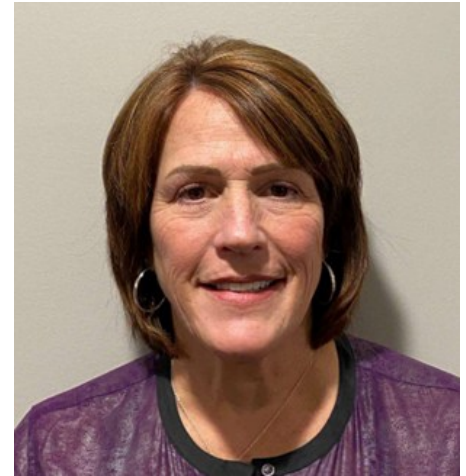

A friendly reminder for Members  
from the  
SS A & E Committee

Construction Permits are required for the following - \*\* Failure to acquire a SS Construction Permit may result in a \$250 violation fine

Anything that modifies or adds to a home or lot requires a permit. Here are some of the common examples:

- New Home
- Garage/Carport/House Addition
- Outbuilding
- Lot Modification, Beach work (DEQ Permit also required)
- Dock and/or Hoist: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line
- Setback Variance Request
- Deck, Dog Pen, Gazebo
- Siding/Roofing: No charge, must provide proposed colors for approval
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter

Anything that modifies or adds to the property requires a permit for Lots with Campers. Here are some of the common examples:

- Camping pad: Placement - no closer than 10' from any side property line, 75' from the normal high water lines of the lake and 35' from any street line (this is 68' from the center line of the road). Permanent camping pads and/or driveways are prohibited (i.e. asphalt paving, concrete paving, etc.).
- Tree removal: Live trees greater than 4" in diameter
- Well House: Cannot exceed 6' long, 5' wide, and 5' high at the roof peak
- Decks: Ground level deck with no railing
- Docks: Must be no more than 4' wide and 20' long and must be placed no less than 10' from side property line

\*\* For questions you can find additional information on SS Rules and Regulations see the Sugar Springs Construction Pamphlet, Sugar Springs Regulations & Policies, SS Covenants, and SS Bylaws or contact the Sugar Springs A&E Committee.

These documents can be acquired from the Sugar Springs web site or POA Office.

