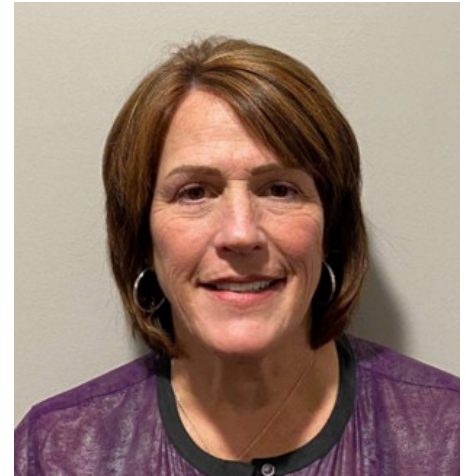

from the
SS A & E Committee

Construction Permits are required for the following - ** Failure to acquire a SS Construction Permit may result in a \$250 violation fine

Anything that modifies or adds to a home or lot requires a permit. Here are some of the common examples:

- New Home
- Garage/Carport/House Addition
- Outbuilding
- Lot Modification, Beach work (DEQ Permit also required)
- Dock and/or Hoist: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line
- Setback Variance Request
- Deck, Dog Pen, Gazebo
- Siding/Roofing: No charge, must provide proposed colors for approval
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter

Anything that modifies or adds to the property requires a permit for Lots with Campers. Here are some of the common examples:

- Camping pad: Placement - no closer than 10' from any side property line, 75' from the normal high water lines of the lake and 35' from any street line (this is 68' from the center line of the road). Permanent camping pads and/or driveways are prohibited (i.e. asphalt paving, concrete paving, etc.).
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter
- Well House: Cannot exceed 6' long, 5' wide, and 5' high at the roof peak
- Decks: Ground level deck with no railing
- Docks: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line

** For questions you can find additional information on SS Rules and Regulations see the Sugar Springs Construction Pamphlet, Sugar Springs Regulations & Policies, SS Covenants, and SS Bylaws or contact the Sugar Springs A&E Committee.

These documents can be acquired from the Sugar Springs web site or POA Office.

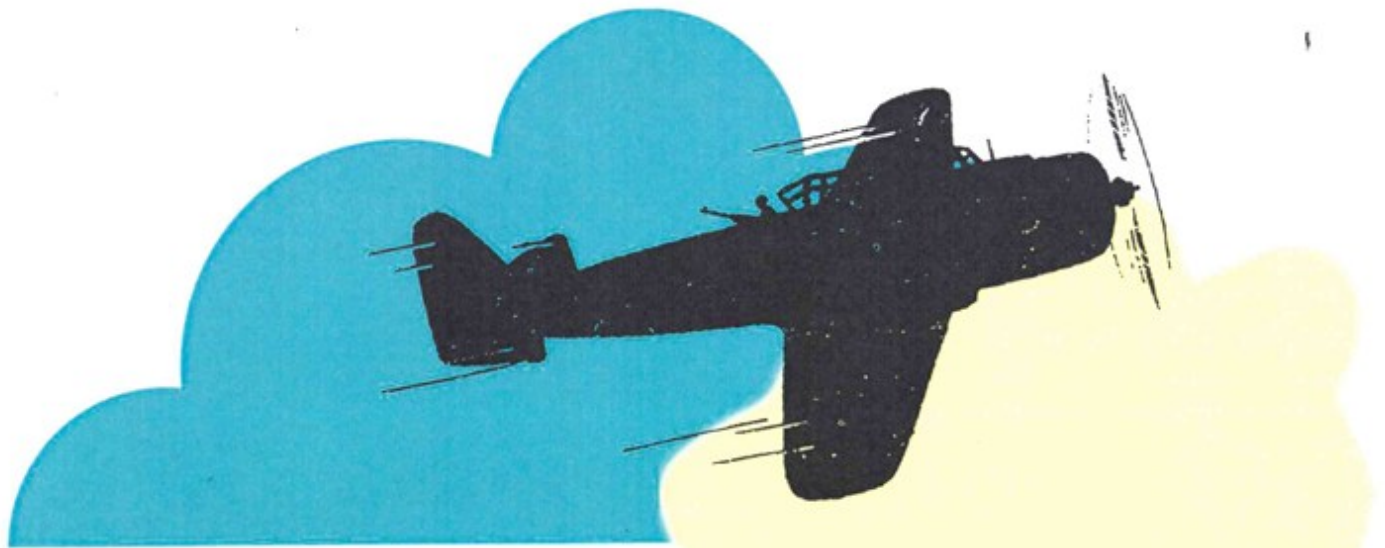

Hello Sugar Springs members.

