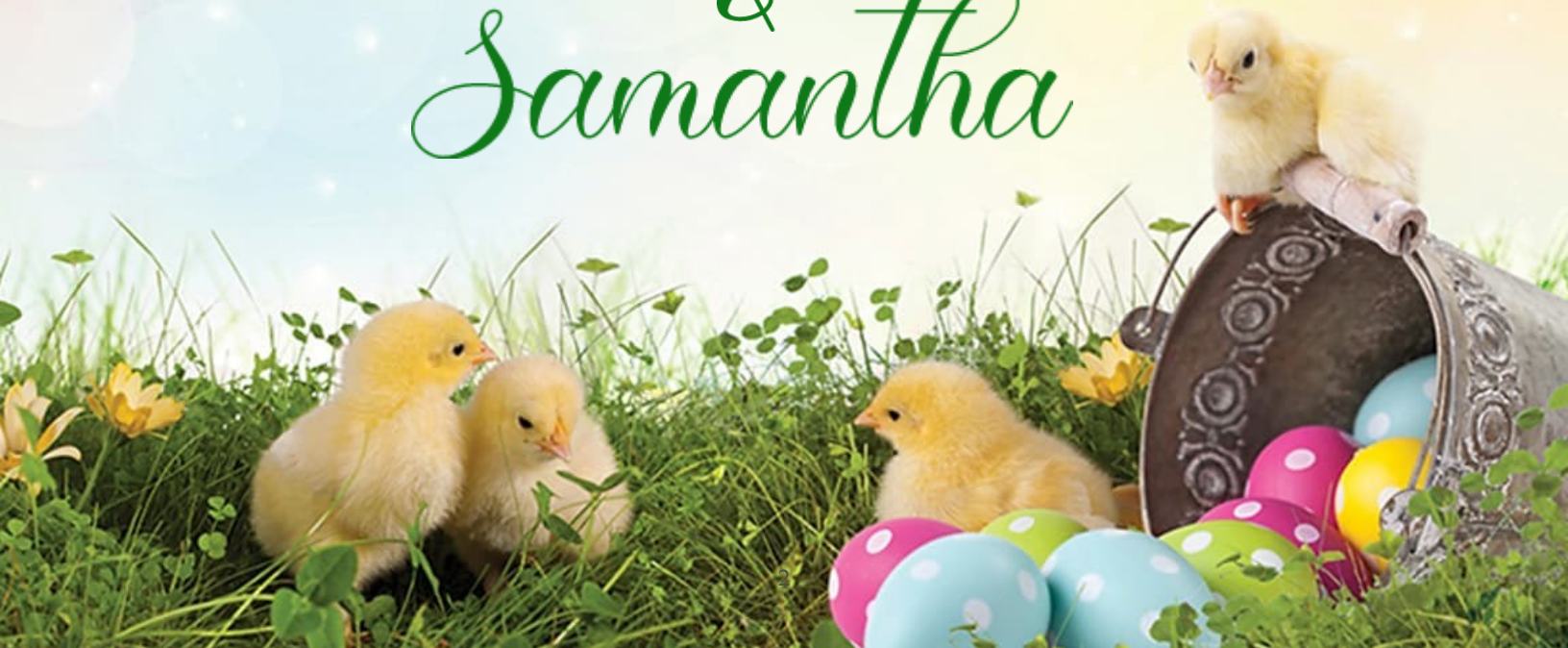

OUR NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH VOLUNTEERS!



Sincere thanks to all the members of the Neighborhood Watch Program.

Paul Coon, the Sugar Springs Safety and Security “guy in the marked vehicle” joined the Sugar Springs staff early in 2023. Soon after he implemented a ‘Neighborhood Watch Program – one of the oldest and most effective crime prevention programs that exist.

Paul asked for volunteers and over twenty-five members attended the initial meeting, were background checked and have been active in following through the program with watchful eyes ever since. Now over 50 volunteers work within their preferred realm at varying times, days and evenings that meet their individual schedules. Vehicles have an identifying sign on their cars. Those that prefer walking or bike riding their area are not as easy to recognize, but nevertheless are aware of the surroundings.