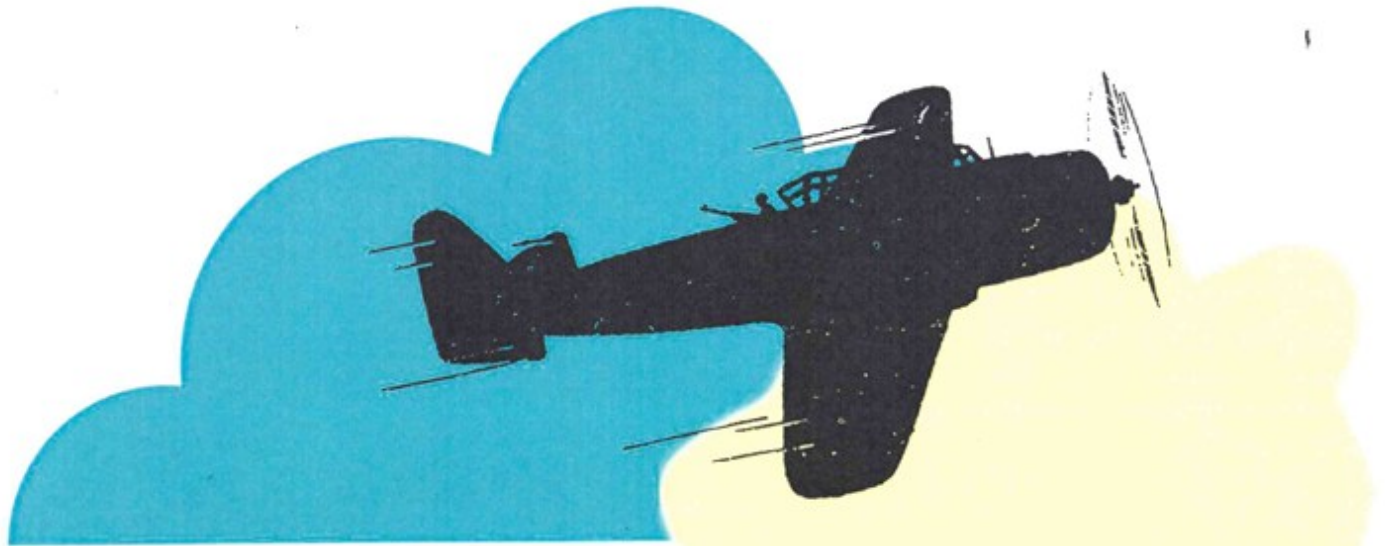

## Hello Sugar Springs members.

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the course during the month of May. This month, leagues have started and we have even hosted a few scramble fundraiser outings, including the Gladwin Chamber of Commerce fundraiser outing. This event has been hosted by Sugar Springs for multiple years in a row now. I have been told by many participants that it is something they look forward to on their calendar every year. Everyone seems to enjoy the course, the Hearth, and the help they get from the Pro Shop staff in setting up the event. Hopefully, they continue to choose Sugar Springs to host for years to come.

With the Chamber being one of the biggest scrambles we host for the spring, it is always my goal to get the course as close as we can to summer playing conditions by then. This year, along with past seasons, it was a challenge to bring the course to the expectations we have for it. Constant heavy rains at the end of April and early May made it so that we could not spray for dandelions as soon as we needed to in order to get the course treated before dandelions started to turn white. With that said, we did finish holes 9–17, 4 days before the Chamber outing. That was enough time for the dandelions to begin to wilt before the Chamber and not make it so difficult to find a white ball in a patch of white dandelions. Next season, the goal is to treat the front 9 holes, and we will alternate applications like that season to season.

Now that we have made it through the wet spring season our goal was to apply fertilizer to greens, tees and fairways. When we apply fertilizer we generally try to do it either before a rain, or water heavy the night after the application. This means we need to have our irrigation system primed and ready to go. The process of getting the system pressured up usually takes 2–3 days.

The summer has been off to a great start. The course has been busy on a daily basis. With all the play we have there are some maintenance issues that are hard to keep up with our small course staff, and I would like to ask members for their help alleviating these issues. The most common ones are fixing ball marks on greens, putting sand in divots to make them flush with the turf, and most importantly please watch where you drive your cart. During hot dry periods, when carts take the same route multiple times it creates a hard path where grass can't grow. This is why we rope areas off and have "no cart signs" blocking locations. Please don't drive between trees and green side bunkers. As for ball marks on the greens if everyone makes it their goal to fix two or more every time they go on the green, there will no ball marks eventually. You do not need to make a ball mark to fix a ball mark. Thank you all for your support and I hope to see you all making birdies on our beautiful course this summer.

The Sugar Springs Women's Golf Association will be hosting their 42 annual Sugar Springs Swing Golf Tournament, on June 19, 2025, at the Sugar Springs Golf Club, Gladwin, MI. The format for the tournament will be 18 holes using the net 2 – best balls for the four-person team. We invite you to join us for this fun event. The cost will be \$79 per person, which includes a continental breakfast, 18 holes of golf with a cart, lunch at the Hearth Restaurant, skill and position prizes, and a gift for all participants. A Pro Drive advantage certificate is available for purchase for each team. Additionally, we will have tickets available for a gift basket raffle and a 50/50 drawing as well.

This year we have chosen a local charity to support, the New Dawn Shelter\* in Gladwin, MI. The charity helps ensure sustainability for those experiencing homelessness and places them on a path of independence. We invite you to participate through the purchase of mulligans. Lady golfers, if you are NOT considering purchasing a prepaid golf membership, please take the following information into account.

- The cost for a POA member prepaid golf membership is \$1,140.
- The Pay as You Go cost for a 9 hole round of golf is \$32.
- The amount of 9 hole rounds played to break even is 36.

There are 15 weeks of league, approximately 20 weeks of 9 & Dine and 15 tournaments. If you play in the 9 hole league and play in only half of the 9 & Dine and half of the tournaments, your Pay as You Go cost would be \$1,056. Then if you play only 3 more rounds with your spouse or friends, your prepaid membership will have paid for itself.

