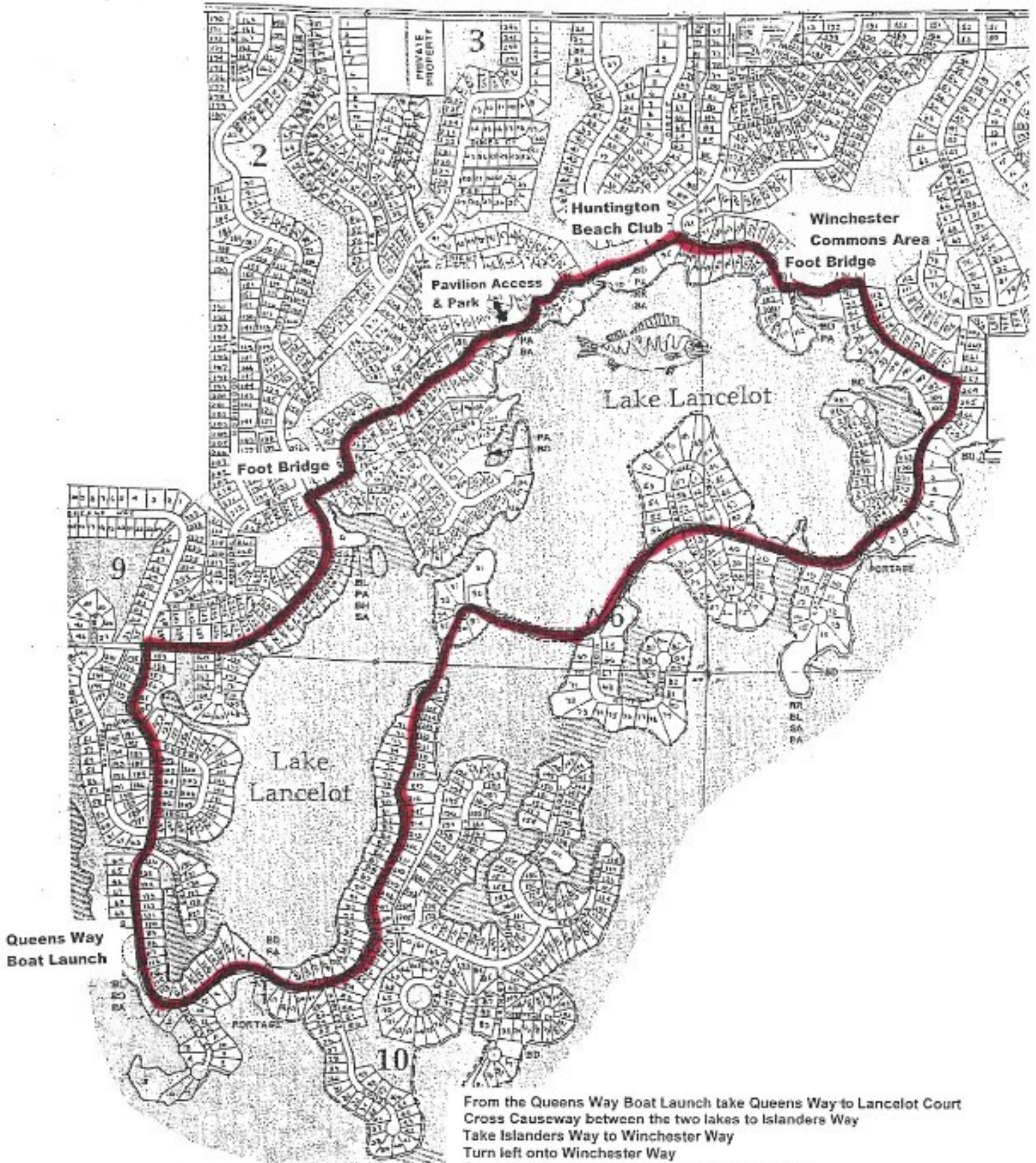

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

