LAKES COMMITTEE: (Bd Rep: E. Kaltz)

Chairperson, Mario Laudicina, submitted a report prior to this meeting. The committee meets April through October, the 2nd Thursday of the month at 2:00 p.m. at the Activity Center. All members are welcome. They attended all events during the year and shared information on fish species and weed control on the lakes. This focus was well received by all attendees. Due to the lack of certified trainers the Boat Safety Class was not held. We have been able to donate Pike to the Ark (wildlife rehab center) which is much appreciated. PLM, our water treatment company, has done an admirable job in controlling both native and invasive species of plant material. Treatments continue during this season. Milfoil was heavy in Lake Lancer and treated appropriately. Lake Lancelot treatment for Milfoil has been very successful. Water testing for E.coli has been accomplished all summer. We have been able to supply the Lake Authority Board with reports and figures they require for their research. The next meeting is October 4 and we will attend. We anticipate being involved with the Pike Derby during the winter months and will apply for a DNR permit for a Goose Round-up. No Wake signs are being monitored.

RECREATION COMMITTEE: (Bd Rep: J. Jucewicz)

All camping lots **must** have all campers and storage units removed from your lot by November 30, 2024. 

Only certain items may be left on your lot over the winter, utility equipment, well house, one (1) swing set, (1) picnic table, ground level deck (no railing) and a dock or boat hoist for lake front homes.

Hello Sugar Springers ~

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the many of you for the cards, thoughts, prayers and encouragement during my recuperation from a serious auto accident this past July. It's great to be back in the saddle!

This month's communication will focus on a few pertinent reminders as well as regulations and policies of the SS Property Owner Association.

Election season is over and just a reminder to dispose of any remaining political signs that might still be displayed.

With hunting season in full swing and as clarification regarding what is or is not allowed in Sugar Springs, I direct your attention to the Regulations and Policies of the Sugar Springs Property Owners Association, specifically, Sugar Springs Hunting Regulations which states:

"There shall be no hunting, including bow & arrow, on the properties of the Association or upon such premises as the Association may be able to or empowered to regulate or control, Approved by the Board of Directors on April 11, 1979.

This section clearly states that any hunting either on private or commons property within Sugar Springs – is prohibited.

As the 2024 camping season comes to a close, please be aware of the Sugar Springs Regulations for camping which states:

The camping season runs from the first Saturday in April through November 30th of each year.

During the off season from December 1st through the first Saturday of April each year, "the camping unit must be removed from the members' lot."

All items on the lot not stored in an approved well house and not subject to a variance, must be removed from the lot at the end of the camping season.

For those homeowners who plan to be away from our community during the winter months, please do not announce your departure via social media. We're happy you can enjoy the sunshine of a warmer climate, and we also want to ensure your home in Sugar Springs remains secure.