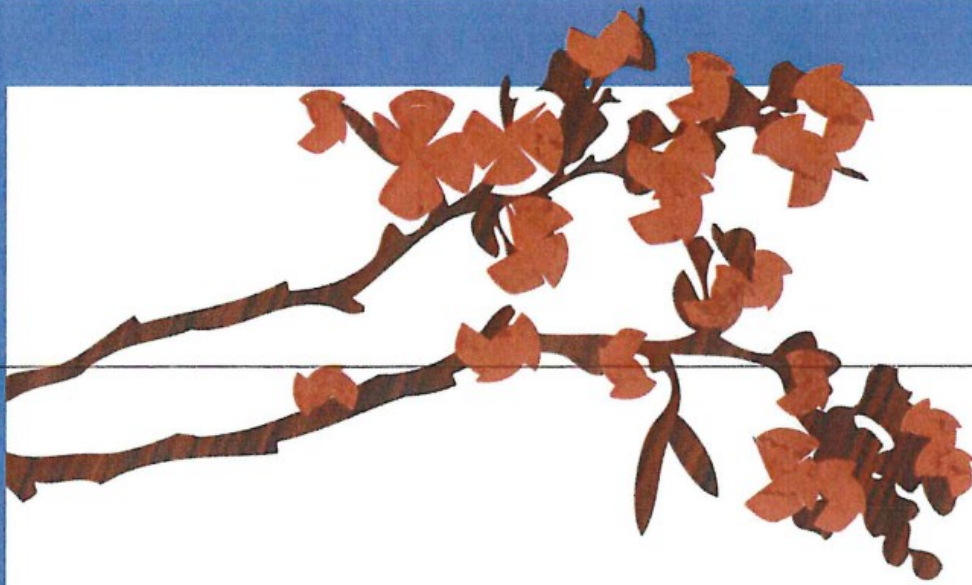

## Sugar Springs: Lake Lancer & Lake Lancelot

### Important Michigan Boating and Personal Watercraft (PWC) Safety Rules

- Michigan law prohibits anyone from boating while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
- All Boat/PWC operation must be 100 feet from shore and other vessels when above idle speed.
- Personal Floatation Device (PFDs) must be worn by all tubers, skiers, wakeboarders, and PWC operators/riders.
- PFDs must be worn by children under 7 years old and should be worn by all children on board.
- Keep all channels clear: No anchoring, fishing, swimming, skiing/tubing.
- Non-motorized craft (sailboats, rowboats, canoes, etc.) and any boat being overtaken have the right-of-way over motorboats.
- Observe passenger limits on your boat.
- High speed times: 11:00 am to 7:30 pm. (Per Butman Township High Speed Boating Ordinances)
- All boats/PWCs must be operated in a counterclockwise direction around the lake.
- Observe idle speeds (no white water behind watercraft) in all No Wake areas.
- All boat passengers must be seated within the railing of the boat. No riding on gunwale, bow or stern while underway.
- All boats operating from sunset to sunrise must display navigation lights.
- All boats/PWCs skiing, tubing or towing must have an observer.

### PWC Specific Rules (In addition to the above)

- All PWC passengers must ride **behind** the driver, never in front of the driver. Children who are too small to do this should not ride.
- A PWC shall not cross a boat's wake closer than 150 feet from the boat.
- Anyone riding on or being towed behind a PWC must wear a PFD.
- The lanyard of the PWC engine cut-off switch must be attached to the operator.
- It is illegal to operate a PWC from sunset to 8:00 am.
- Legal PWC Operation:
  - Is not allowed by anyone under 14 years of age
  - Is allowed by those 14 and 15 years of age with a boating safety certificate **and** accompanied by or within 100 feet of a parent/guardian
  - Is allowed by those 16 years of age and born after 12/31/1978 **only if** in possession of a boating safety certificate.
  - Is allowed by anyone born on or before 12/31/1978 without restrictions.

