

Lakes Committee

Frequently Asked Questions

What kind of fish are in the lake?

- The Lakes Committee members invite you to visit our Info tent to view some of the most abundant species of fish in Lake Lancelot and Lancer and discuss their characteristics.

Why don't we put more association docks in the lake and how can I get one?

- The quantity of docks is determined by the DNR, and we are at our maximum allotment of docks.
- Docks are rented to POA members in good standing as they become available via non-renewal of current rentals or members moving out of Sugar Springs. Visit the POA office to get on the POA dock waiting list.

Why do we have more weeds this year than in previous years?

This simple question does not have a simple answer. It involves many factors concerning aquatic plants and our lake ecosystems. Some contributing factors are as follows:

- The type of plant; Its volume and growing season; Native vs invasive; Other existing plant populations/volume.
- Water temperature; Clarity; Dissolved Oxygen levels; Phosphorus levels.
- Approved chemical treatments available; Current plant growth; Plant repopulation characteristics; Time of year.
- Prior chemical treatments; Physical location on the plants.
- Fish population, habitat, and food sources
- Environmental factors: Air temperature; Rainfall; Sunshine; Seasonal variations

What kind of weeds are in the lake?

- There are numerous Aquatic Plant species in Lake Lancelot and Lancer.
- The Lakes Committee members can show you our local species and discuss pertinent facts at our Info Tent.

What can I do to help keep our lake clean?

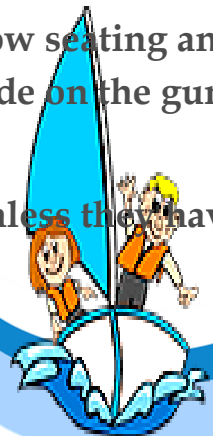
- Green grass, Green lake! Keep algae levels low by using XX-0-XX fertilizer ratio indicating the proportion of nitrogen, phosphate, and potash. Algae and other aquatic plants thrive on phosphate so make sure you and your landscaper follow these guidelines.
- Lake treatments help by killing invasive species and overabundant natives. Do your part by raking and removing floating plant fragments from your beaches and shorelines. No treatment is 100% effective. Cut, rake and remove rooted plants that are near your swim area, dock and boat lifts.
- Do not dispose of dead fish or unused fish bait in the lake. Bag, seal and place in your trash receptacle.
- In the fall, it is very important to remove dead leaves from your swimming area and waterfront. This debris is the leading contaminant of our waters and highest contributor to muck and silt.

Boating on Lake Lancelot and Lake Lancer

Operating Regulations & Rules of the Road

Safety is the primary consideration to having a safe and enjoyable outing. The excitement, fun and the thrills come in at a distant second. Enjoy our lakes!

1. Township ordinance prescribes slow/no wake speeds between the hours of 7:30 pm to 11:00 am daily.
2. A person shall not operate a Personal Watercraft (PWC) during the period that begins one (1) hour before sunset and ends at 8:00 am.
3. No skiing, tubing, or towing without an observer.
4. Do not operate your boat or PWC within 100 feet of stationary objects, docks, swimming areas, shorelines or anchored boats unless operating of slow/no wake speeds.
5. Operate your watercraft in a counterclockwise fashion for all water activities.
6. Observe all slow/no wake signs.
7. Do not operate your boat if you have been drinking.
8. Racing is prohibited.
9. Non-motorized craft (sailboats, rowboats, canoes, etc.) have the right-of-way over motorboats.
10. Any boat being overtaken has the right-of-way.
11. Personal Watercraft must obey the same rules as other boats.
12. A PWC shall not cross a wake closer than 150 feet from the boat making the wake.
13. No boat shall operate without proper lighting between sunset and sunrise.
14. Riding on the bow is illegal if the vessel is not equipped with bow seating and is operating of greater than slow/no wake speed, it is illegal to ride on the gunwale.
15. Persons born after December 31, 1978, may not operate a PWC, unless they have obtained a boating safety certificate.

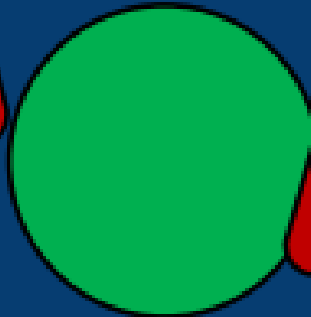

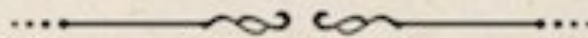

Hello Sugar Springs Members.

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the course during the month of July, and had a safe and happy holiday over the 4th.

We were fortunate to get much more rain this month compared to June, which has helped to alleviate much of our dry areas on the course. That along with our irrigation pump being repaired will help to maintain our green course throughout the season barring any other irrigation related malfunctions.

This month we hosted multiple scrambles including our 2 person team "Best Ball" tournament and even a new "Fun Flag" tournament that looked to be a interesting new format. On July, 29th and 30th, we will be having our handicap championship as well.

