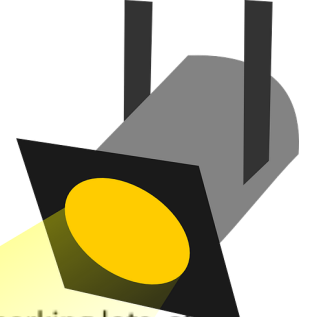

General Managers Report

Hope everyone has been able to keep cool during these steamier summer days. It was nice seeing our members and guests enjoying the craft show, lakes and fireworks during the past month. The golf course and restaurant have also been extremely busy with our increased summer population.

August 9th is the in-person vote to set our dues base rate for the next three years. You can also vote in proxy through the board of directors or another member. Proxies need to be returned to the POA office by 4pm on Friday, August 8th. We are only asking for a modest \$15 annual increase to the general assessment to which equates to only a \$1.25 a month. We are asking for this reasonable increase to stay ahead of continual rising costs. These are driven by the state passing accelerated increases to the minimum wage that will reach \$15.00 an hour by 2027 and also the constant increases in energy costs.

When on our lakes, please be sure to follow all boating rules. Our Lakes Committee has done a great job trying to get information out to educate people about these rules. These rules are important to follow for the safety of everyone and to help prevent shoreline erosion.

With it being the peak summer season, our golf course is extremely busy. Please follow the cart rules to help keep our course in great shape. That means following the 90 degree rule when driving on the fairway, staying on the cart path by tees and greens, staying at least 60 feet from the greens and following the cart signs. You can also help our course by fixing ball marks, filling or preplacing divot and raking sand traps.

Hope everyone gets a chance to enjoy our wonderful amenities some more in the last official month of summer before we transition into the beautiful fall season here in Northern Michigan.

Beach areas, combing beach sand, cleaning/sanitizing all beach house restrooms, not to mention cleaning all buildings each and everyday for us. They also do all set up and maintenance tear down for all events. Thank you Ken, Ryan John and the rest of the staff.

Hello Sugar Springs Members

I hope everyone has been able to get out and enjoy the course during the month of July and had a safe and happy holiday over the 4th.

This Monday, (July 21st), we vertical cut and top dressed our greens. This process helps to keep our greens rolling smooth and true. Verticutting greens reduces the thatch layer on the green, allowing for better moisture transfer from the surface to the root zone. The sand topdressing applied after helps to maintain a firm putting surface, while still allowing the water to move through the sand layer. This process also helps to heal up any ball marks or scarred areas on the greens. This is one of the many maintenance practices done to our greens that helps keep them rolling at a good speed, so we try to do this process every 4 to 6 weeks if weather and scheduling allows. After verticutting it will take a week to a week and a half to heal up and get the greens back to a quality putting surface.

As the season has progressed, I have noticed members making more of an effort to find and repair their ball marks on the greens. We have also noticed the use of the sand containers on the carts to fix your divots in the fairways. Myself and the rest of the Golf Course maintenance staff appreciate the help from you to keep our course as nice as we can.

Thank you, and I hope you all continue to enjoy playing our wonderful golf course at Sugar Springs.