## NOTICE Sugar Springs Lakes 2025 Treatment Program

The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE) procedures. Due to the uncertainty of weather, the treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5 x 11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc. One or more treatments involving water restrictive products may be applied. Please be aware that only products approved by the State of Michigan and the Federal government are being used. We have experienced **no adverse effects on people, fish, wildlife or domestic pets since applying these products.** We anticipate using one or more of the products listed. ## PLM Also Works With Invasive Terrestrial Plants

Phragmites and purple loosestrife are two invasive plants to be on the lookout for. Both Phragmites and purple loosestrife tend to grow near the water's edge and can potentially take over your frontage if something is not done. Phragmites is a grass that can grow very tall up to 13 feet and at very high densities. Once phragmites begins to grow on your lake frontage it can take over lots

of other healthy native emergent plants such as cattails and bulrush. The state of Michigan has seen a rapid

increase in the amount of phragmites throughout the state in the past few years. Purple loosestrife is considered to be an invasive herb and it can grow anywhere from 4-10 feet tall if not addressed. Purple loosestrife is similar to phragmites in the sense that it has the ability to grow at high densities and it also has the ability to out compete native plant populations.

## Water Level Fluctuation in our Lakes

Water levels can fluctuate every few years, every year, every month or even every day. There are lots of factors that influence when and how much water levels fluctuate in our lakes, rivers and streams. One of the main things that impact when water levels fluctuate is seasonal changes. Typically water levels increase in the spring and early summer and then decrease in late summer and fall. A few other factors that make water levels rise and fall in our lakes include rainfall, evaporation, and snowmelt. Groundwater levels also play a crucial role, as high groundwater can increase lake levels while low levels can decrease them. It is important to remember that these changes are completely normal and water level fluctuation in our lakes has been happening for many years. Some years lakes will have an overall higher than usual water level while other years they may have an overall lower than usual water level.