As you may have heard, we were able to officially open the golf course, Wednesday, April 16th. The course had very little damage from winter stress and the turf looks to be in a good spot for great summer playing conditions.

The combination of warm weather and April showers has allowed for the course to green up nicely these last two weeks of the month.

Over the next month, as overnight freezing temperatures go away, we will be getting out ball washers for all to use and get pond fountains placed early in May.

Due to the warming temperature, the grass is going to start to grow and produce seedhead and broad leaf weeds. There will be two spray applications done during this time to alleviate seedhead on greens, tees and fairways to keep a smooth playing surface. Based on weather predictions my best guess is that the first application will be made on Monday, April 28nd and the second will be made 14-21 days later. This will keep the greens smooth and true during seedhead production, and lessen the effects of seedhead production on the fairways and tee boxes.

As summer approaches, soil temperatures are on the rise. This will cause crabgrass to start to germinate and broad leaf weeds, such as dandelion start to show. Treatment for crabgrass is mixed in with our fairway fertilizers, which will be applied May 12th. For weeds in the rough area, including clover, they will be treated with spray applications over the first two weeks of May, outside of golf play hours.

Hopefully, last week was a small glimpse of what summer will look like and we have many more warm days ahead this spring. I am excited to get 2025 season underway .

Good luck to all golfers this season.

DID YOU KNOW - DRIVING RANGE

Our driving range is busy all season. It's great to see people working on their game as well as so many people just starting to learn how to play the game! With the increase driving range use, there comes some challenges.

The first challenge are divots. We're very fortunate to have an all-grass teeing area as well as a grounds staff does a great job topdressing and filling in all the divots. It's our responsibility as users to make the correct pattern of divots (see the image below). The linear divot pattern involves placing each shot directly behind the previous divot. In so doing, a linear pattern is created and only a small amount of turf is removed with each swing. This can usually be done for 15 to 20 shots before moving sideways to create a new line of divots. So long as a minimum of 4 inches of live turf is preserved between strips of divots, the turf will recover quickly. Because this divot pattern removes the least amount of turf and promotes quick recovery, it is the preferred method.

Our next challenge is already running out of golf balls and range bags. We're not running out because they are being hit faster than we can pick them up. We're running out because they are disappearing. We ask that anyone that purchases range balls, not to leave the course with the range balls (or bag). If you are unable to hit the amount of balls that you purchased, we ask that you return the unhit balls and bag to the golf shop. We will happily give you a credit for your next practice session!

Lady golfers, if you are NOT considering purchasing a prepaid golf membership, please take the following information into account.

- The cost for a POA member prepaid golf membership is \$1,140.
- The Pay as You Go cost for a 9 hole round of golf is \$32.
- The amount of 9 hole rounds played to break even is 36.

There are 15 weeks of league, approximately 20 weeks of 9 & Dine and 15 tournaments. 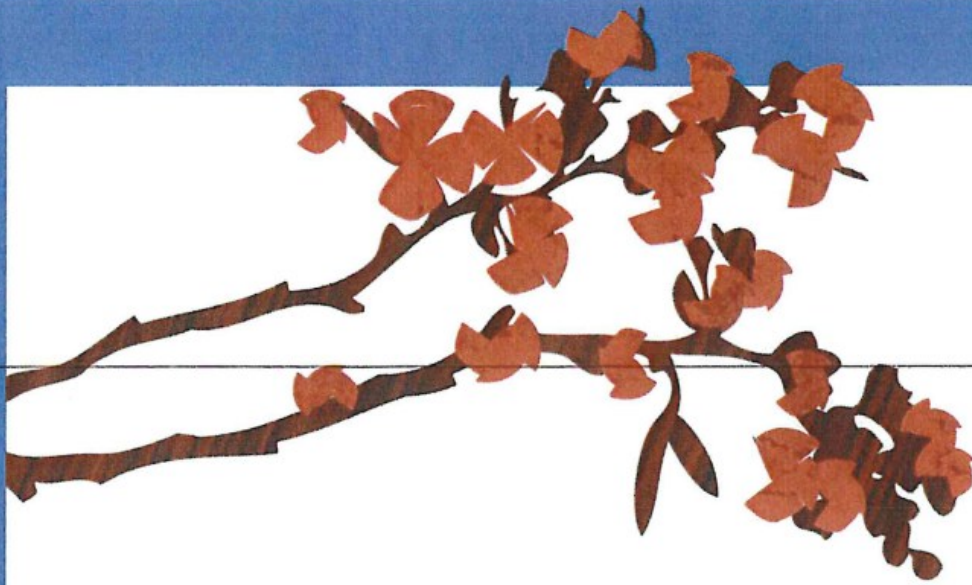