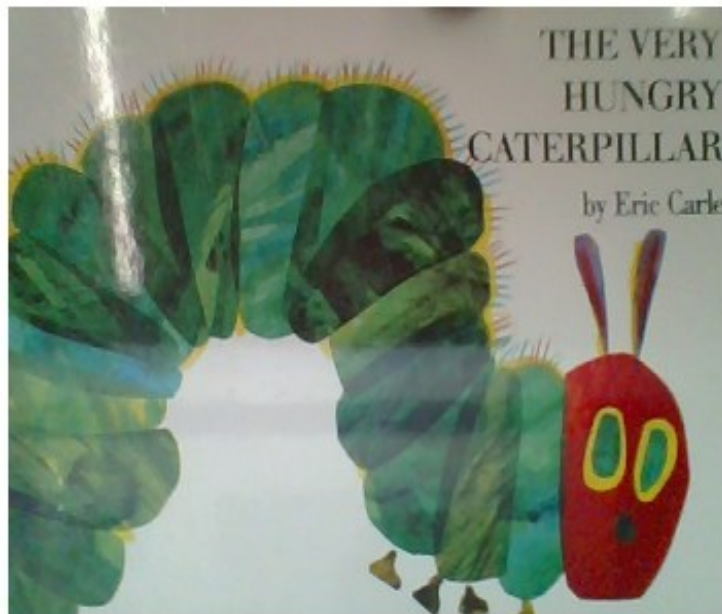

Message from the Architectural and Environmental

To All Sugar Springs Members,

The Architectural and Environmental Control Committee would like to remind all property owners of an important guideline.

No construction or improvement that modifies the overall appearance of any Lot—or any area designated as Condominium Property—may begin without first obtaining a permit issued by the Architectural and Environmental Control Committee (AECC).

This requirement ensures all developments align with community standards and preserve the character and value of our shared environment.

PLACEMENT OF BUILDINGS ON LOTS (Article IV, Section 5, Covenants) The following setback requirements shall govern the placement of buildings on Lots: No building, porch, deck or projection shall be erected or maintained on any property closer than 35 feet from the rear property line, nor closer than 10 feet from any side property line, nor closer than 35 feet from any street line, nor closer than **75 feet** from the normal high water lines of Lake Lancelot or Lake Lancer. Note: The “Street Line” is located 33 feet from the center of the roadway fronting your property; therefore, for easier location of the front set back, measure 68 feet from the center of the road.

Notice Regarding Lakefront Construction and Setback Rules

We have observed an increase in lakefront construction projects that do not comply with established setback requirements. Please be reminded that it is our intent to ensure these rules are properly enforced and followed.

Before planning or constructing any vertical structure near the lake, you must review and adhere to the guidelines outlined in **Article IV, Section 5 of the Covenants**. Proper application and compliance are essential to maintaining the integrity and appearance of our lakefront community.