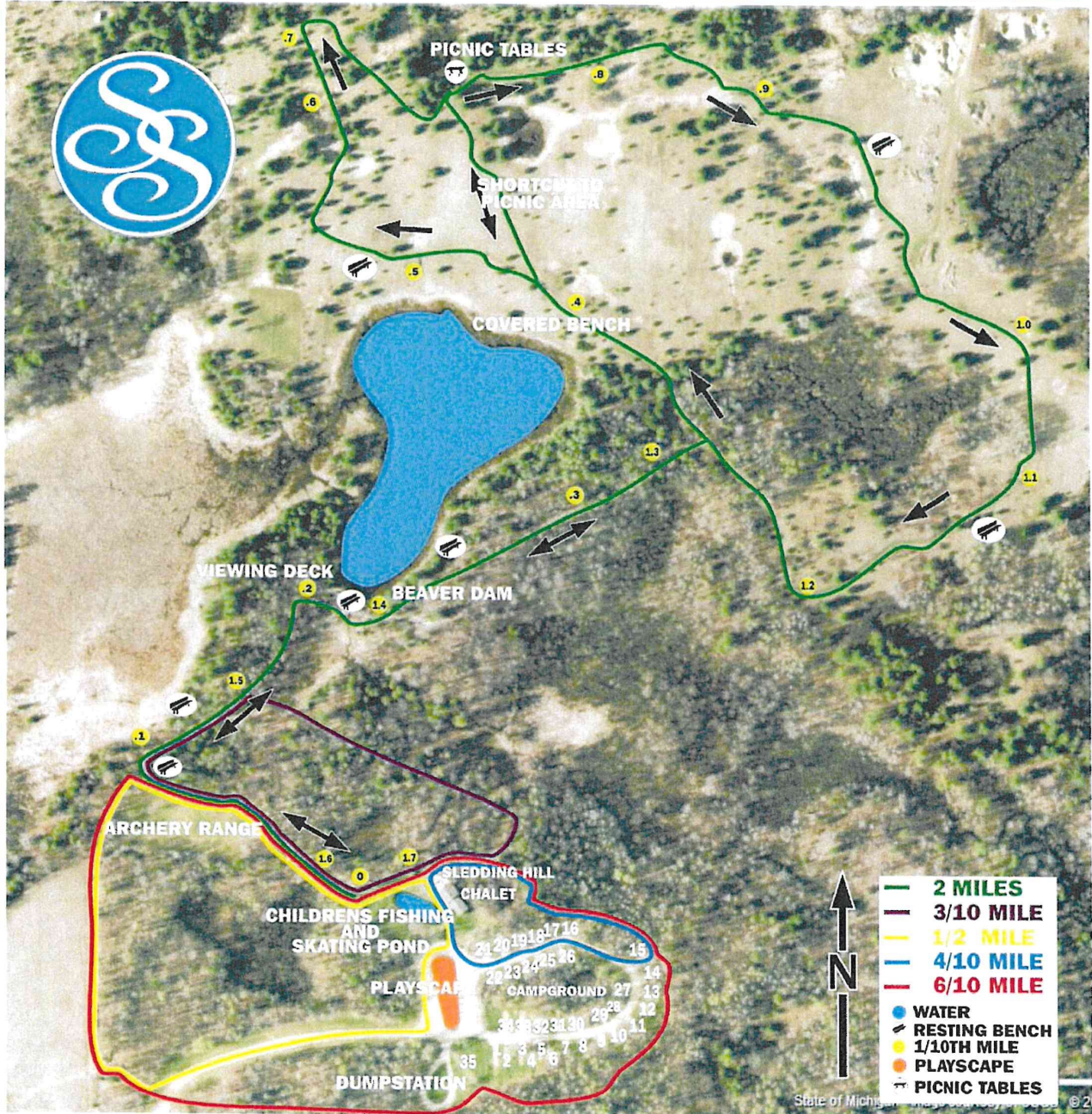
## Algae Blooms in Michigan

Algae blooms have become a growing concern of many lake residents. Algae blooms in Michigan are primarily driven by the presence of excess nutrients, especially phosphorus and nitrogen, which come from sources like agricultural runoff, wastewater, and stormwater. These nutrients provide a rich food supply for algae, encouraging rapid growth, especially in warm weather conditions. Algae, which are microscopic plants, naturally thrive in bodies of water, but when the nutrient levels are too high, they can multiply rapidly, leading to blooms. These blooms are more likely to occur in nutrient-rich, shallow lakes and rivers, where the water is warmer and slower-moving. The combination of these factors creates an ideal environment for algae to rapidly multiply. Sometimes these blooms can be harmful. Harmful blooms can deplete oxygen levels in the water and release toxins. These toxins can pose risks to aquatic life. Understanding where the nutrients come from and how they interact with the environment is key to managing algae blooms in Michigan's waters.