NOTICE Sugar Springs Lakes 2025 Treatment Program

The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE) procedures. Due to the uncertainty of weather, the treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5 x 11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc. One or more treatments involving water restrictive products may be applied. Please be aware that only products approved by the State of Michigan and the Federal government are being used. We have experienced **no adverse effects on people, fish, wildlife or domestic pets since applying these products.** We anticipate using one or more of the products listed. PLM Also Works With Invasive Terrestrial Plants

Phragmites and purple loosestrife are two invasive plants to be on the lookout for. Both Phragmites and purple loosestrife tend to grow near the water's edge and can potentially take over your frontage if something is not done. Phragmites is a grass that can grow very tall up to 13 feet and at very high densities. Once phragmites begins to grow on your lake frontage it can take over lots

of other healthy native emergent plants such as cattails and bulrush. The state of Michigan has seen a rapid

increase in the amount of phragmites throughout the state in the past few years. Purple loosestrife is considered to be an invasive herb and it can grow anywhere from 4-10 feet tall if not addressed. Purple loosestrife is similar to phragmites in the sense that it has the ability to grow at high densities and it also has the ability to out compete native plant populations.

Water Level Fluctuation in our Lakes

Water levels can fluctuate every few years, every year, every month or even every day. There are lots of factors that influence when and how much water levels fluctuate in our lakes, rivers and streams. One of the main things that impact when water levels fluctuate is seasonal changes. Typically water levels increase in the spring and early summer and then decrease in late summer and fall. A few other factors that make water levels rise and fall in our lakes include rainfall, evaporation, and snowmelt. Groundwater levels also play a crucial role, as high groundwater can increase lake levels while low levels can decrease them. It is important to remember that these changes are completely normal and water level fluctuation in our lakes has been happening for many years. Some years lakes will have an overall higher than usual water level while other years they may have an overall lower than usual water level.