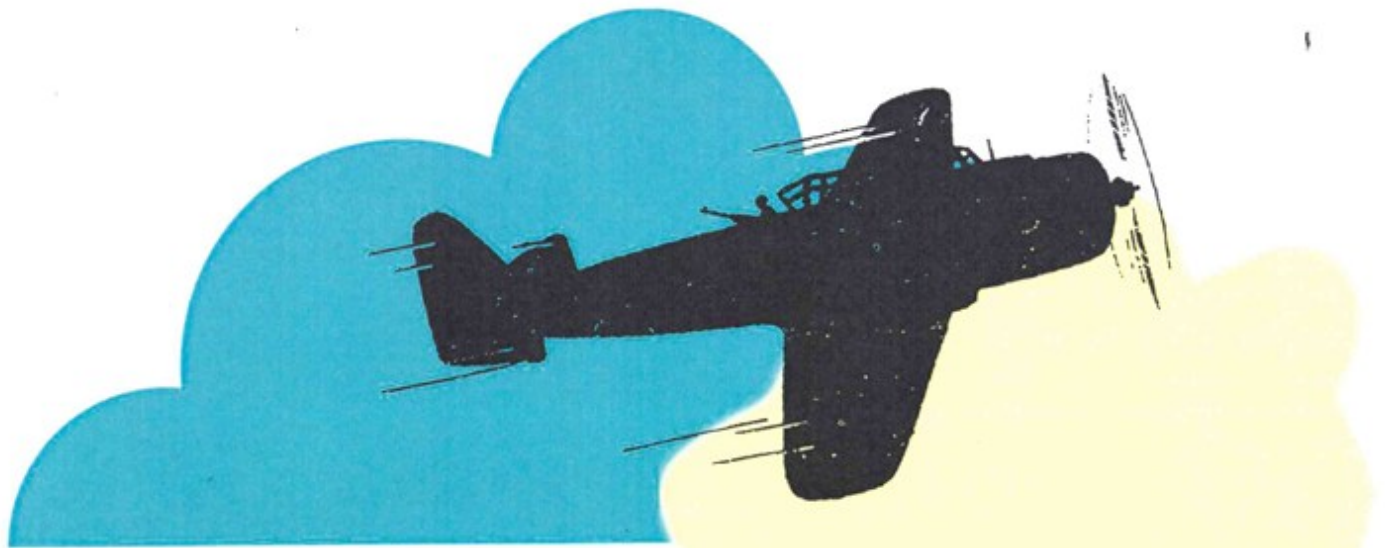

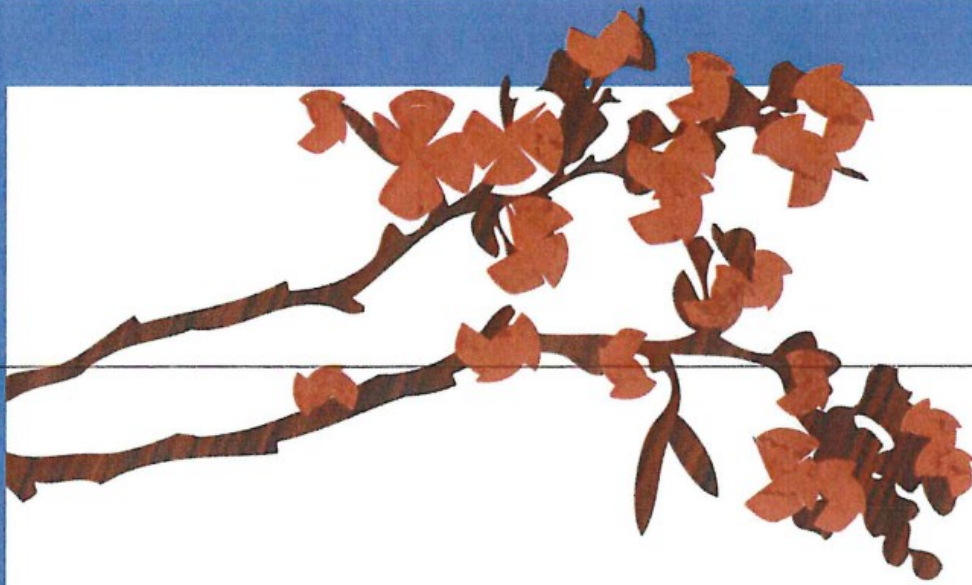

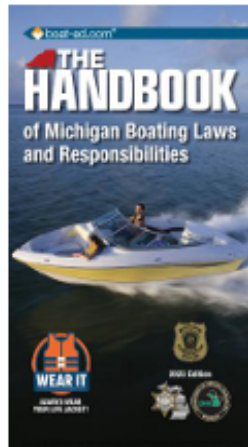

Greetings fellow Sugar Springers!

We have had a very busy summer so far on Lake Lancelot and Lake Lancer, including a couple of jam-packed holidays.

While enjoying our time boating and fishing, the Lakes Committee has observed too many boats that have not been following some very important boating laws.

These laws are in place for the personal safety of everyone on the water as well as personal property on the shorelines, and the shorelines themselves along with the many types of wildlife that we are so blessed to have on our lakes.

Here are important reminders on the proper operation of your watercraft directly from The Handbook of Michigan Boating Laws and Responsibilities:

Unlawful and Dangerous Operation

Michigan law designates these dangerous operating practices as illegal.

Improper Distance is not maintaining a proper distance while operating a vessel or towing a person. To maintain a proper distance when you are operating on the waters of the state in areas not marked by well-defined channels, canals, rivers, or stream courses, at greater than “slow, no wake speed,” the vessel or persons being towed must not be within 100 feet of:

- A shoreline (if operating in water less than three feet deep)
- Any moored or anchored vessel
- A dock or raft
- Any marked swimming area or person(s) in the water

Improper Distance for PWC (Personal Watercraft) means that, if operating at greater than “slow, no wake speed” a PWC also must:

- Stay at least 200 feet from any Great Lakes shoreline.
- Not cross within 150 feet behind another vessel other than another PWC.