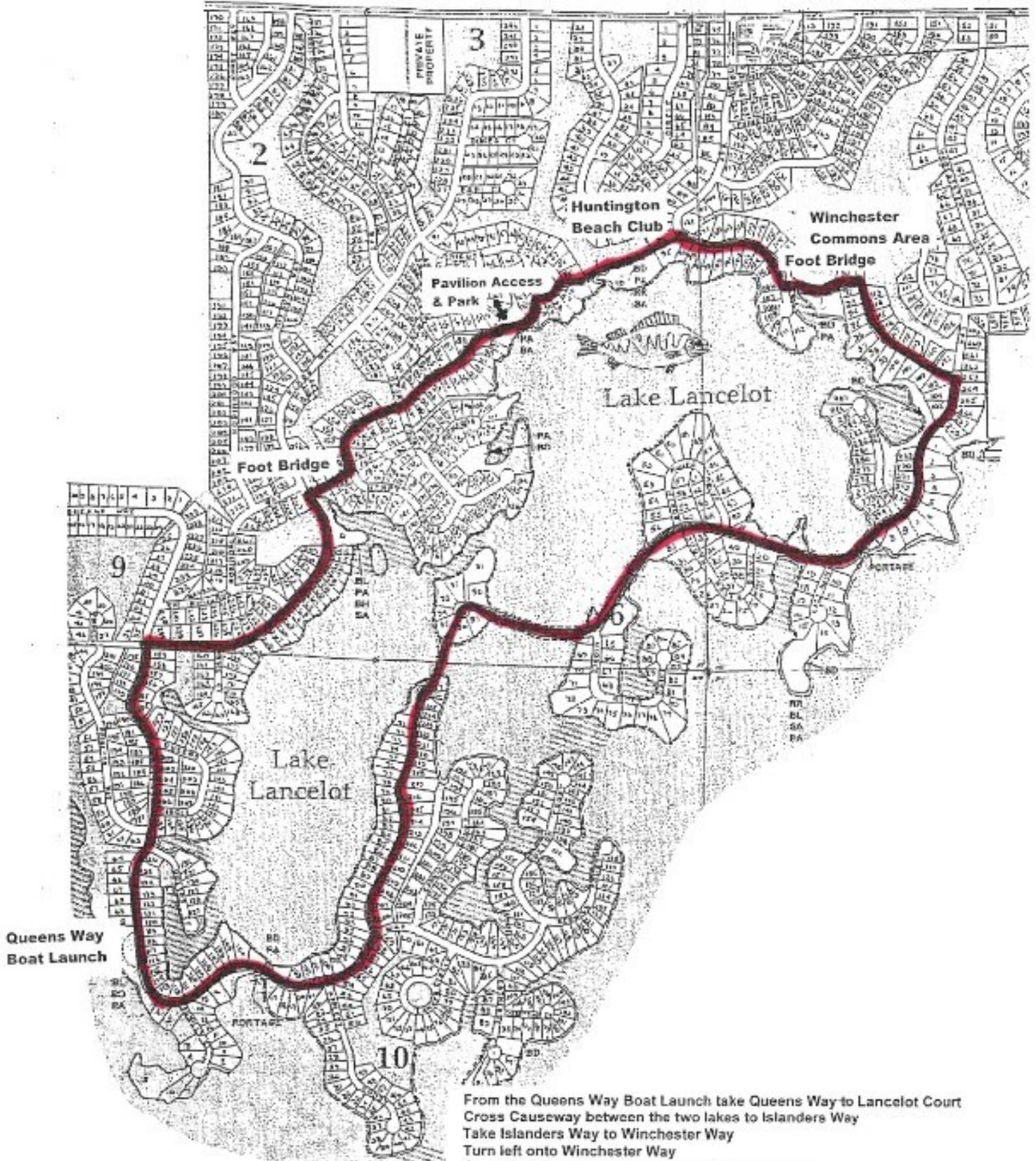

## Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

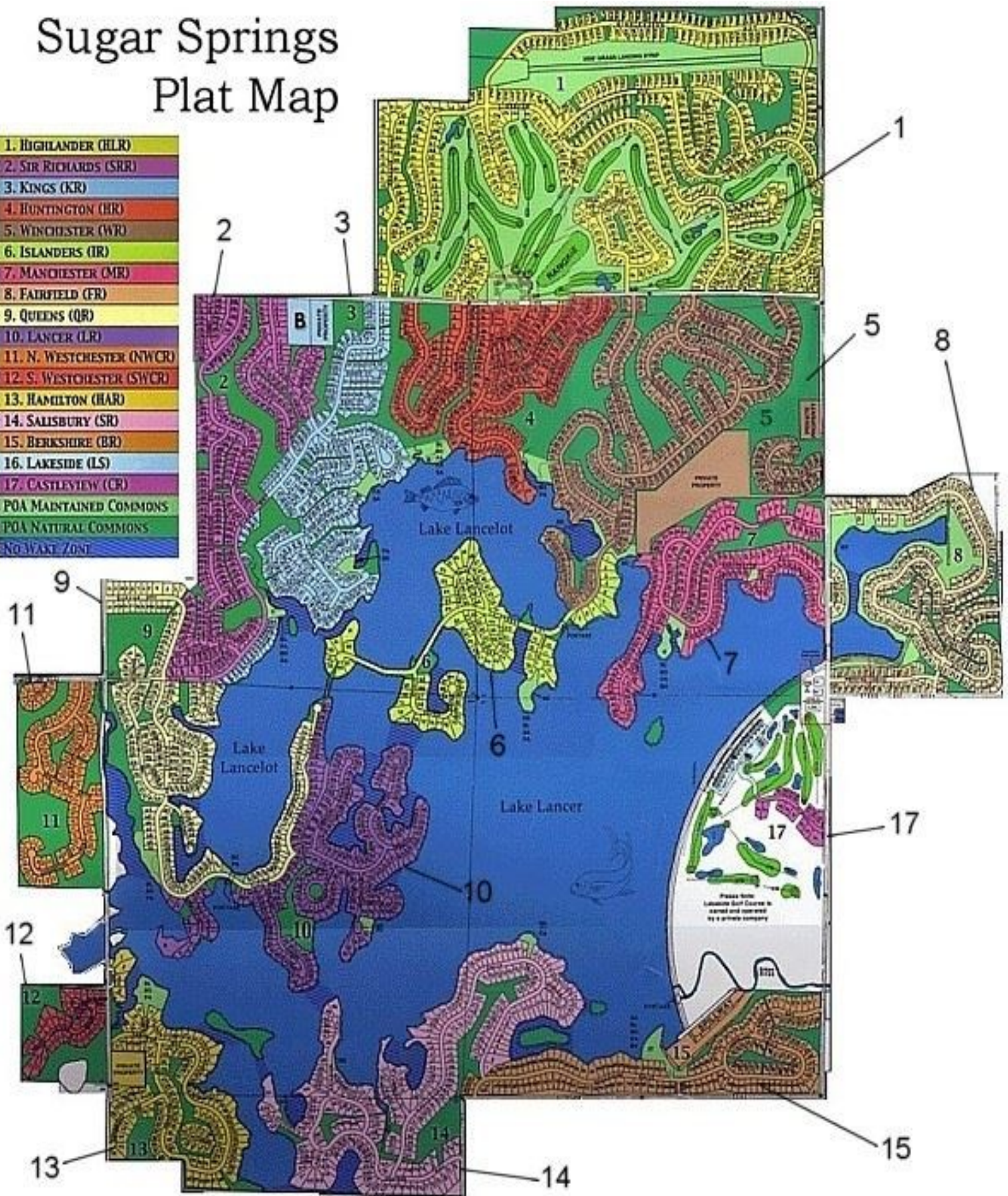
You can start from anywhere from the directions below. Parking is available at the Queens Way Boat Launch, Huntington Beach Club & Winchester Commons Area.