The Gladwin County Sheriff, Mike Shea, and his staff fully support, appreciate and encourage this program in Sugar Springs and have visited the meetings on various occasions. If an activity or threat to our properties is recognized, a written incident report and/or a phone call is presented for further evaluation.

Earlier this Winter and during nighttime hours, an incident occurred in one of the southern realms whereby an individual travelling over the course of approximately two miles left footprints in the snow. The individual entered several unmarked cars removing a purse, money and some tools. The authorities continue to investigate the situation.

You are reminded to lock cars, remove valuables from easy access areas, secure doors and windows, use timer lights and let a reliable neighbor know when you will be away for any length of time. Do not post on social media your absence from home!

A recent meeting with volunteers and Paul Coon had Sheriff Shea speaking on scams. If you become a victim or feel you are being “set up” definitely let the Sheriff’s office know. Safety on our roads is another concern. The roads in Sugar Springs are posted with 25 mph speed limits. Please obey. The Neighborhood Watch volunteers were thanked for their time in helping to keep the area safe and secure. A high five to all of you!



GENERAL MANAGERS REPORT

The snow has melted, temperatures are rising and spring is definitely in the air. With that, it is a good time to welcome back the membership that are not here year round. With more people arriving in the next couple of month, our wonderful community will finally awaken from its winter slumber.

On April 5th, the camping season will officially begin. Campers, please remember to register at the POA office and get your camping stickers for the year. Also, please be cognizant that the early spring weather can allow for soft and muddy ground conditions. Keep those conditions in mind when you are deciding when to put your camper on your lot.

The golf course is also getting very close to opening for the season. It should be opened within the first week or two of April. The opening is always dependent on the weather and the ground conditions. With our heavy clay soil, it takes longer in the spring for the ground to dry out.

In the next month, our beach clubs and bathhouses will be opening for the year. The exact date is dependent on temperatures being above freezing and the frost is out of the ground. Also, by May 1st, the rental boat docks will be put back in the water and before long our lakes will come alive with watersport activity.

We have made some improvements at the restaurant. The walls were painted nicely, creating a more uniform color and pleasing look. There are also new sharp looking tabletops in the dining room. We have also added a small manager's office in the library area that will help with organization and efficiency. Finally, in the next month or so, the new updated menu will be coming out in a more readable format.

Once again, welcome back to those returning for the coming seasons and thank you to those who been with us throughout the winter.

At 10:00 a.m., the March 15, 2025 Sugar Springs Property Owners Association (SSPOA) Board of Directors meeting was called to order by President, Tom Hug at the SSPOA Activity Center.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, President Hug opened the meeting with the Regular Order of Business pursuant to the Agenda.

TREASURER'S AND GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT:

Matt Schindler, Treasurer and General Manager presented his report as follows:

"Beginning with the financials through February – the first two months our total revenue is \$1,525,000 with expenses totaling \$611,000 providing an early net income of \$914,000. A few of the early highlights are:

The restaurant sales for the first two months are just over \$95,000 which is over \$13,000 more than the same period last year. That was driven by a strong January which was impressive considering the winter weather was much worse than the mild winter of 2024.

Early golf revenue is currently up over \$7,000 from last year. This is due to approximately eight more people buying their memberships early. The Pool and Fitness center revenue is also up over \$4,000 compared to last year. One area that is behind is the first two months of assessment collections. To get a true feel of where assessments stand is that you need to at least get through March as some members wait to pay then before interest starts accruing.

In other areas; we just completed some improvements to the restaurant. We built a small manager's office in the former library area. This will help with efficiency and allow privacy for meetings that need to take place. We have painted most of the restaurant which now provides a uniform color and a pleasing aesthetic. We also purchased and installed new tabletops in the dining area. The new more easily readable menu will most likely be out in the next month or so.

A couple of weeks ago marked the due date for the annual assessments. Unfortunately, again this year we had to remove some members' boat docks from their accounts because payments were not received by the March 1st deadline. To be fair to everyone, there are no exceptions to this hard and true deadline. We cannot be put in the situation to have to pick and choose whose reason or explanation for not getting their payment in on time would validate an exception. Letting some slide also would not be fair to those who have patiently waited for their turn to come up on the waiting list because there would be fewer opportunities for those people. If you want to keep your dock, it is of the utmost importance to ensure that we receive your payment on time.