Improper Direction is defined as the failure to operate in a counterclockwise direction on the waters of this state in areas not marked by well-defined channels, canals, rivers, or stream courses.

Riding on the Bow, Gunwales, or Transom is allowing passengers to ride on a motorboat in places where there may be a chance of falling overboard. While operating at greater than “slow, no wake speed,” persons on a motorboat may not sit, stand, or walk on any portion of a motorboat not designed for that purpose. This includes riding on the gunwale.

Failure to Regulate Speed is operating a vessel at speeds that may cause danger to life or property of any other person or at speeds that will not permit you to bring your vessel to a safe stop. It is illegal to operate a vessel:

- In excess of 55 mph,...
- At greater than “slow, no wake speed” when a person is in the bow of a vessel without proper seating
- Faster than is reasonable and prudent under the conditions (weather, vessel traffic, etc.)

“Slow, No Wake Speed” means a very slow speed whereby the wake or wash created by the vessel would be minimal. *(Please remember to observe all posted No Wake areas).*

NOTICE Sugar Springs Lakes 2025 Treatment Program

The property owners in this area are planning to have the waters chemically treated to control lake weeds and/or algae. This notice is being circulated in accordance with Department of Environment, Great Lakes & Energy (EGLE) procedures. Due to the uncertainty of weather, the treatment schedule is approximate. Please watch your shoreline for the posting of the 8.5 x 11 inch, yellow or green signs. The signs will indicate the date of the treatment, the products used, and any restrictions on the use of treated water for swimming, watering lawns, etc. One or more treatments involving water restrictive products may be applied. Please be aware that only products approved by the State of Michigan and the Federal government are being used. We have experienced **no adverse effects on people, fish, wildlife or domestic pets since applying these products.** We anticipate using one or more of the products listed. Please read the restrictions.

EGLE has removed the swimming restriction that they had previously placed on herbicides. There are currently no swimming restrictions listed on the labels of the products. Posting signs have been adjusted to reflect this change and swimming restrictions have been removed to not unnecessarily restrict use.

The chemicals used for Aquatic Nuisance Control are registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the Department of Environment, Great Lakes and Energy. The potential for damage to fish and other non-target organisms is minimal provided that the product is used as directed on the product label and the permit. To minimize the possible effects on health and the environment, the treated water is restricted for the above purposes.

PLM Also Works With Invasive Terrestrial Plants

Phragmites and purple loosestrife are two invasive plants to be on the lookout for. Both Phragmites and purple loosestrife tend to grow near the water's edge and can potentially take over your frontage if something is not done. Phragmites is a grass that can grow very tall up to 13 feet and at very high densities. Once phragmites begins to grow on your lake frontage it can take over lots

of other healthy native emergent plants such as cattails and bulrush. The state of Michigan has seen a rapid

increase in the amount of phragmites throughout the state in the past few years. Purple loosestrife is considered to be an invasive herb and it can grow anywhere from 4-10 feet tall if not addressed. Purple loosestrife is similar to phragmites in the sense that it has the ability to grow at high densities and it also has the ability to out compete native plant populations.

Water Level Fluctuation in our Lakes

Water levels can fluctuate every few years, every year, every month or even every day. There are lots of factors that influence when and how much water levels fluctuate in our lakes, rivers and streams. One of the main things that impact when water levels fluctuate is seasonal changes. Typically water levels increase in the spring and early summer and then decrease in late summer and fall. A few other factors that make water levels rise and fall in our lakes include rainfall, evaporation, and snowmelt. Groundwater levels also play a crucial role, as high groundwater can increase lake levels while low levels can decrease them. It is important to remember that these changes are completely normal and water level fluctuation in our lakes has been happening for many years. Some years lakes will have an overall higher than usual water level while other years they may have an overall lower than usual water level.