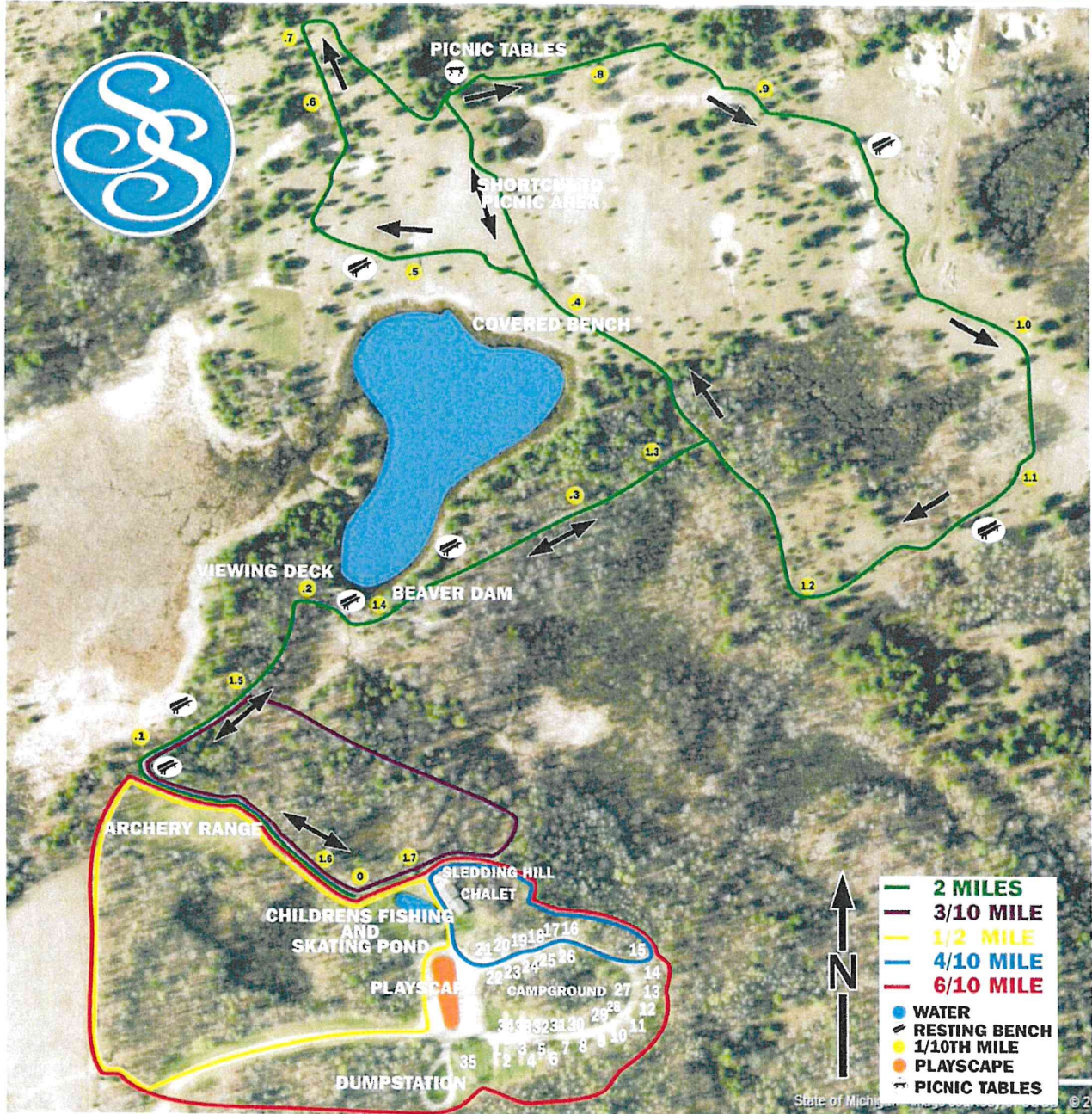
Algae Blooms in Michigan

Algae blooms have become a growing concern of many lake residents. Algae blooms in Michigan are primarily driven by the presence of excess nutrients, especially phosphorus and nitrogen, which come from sources like agricultural runoff, wastewater, and stormwater. These nutrients provide a rich food supply for algae, encouraging rapid growth, especially in warm weather conditions. Algae, which are microscopic plants, naturally thrive in bodies of water, but when the nutrient levels are too high, they can multiply rapidly, leading to blooms. These blooms are more likely to occur in nutrient-rich, shallow lakes and rivers, where the water is warmer and slower-moving. The combination of these factors creates an ideal environment for algae to rapidly multiply. Sometimes these blooms can be harmful. Harmful blooms can deplete oxygen levels in the water and release toxins. These toxins can pose risks to aquatic life. Understanding where the nutrients come from and how they interact with the environment is key to managing algae blooms in Michigan's waters.