### A Short History of Sugar Springs

Farmers, woodsman, and tradesman homesteaded this area starting in the 1800's drawn to the area by the Sugar River. Many English, Dutch, Scotch, German, Swiss and Irish settled in this area. In 1878 the community was named Millsville, and was a community with schools, stores and a post office. Over time, lumber ran out and the town was abandoned. The land was mostly farms until it was purchased and developed by Isaacson & Associates in the 1960's, and in 1972 the first home was built. In 1978, the Sugar Springs Property Owners Association was formed and in 1987 officially took over operations from the developer. The idea of Sugar Springs was designed to be a place that family and friends could escape and enjoy sports, recreational activities and nature. To this day it is still considered "Mid-Michigans best kept Secret!"



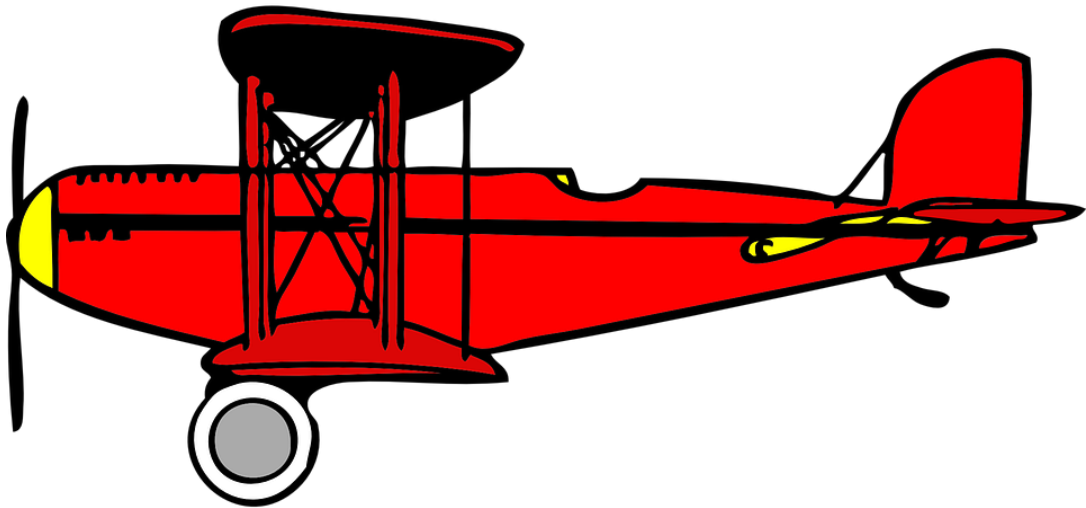
# Veterans Memorial Garden