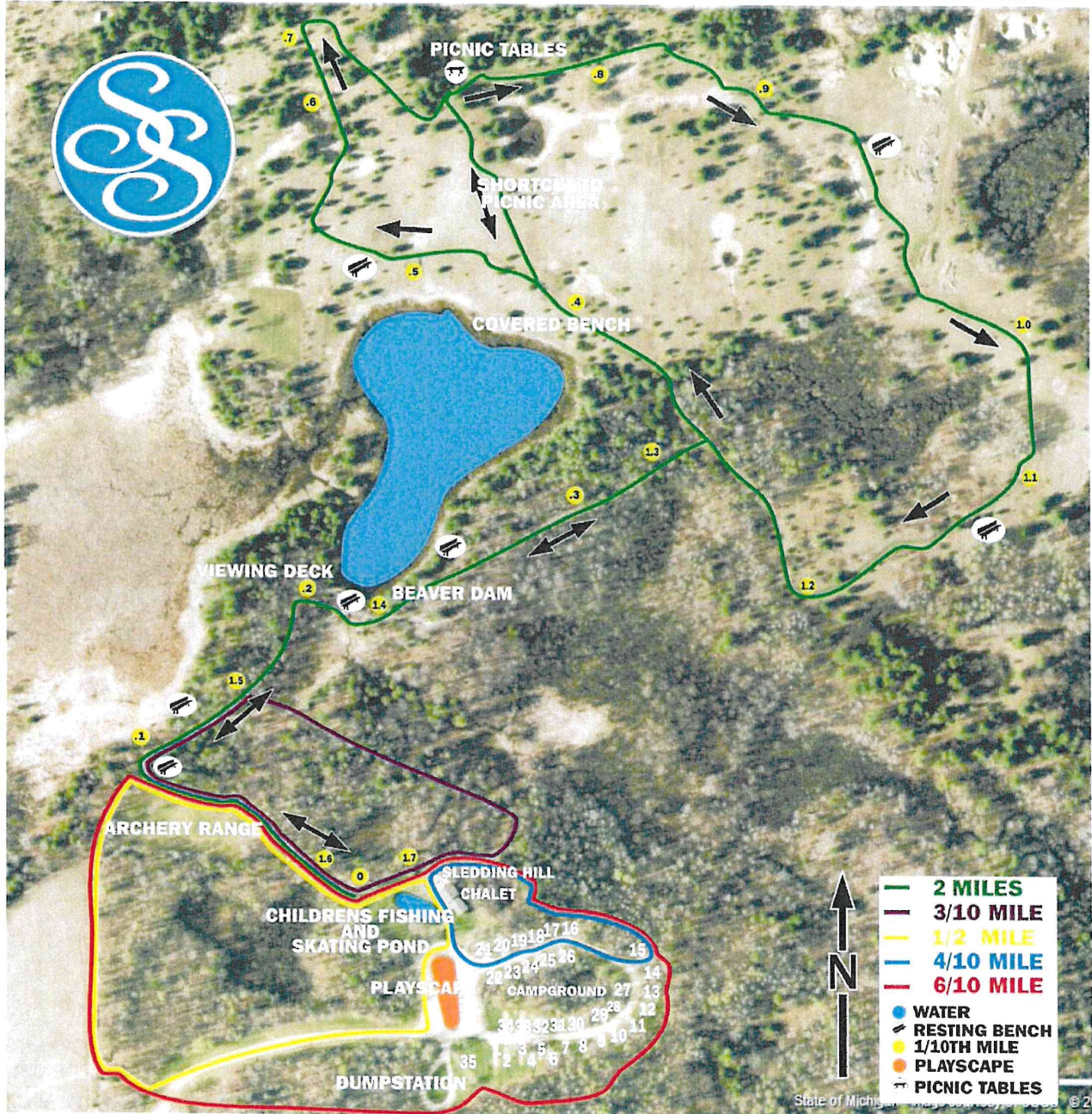
Algae Blooms in Michigan

Algae blooms have become a growing concern of many lake residents. Algae blooms in Michigan are primarily driven by the presence of excess nutrients, especially phosphorus and nitrogen, which come from sources like agricultural runoff, wastewater, and stormwater. These nutrients provide a rich food supply for algae, encouraging rapid growth, especially in warm weather conditions. Algae, which are microscopic plants, naturally thrive in bodies of water, but when the nutrient levels are too high, they can multiply rapidly, leading to blooms. These blooms are more likely to occur in nutrient-rich, shallow lakes and rivers, where the water is warmer and slower-moving. The combination of these factors creates an ideal environment for algae to rapidly multiply. Sometimes these blooms can be harmful. Harmful blooms can deplete oxygen levels in the water and release toxins. These toxins can pose risks to aquatic life. Understanding where the nutrients come from and how they interact with the environment is key to managing algae blooms in Michigan's waters.