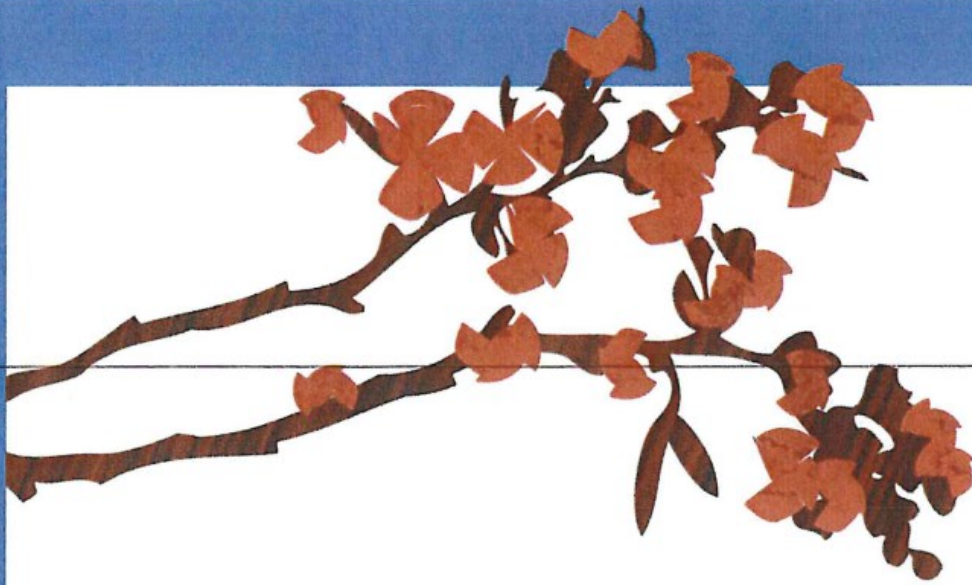

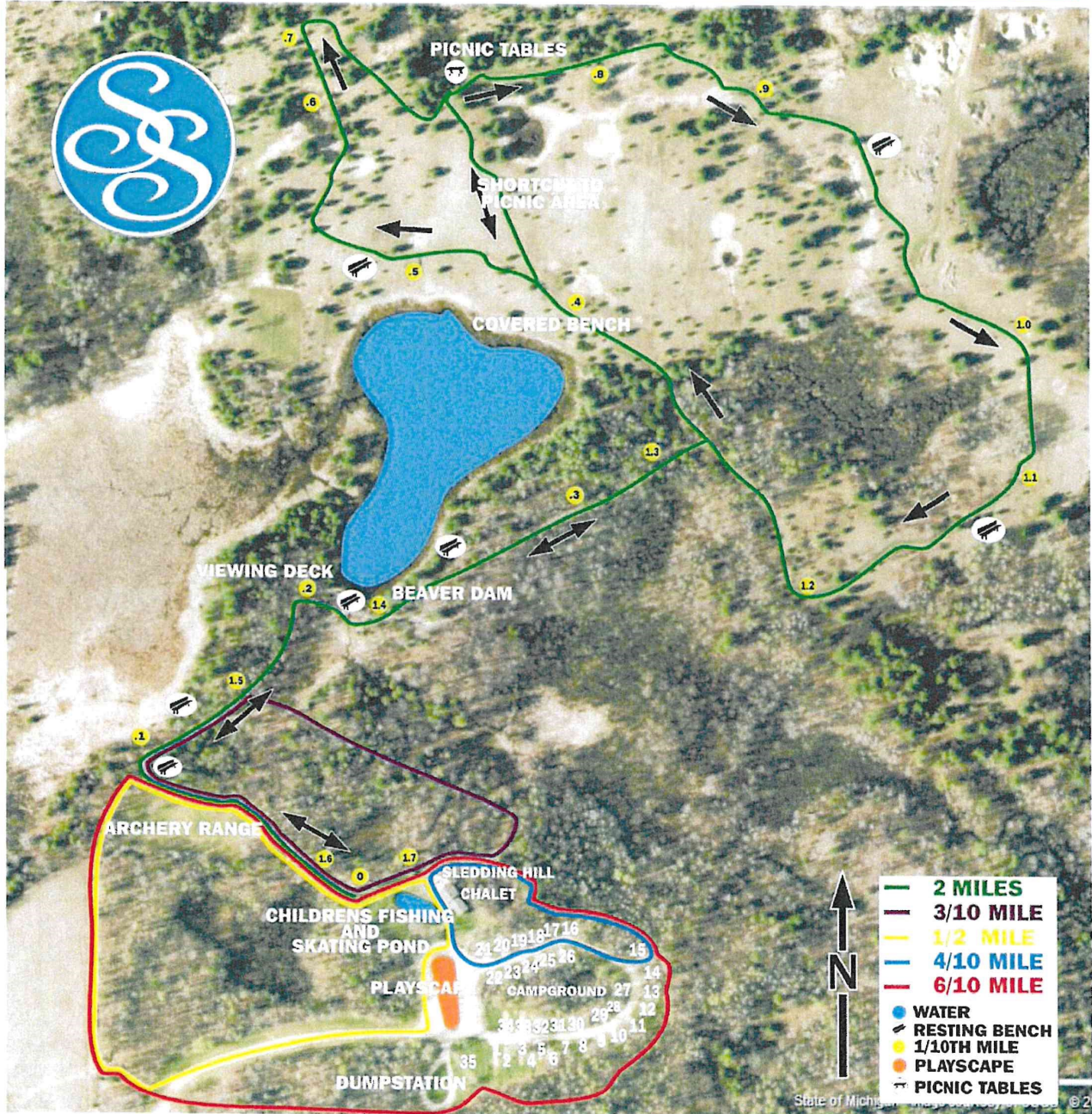

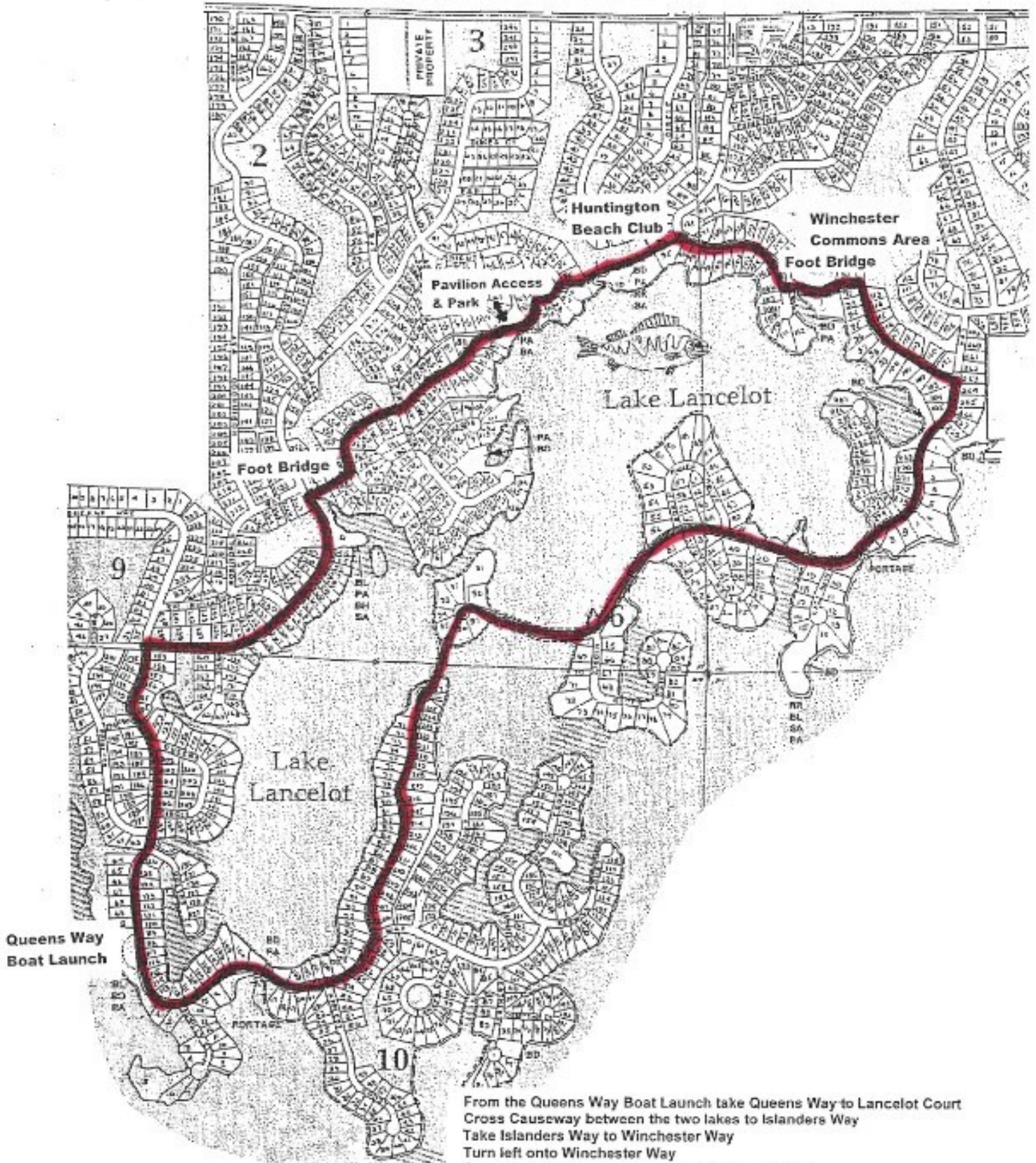

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

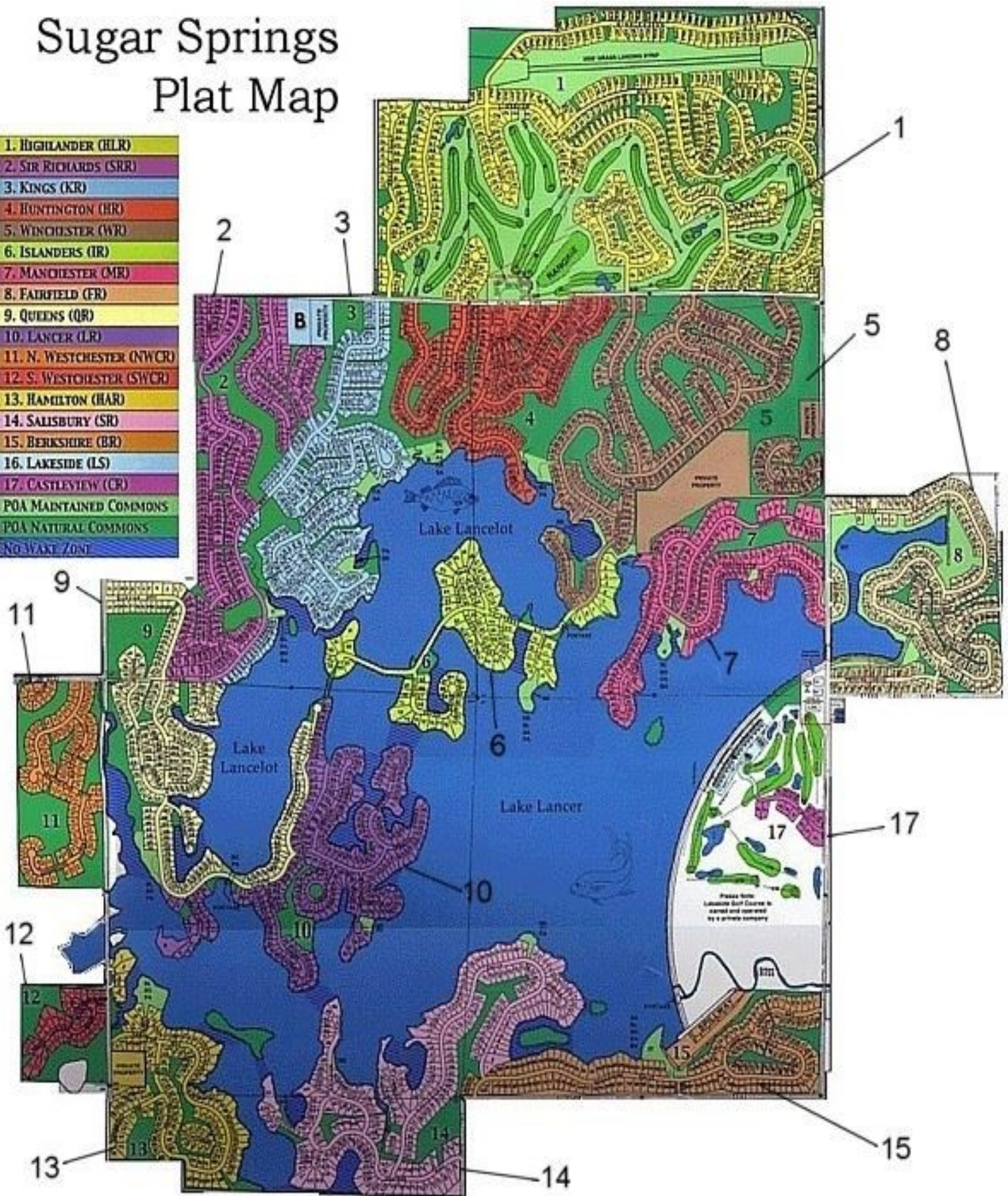
You can start from anywhere from the directions below. Parking is available at the Queens Way Boat Launch, Huntington Beach Club & Winchester Commons Area.

Turn left onto Winchester Way