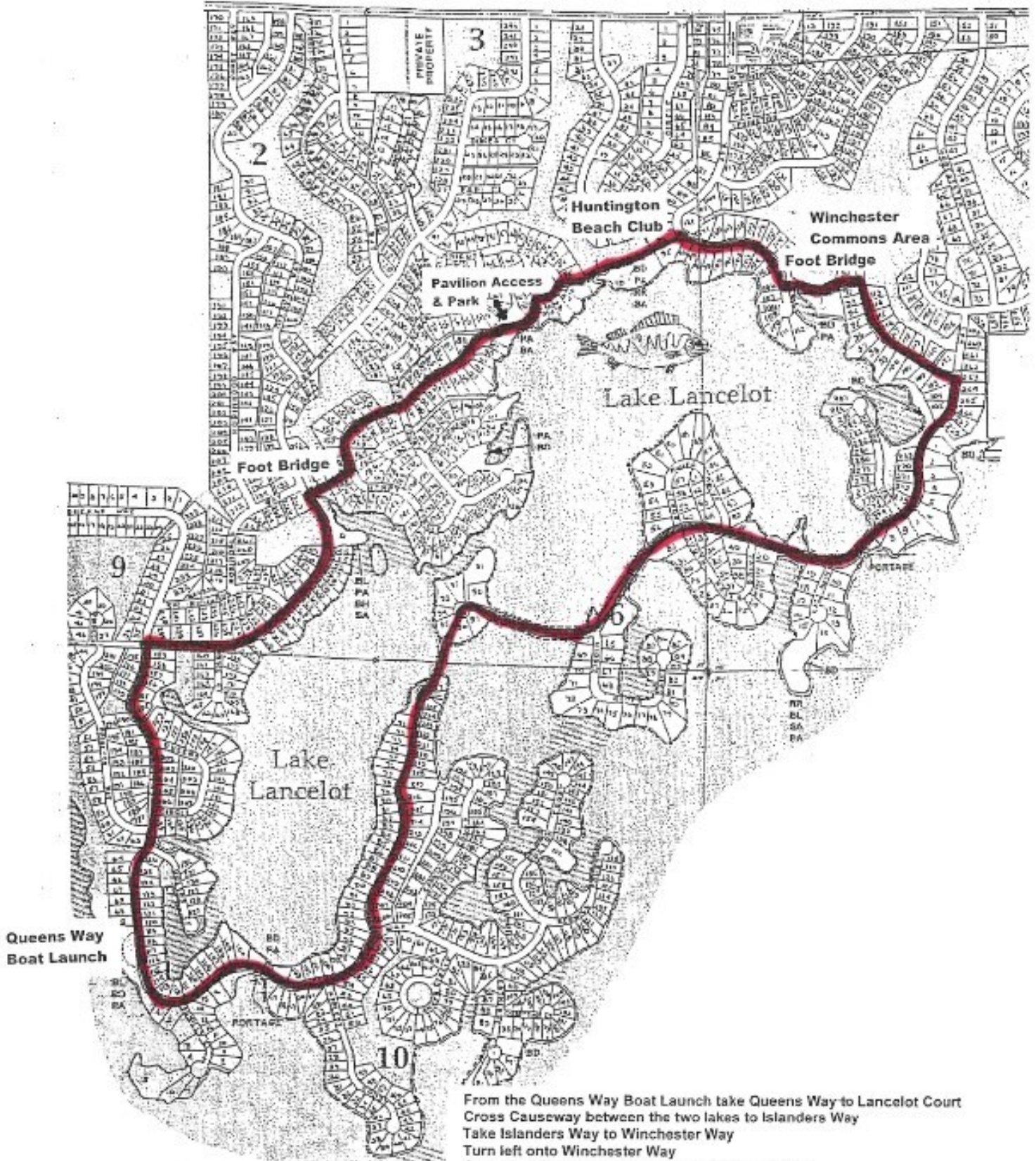

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

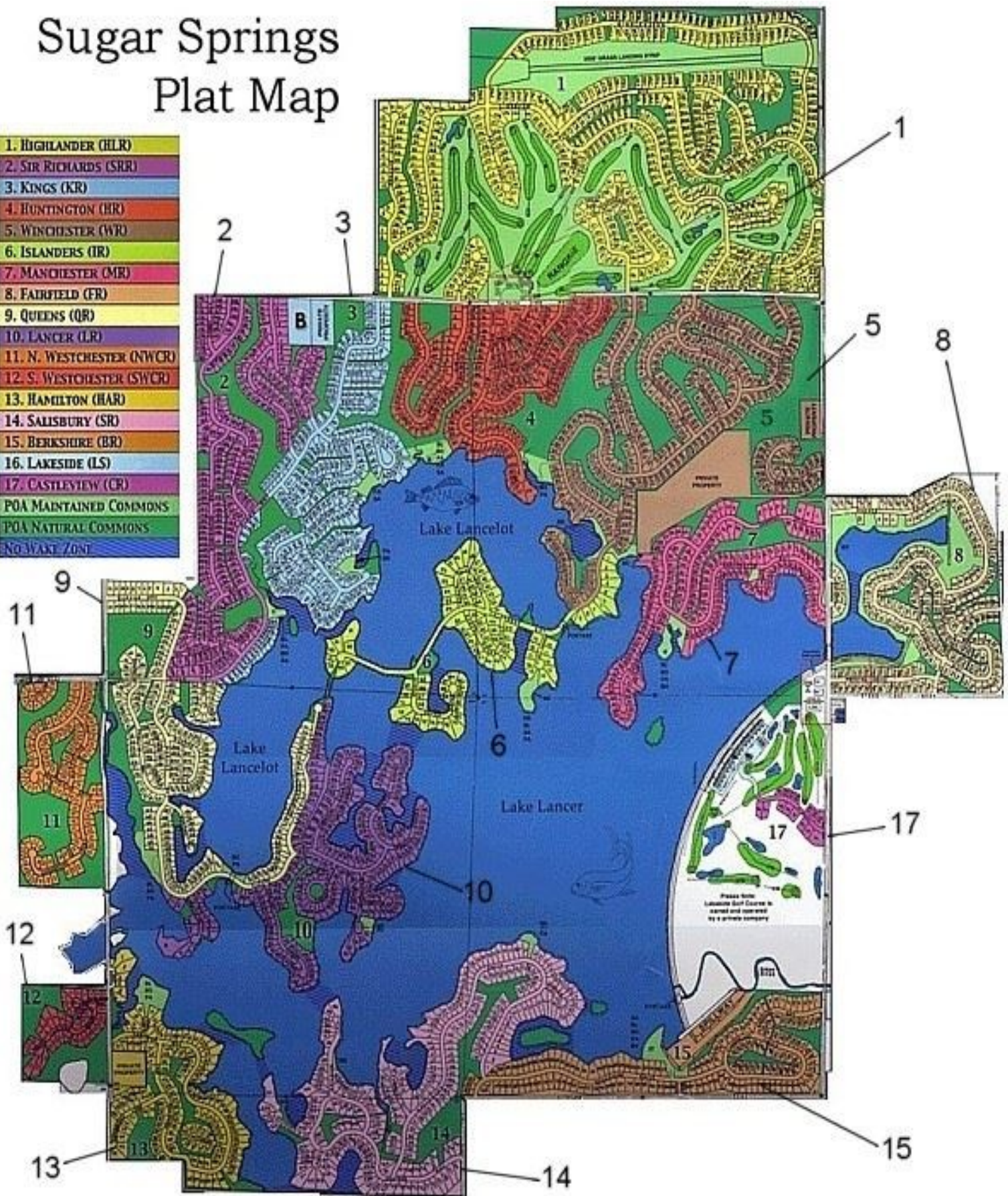
You can start from anywhere from the directions below. Parking is available at the Queens Way Boat Launch, Huntington Beach Club & Winchester Commons Area.