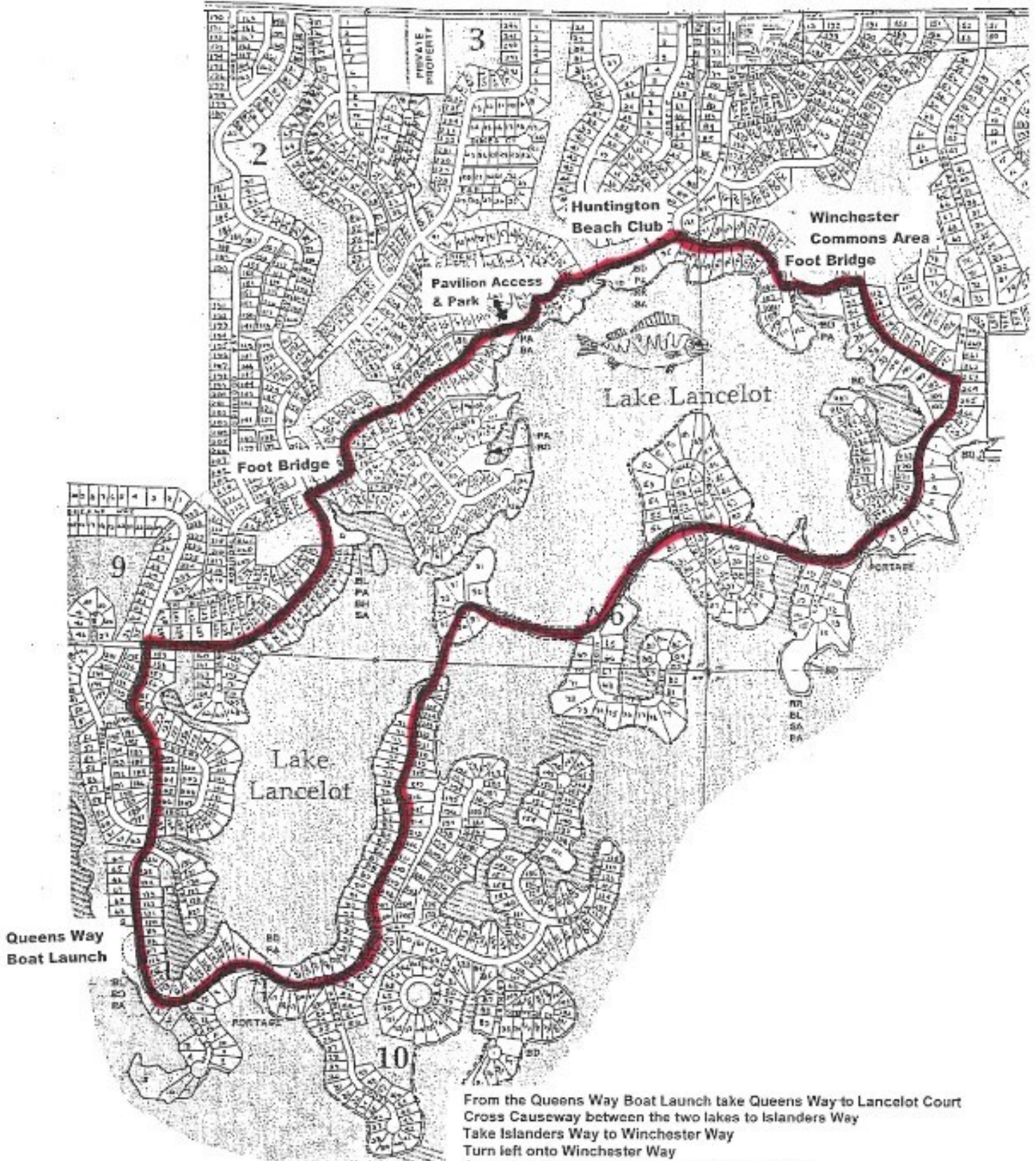

Walking Trail Map around Lake Lancelot

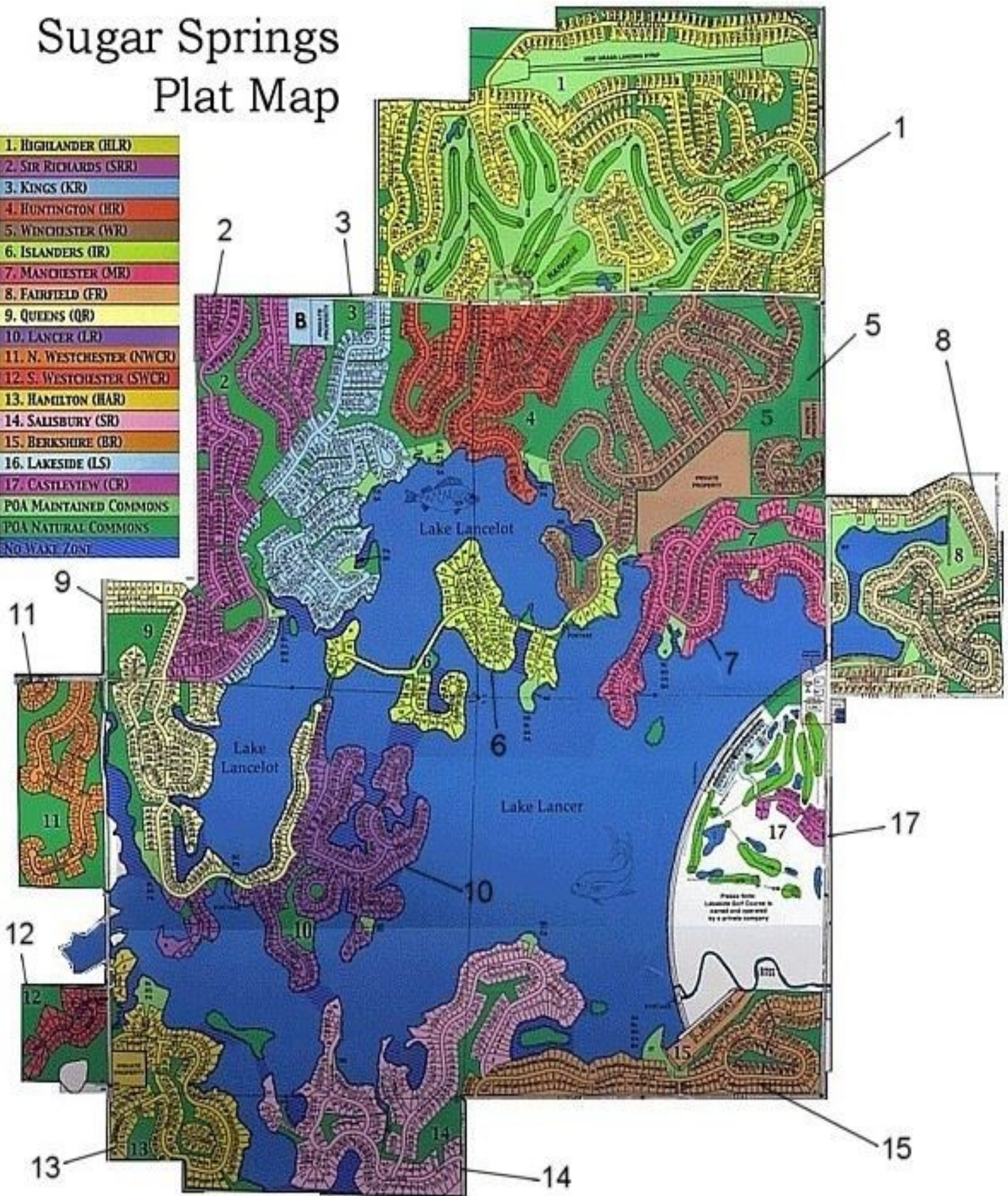
You can start from anywhere from the directions below. Parking is available at the Queens Way Boat Launch, Huntington Beach Club & Winchester Commons Area.