With the warmer weather and spring approaching, things will start opening up for the season. Tentatively, the golf course is planning to open on April 1st, weather permitting. April 5th is the start of the camping season. There are no exceptions allowing for an earlier date to put your camper on your lot. The beach clubs, bathhouses and halfway houses on the golf course will open once the weather is warm enough and the frost is out of the ground. Boat docks will be dropped by May 1st. With everything starting to awaken for the year I hope everyone has another great year in Sugar Springs.

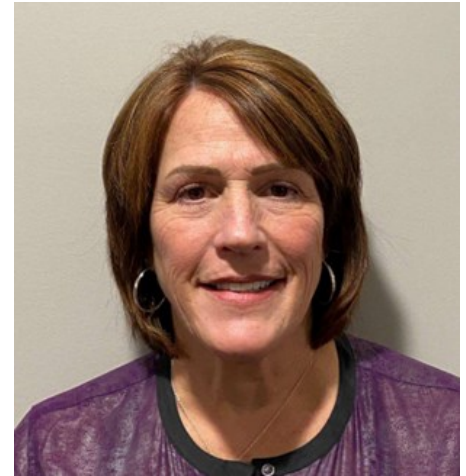

from the
SS A & E Committee

Construction Permits are required for the following - ** Failure to acquire a SS Construction Permit may result in a \$250 violation fine

Anything that modifies or adds to a home or lot requires a permit. Here are some of the common examples:

- New Home
- Garage/Carport/House Addition
- Outbuilding
- Lot Modification, Beach work (DEQ Permit also required)
- Dock and/or Hoist: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line
- Setback Variance Request
- Deck, Dog Pen, Gazebo
- Siding/Roofing: No charge, must provide proposed colors for approval
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter

Anything that modifies or adds to the property requires a permit for Lots with Campers. Here are some of the common examples:

- Camping pad: Placement - no closer than 10' from any side property line, 75' from the normal high water lines of the lake and 35' from any street line (this is 68' from the center line of the road). Permanent camping pads and/or driveways are prohibited (i.e. asphalt paving, concrete paving, etc.).
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter
- Well House: Cannot exceed 6' long, 5' wide, and 5' high at the roof peak
- Decks: Ground level deck with no railing
- Docks: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line

** For questions you can find additional information on SS Rules and Regulations see the Sugar Springs Construction Pamphlet, Sugar Springs Regulations & Policies, SS Covenants, and SS Bylaws or contact the Sugar Springs A&E Committee.

These documents can be acquired from the Sugar Springs web site or POA Office.

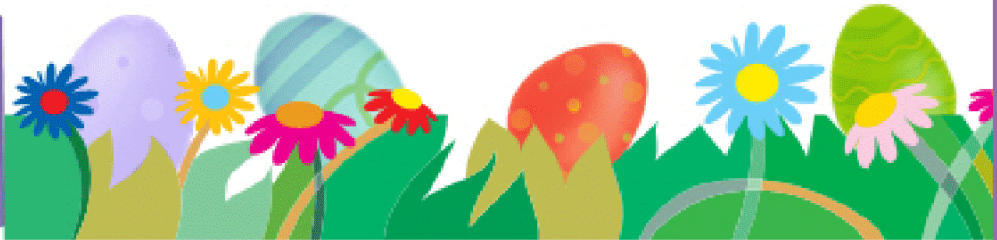

Hello Sugar Springs members.

Due to our fairly mild winter, with the lessor amounts of lasting snow accumulation, the golf course had very little damage from winter stress, and overall the turf looks to be in a good spot to create a great summer playing conditions.

Over the next month, as overnight freezing temperatures go away and the course dries out enough to open, we will be getting the course ready for the season to kick off.

Because of the warming spring temperatures, the grass is going to start to grow and produce seedhead and broad leaf. There will be two spray applications done during this time to alleviate seedhead production on greens, tees, and fairways in the spring. This will keep the greens smooth and true during seedhead production, and lessen the effects of seedhead production on the fairways and tee boxes.

As summer approaches, soil temperatures will be on the rise. This will cause crabgrass to start to germinate and broad leaf weeds such as dandelion and clover will start to show. Treatment for crabgrass is mixed in with our fairway fertilizers, which will be applied later in April to early May based on the conditions that arise over the month. For weeds in the rough area, they will be treated with spray applications over the first few weeks of May, outside of golf play hours.