A Short History of Sugar Springs

Farmers, woodsman, and tradesman homesteaded this area starting in the 1800's drawn to the area by the Sugar River. Many English, Dutch, Scotch, German, Swiss and Irish settled in this area. In 1878 the community was named Millsville, and was a community with schools, stores and a post office. Over time, lumber ran out and the town was abandoned. The land was mostly farms until it was purchased and developed by Isaacson & Associates in the 1960's, and in 1972 the first home was built. In 1978, the Sugar Springs Property Owners Association was formed and in 1987 officially took over operations from the developer. The idea of Sugar Springs was designed to be a place that family and friends could escape and enjoy sports, recreational activities and nature. To this day it is still considered "Mid-Michigans best kept Secret!"



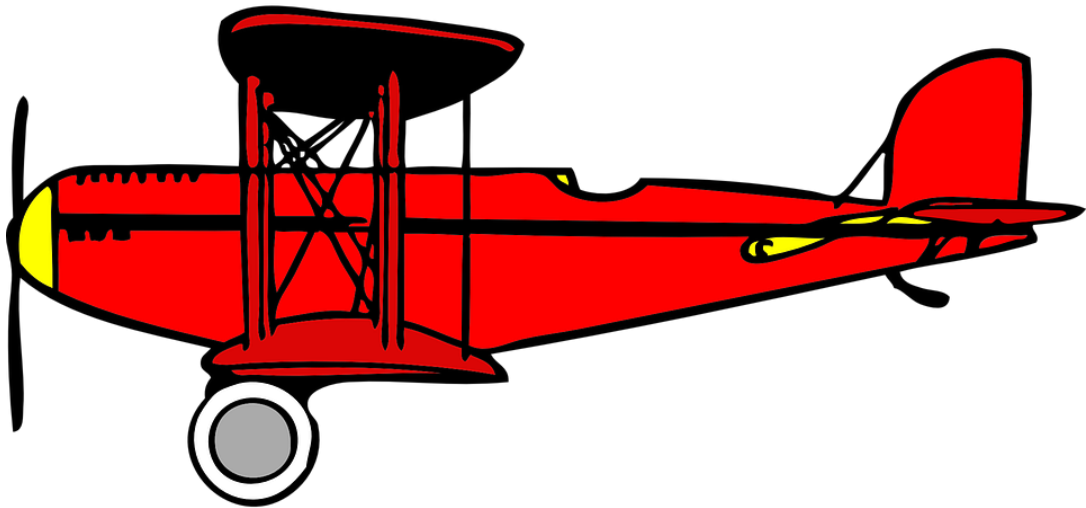
Veterans Memorial Garden