Go to the Winchester Commons Area (on the left)
Cross over the Footbridge to Huntington Way
Follow Huntington Way to the Huntington Beach Club
Follow path through Commons to Knights Circle to the left
Follow the Access to the Pavilion
Follow commons to King Arthurs Court, then to King Henry Circle
Cross over Footbridge to Kings Way

Veterans Memorial Garden

In the spring of 2021, Sugar Springs was successful in establishing a garden plot surrounding the flag poles erected across from the Activity Center. We were able to accomplish this due to the leadership of our POA President, Tom Hug, and through the efforts of our Building And Grounds Department, under the guidance of David Harris, our POA General Manager. This garden plot was dedicated to the men and women of Sugar Spring who served in the US military.

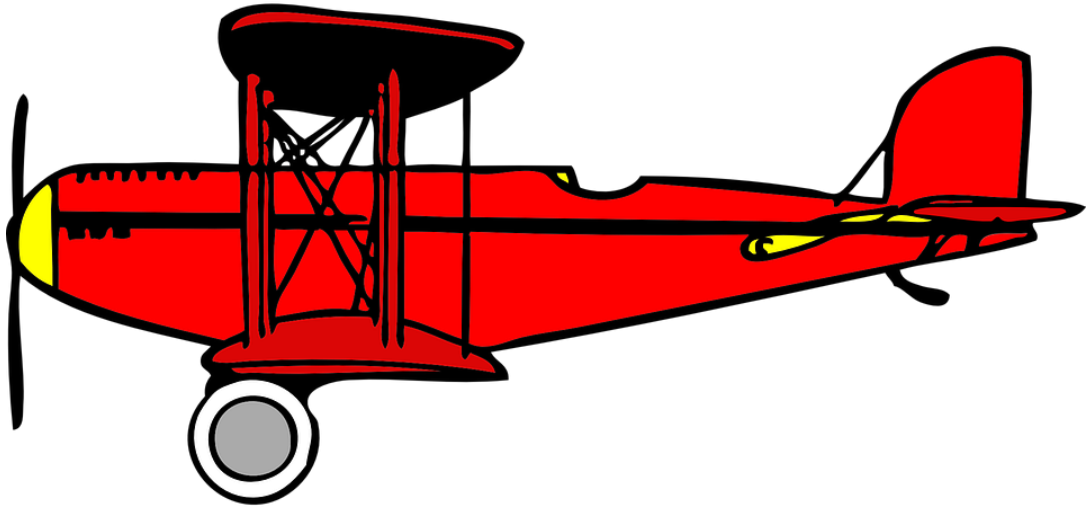