This Monday, July 22nd, we vertical cut and top dressed our greens. This process helps to keep our greens rolling smooth and true. Verticutting greens reduces the thatch layer on the green, allowing for better moisture transfer from the surface to the root zone. The sand topdressing applied after helps to maintain a firm putting surface, while still allowing the water to move through the sand layer. This process also helps to heal up any ball marks or scarred areas on the greens. This is one of the many maintenance practices done to our greens that helps keep them rolling at a good speed, so we try to do this process every 4-6 weeks if weather and scheduling allows. After verticutting it will take a week to a week and a half to heal up and get the greens back to a quality putting surface.

As the season has progressed I have noticed members making more of an effort to find and repair their ball marks on the greens. We have also noticed the use of the sand containers on the carts to fix your divots in the fairways.

Myself and the rest of the Golf Course maintenance staff appreciate the help from you to keep our course as nice as we can.

Thank you, and I hope you all continue to play and enjoy our wonderful golf course at Sugar Springs.

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

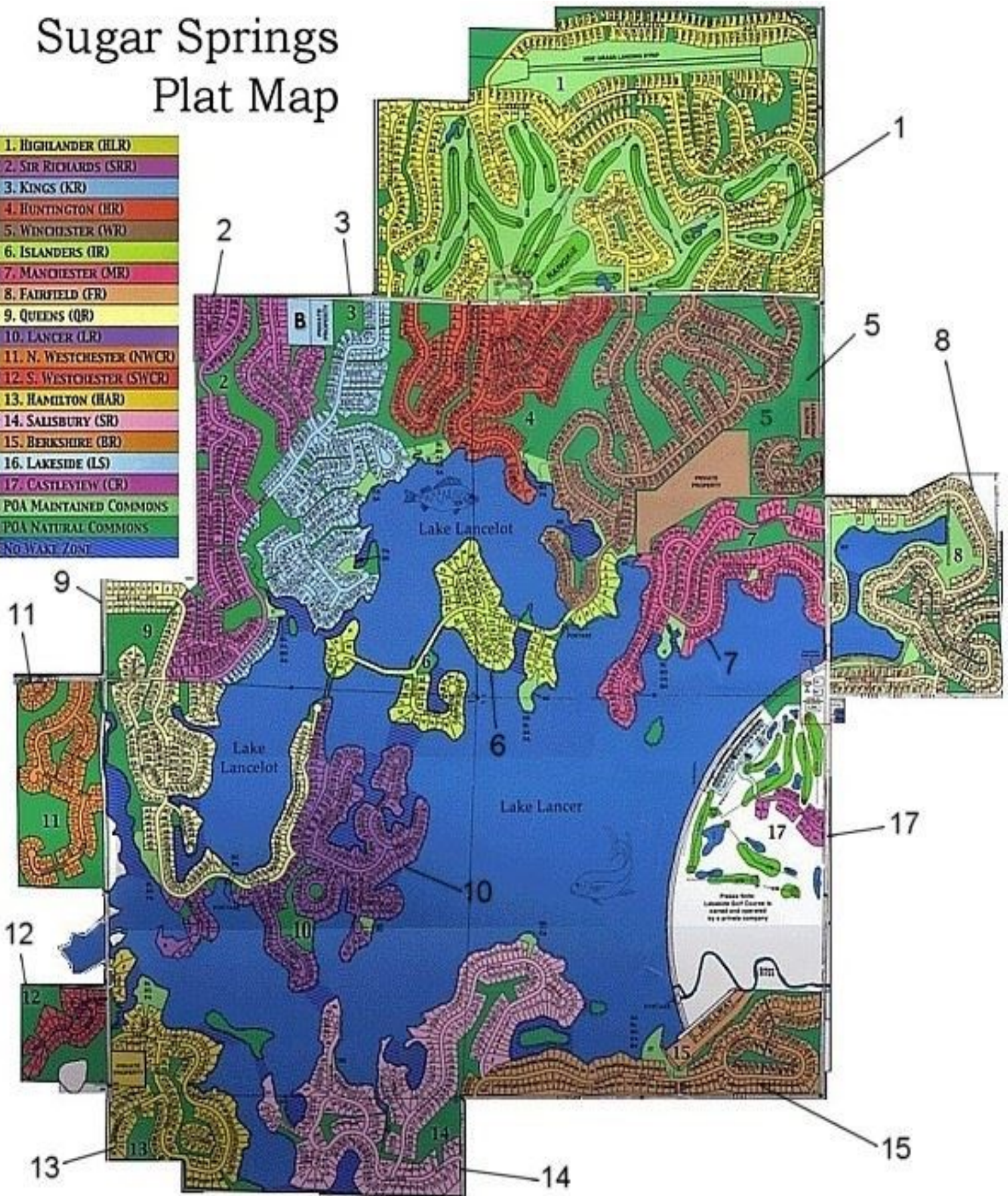