Hopefully, Mother Nature, is kind to us in April so the course can continue to dry out and we can open the course without being cart path only. With plenty more warm days ahead this spring, I am excited to get the 2025 season under way.

Good luck to all golfers this season.

Lady golfers, if you are NOT considering purchasing a prepaid golf membership, please take the following information into account.

- The cost for a POA member prepaid golf membership is \$1,140.
- The Pay as You Go cost for a 9 hole round of golf is \$32.
- The amount of 9 hole rounds played to break even is 36.

There are 15 weeks of league, approximately 20 weeks of 9 & Dine and 15 tournaments. If you play in the 9 hole league and play in only half of the 9 & Dine and half of the tournaments, your Pay as You Go cost would be \$1,056. Then if you play only 3 more rounds with your spouse or friends, your prepaid membership will have paid for itself.

If you are an 18 hole league golfer, you only need to play 26 rounds to break even if you purchase a prepaid golf membership. The Pay as You Go cost for 18 holes as a POA member is \$45/round. With the 15 weeks of league, you would only need to play an additional 11 rounds the rest of the season.

If you're like me and play in most of the 9 & Dine's and tournaments, you really make use of that prepaid membership! It's a great deal that I hope you will consider and take advantage of.

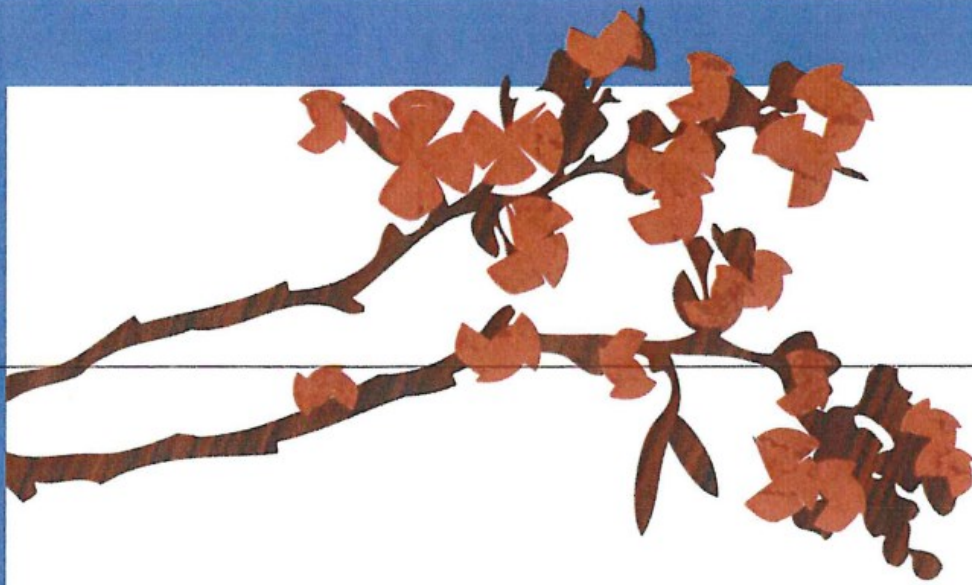

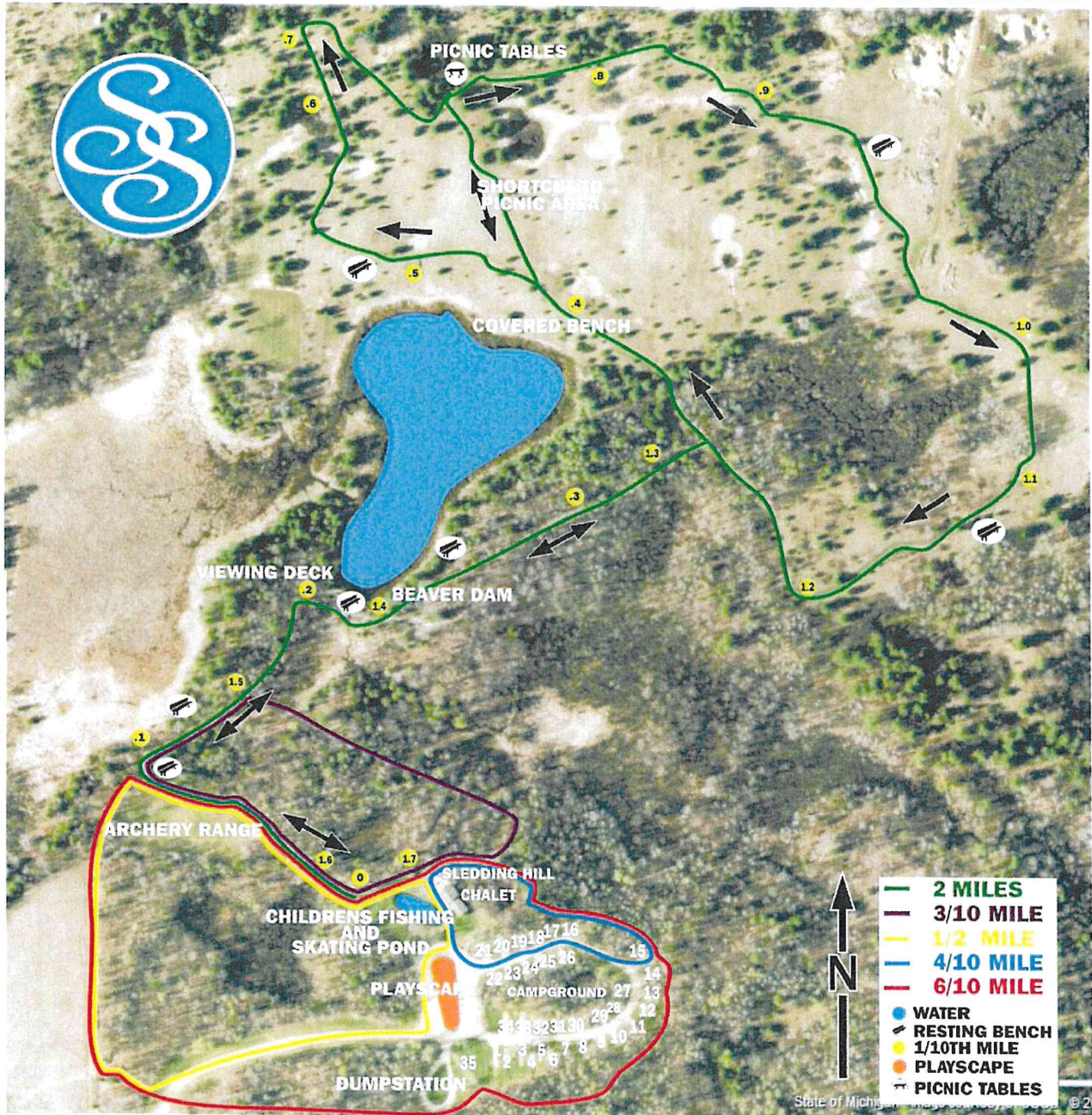

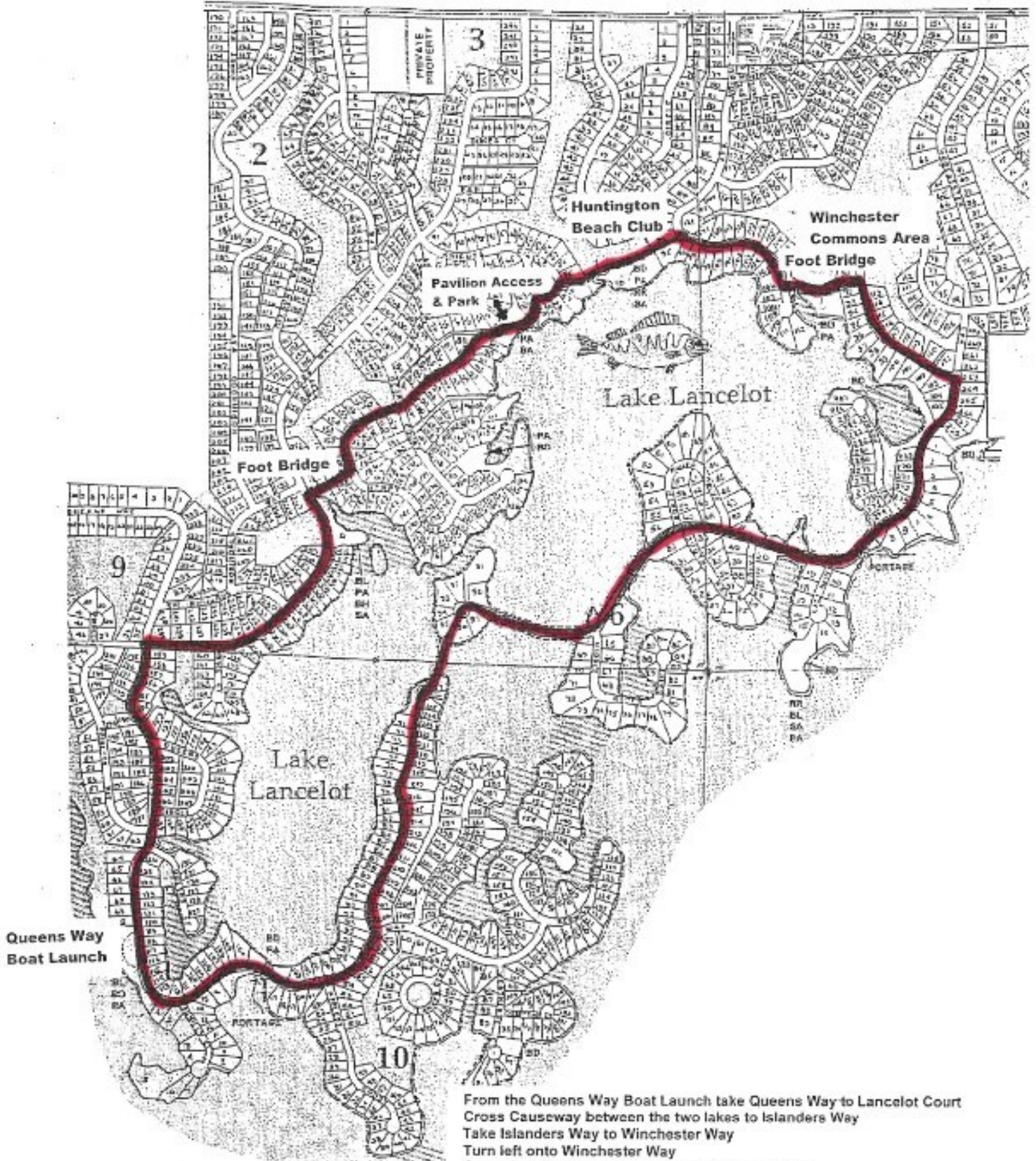

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

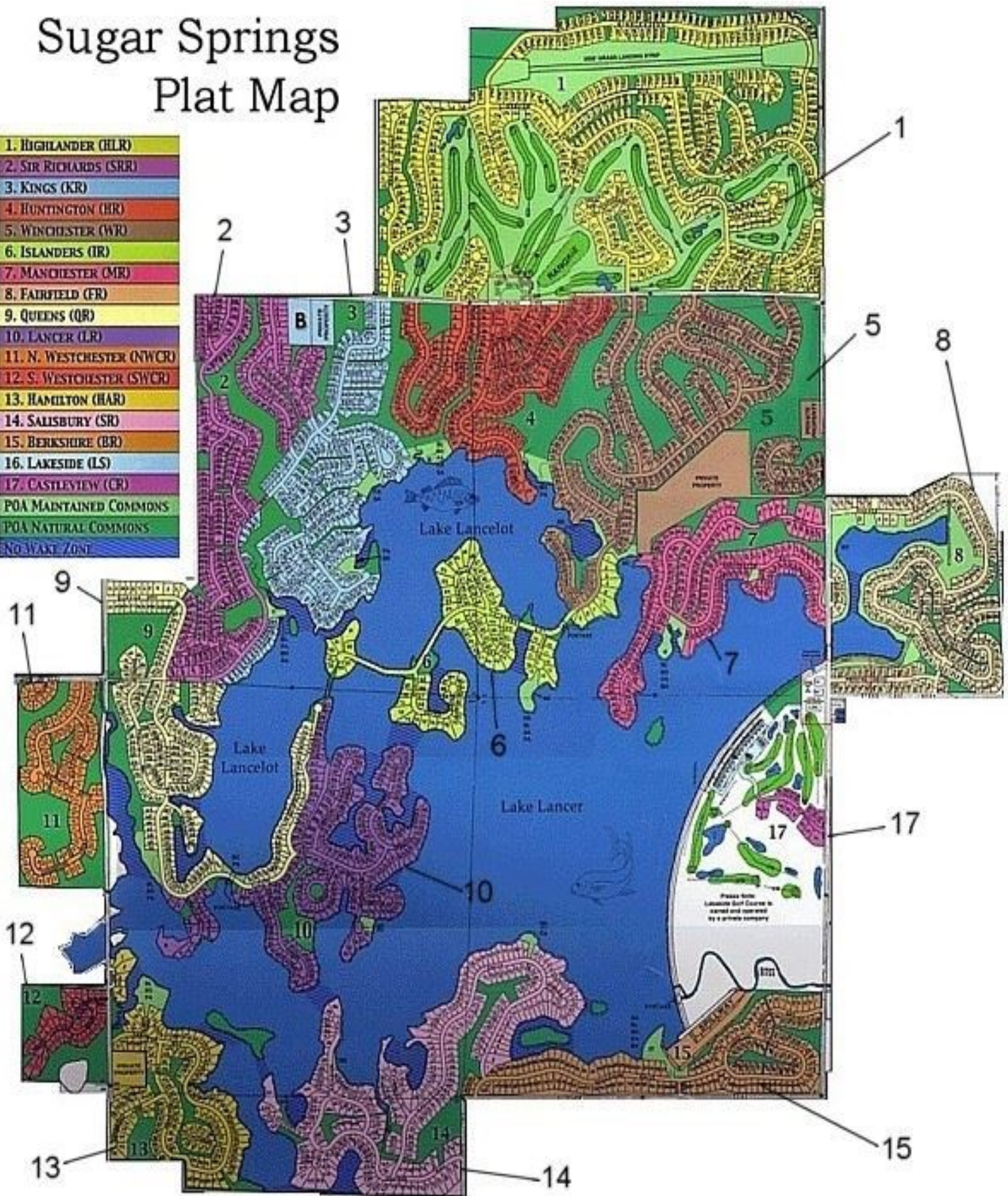



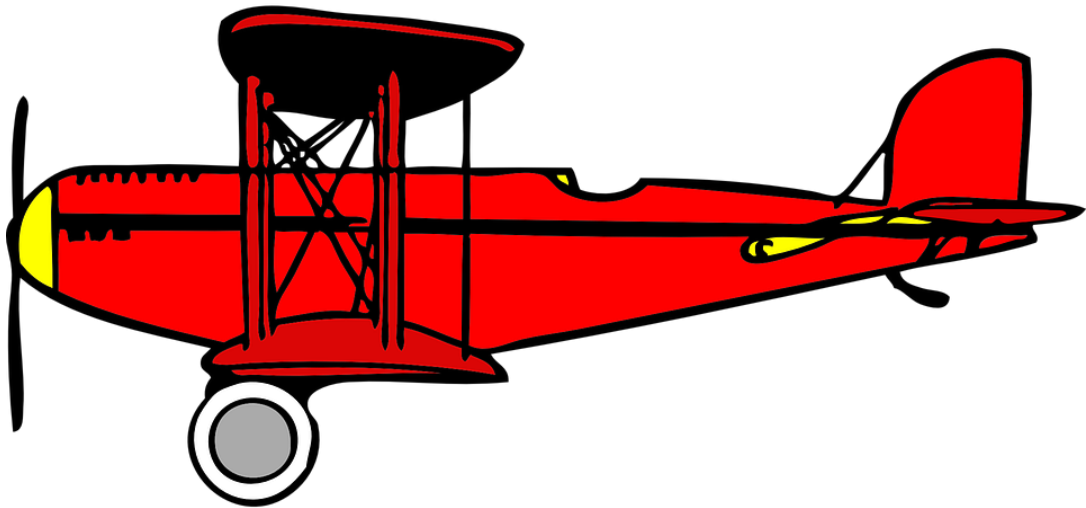
Veterans Memorial Garden