A Short History of Sugar Springs

Farmers, woodsman, and tradesman homesteaded this area starting in the 1800's drawn to the area by the Sugar River. Many English, Dutch, Scotch, German, Swiss and Irish settled in this area. In 1878 the community was named Millsville, and was a community with schools, stores and a post office. Over time, lumber ran out and the town was abandoned. The land was mostly farms until it was purchased and developed by Isaacson & Associates in the 1960's, and in 1972 the first home was built. In 1978, the Sugar Springs Property Owners Association was formed and in 1987 officially took over operations from the developer. The idea of Sugar Springs was designed to be a place that family and friends could escape and enjoy sports, recreational activities and nature. To this day it is still considered "Mid-Michigans best kept Secret!"



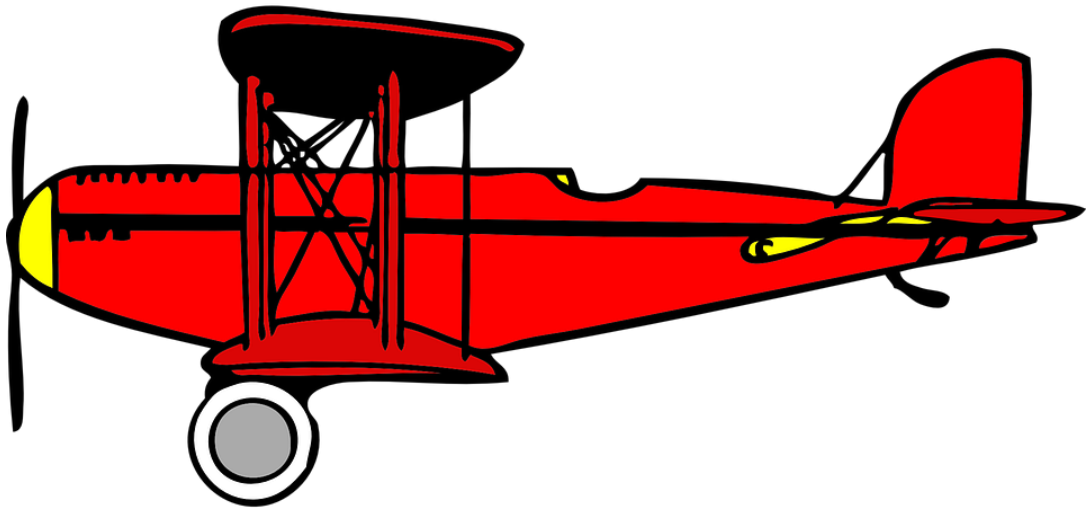
Veterans Memorial Garden