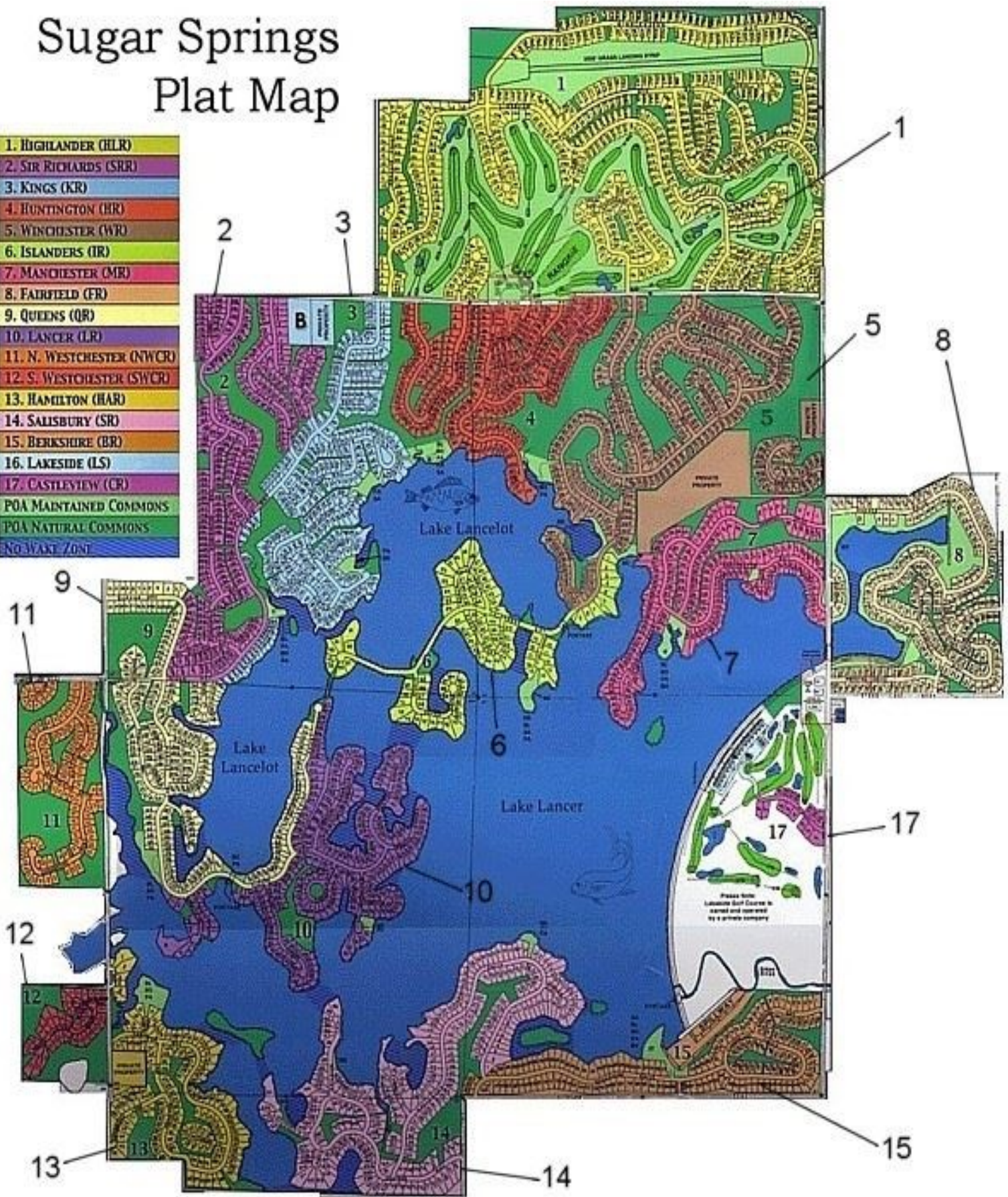
